







Christmas time in the Lord is giving of yourself, caroling by the Salvation Army bell ringer, and helping fellow Christians in the inner-city.


> January brings new beginnings, a new year, and a new semester.

A winter in the Lord is pulling through the snow and gray, sharing talents in the Fine Arts Festival, and teamwork on the court.


















Spring break offers another chance to serve. Flowers unfold reminding us of Easter and the great sacrifice of Jesus and his wonderful gift of life.













So we give in thanks, ornamenting the school with flowers and working hard to finish the year. The temperatures rise with spirits until we explode into June.


Some say good-bye for the summer, but others march down the aisle on graduation night looking forward to new friends, new schools, new challenges and a new life in the Lord.

Ed Gueiros broke the freshmen triple jump record, going 36 feet 2 inches and Brent Rieger set new records in the junior 110 high hurdles at 15.74 seconds and in the junior 300 intermediate hurdles at 41.67. Kirk Vander Leest had an outstanding 3200 race at the state meet, placing fourth and setting a new junior record with a time of 9 minutes 37.9 seconds.

GIRL'S TRACK ROMPS!

The 1993 girl's track team enjoyed a season of many firsts!

It was a season that began with the Private School League's indoor relays where the team broke three league records. The outdoor season started with the third consecutive year winning the Riverside-Brookfield Invitational. Next came the successful defense of the Christian School Invitational hosted by Calvin College. The meet was highlighted by senior Heather Sikkenga's four first place finishes and her being named the meet's outstanding performer with a record-tying :59.4 in the 400 meter dash.

Next the team successfully defended its PSL outdoor championship in dominating style - winning 13 of 17 events and outpacing second place Nazareth by 109 points. Again three league records were set - sophomore Shannon Frigo in the 100M high hurdles (:15.5), Heather Sikkenga in the 400M dash (:57.7), and the 1600M relay team (4:13.6) composed of sophomores Stefanie Boerema, Siíri Rimpila, Lora VandenBerg, and junior Erica Smit.


The season of "firsts" took on a special meaning with the IHSA sectionals held at Lisle. Senior Heather Sikkenga (first in the 100, 200, and 400 meter dashes), junior Kathy Greenfield (first in the 1600, and 3200 meter runs), and sophomore Stefanie Boerema (first in the long jump and 300 meter low hurdles) led the team to 67 points and a first ever sectional championship in girl's track.

With 11 individuals and two relays qualifying for the State Finals, the possibility of a good showing at Eastern Illinois in the Class A competition appeared real.

It was at the state level where the line of first place awards stopped. No individual competitor took first, BUT an outstanding two-day team performance carried the Trojans to a more significant first - *a team championship in the Class A State Finals.*

The 52 point total was achieved by eight girls placing in 10 events. Senior Heather Sikkenga took third in the 200, fourth in the 400, and anchored the fourth place medley relay. Junior Kathy Greenfield narrowly missed two individual championships finishing second in the 1600 and third in the 3200 (both by .5 of a second). Erica Smit, also a junior, finished third in the 800 and led off the sixth place 1600 meter relay. Sophomore Stefanie Boerema contributed points in four events - The 100 meter high hurdles (6th), 300 meter low hurdles (4th) and both the medley and 1600 meter relays. Fellow sophomore Shannon Frigo placed fourth in the high hurdles. Finally, key relay members included sophomores Siiri Rimpila (1600 and medley), Lora VandenBerg (1600), and freshman Sheralynn Manasse, who started the medley relay.

In summary, it was a great season of dedication, effort, and accomplishment!

THE HOVING ERA

MR. HOVING RETIRES AS SUPERINTENDENT AFTER 35 YEARS

Upon graduating from Calvin College, Mr. Hoving began teaching at Timothy Christian Schools in 1958. He taught math and science to junior and senior high students at the building on 60th Court in Cicero. His starting salary was \$3,700 (he made more money driving a Pepsi truck during the summer then he did during the rest of the year).

He moved with the high school in 1962 to the new building in Elmhurst and began coaching freshmen and frosh-soph boys basketball as well as golf.

He was named dean of students in 1964 and coached the frosh-soph boys basketball team to Timothy's first P.S.L. championship. In 1967, Mr. Hoving coached the boys varsity basketball team to a first place championship in the P.S.L. tournament.

He became principal of the high school in 1969 and superintendent in 1978 (the same year that he began administering the Timothy Foundation). In 1975, he cheered the boys basketball team on as they went downstate and came home with the second place state trophy in class A.

In 1976, he initiated Timothy's membership into the North Central Association and in 1980 he spearheaded a \$1.5 million construction project to enlarge the grade school and build a bus maintenance facility. In 1984, he oversaw the \$3.5 million addition to the high school and grade school which added two media centers to our campus, and a fine arts wing and auditorium to the high school.

Mr. Hoving has been active on several boards including the C.S.I. Pension & Insurance Board, the Illinois High School Association Legislative Commission (of which he was the first non-public school principal to be elected) and he has also served as the C.S.I. District III board representative.

Mr. Hoving and his wife, Lois, educated their three children at Timothy and the six oldest of their nine grandchildren are now enrolled here.

Mr. Hoving will retire this year from his position as superintendent after 35 years with Timothy and 25 years in administration. He has attended almost 300 regular school board meetings as well as countless committee meetings dealing with education, finances, buildings, admissions and busing. He has taught, coached, or been principal to hundreds of students. He will surely be remembered for his many accomplishments but it may well be the little things he did for us and with us that we will remember the most.

Thank you, Mr. Hoving, for a job well done! We wish you and your wife God's richest blessings. May He continue to use both of you in powerful ways as you work in His kingdom.










