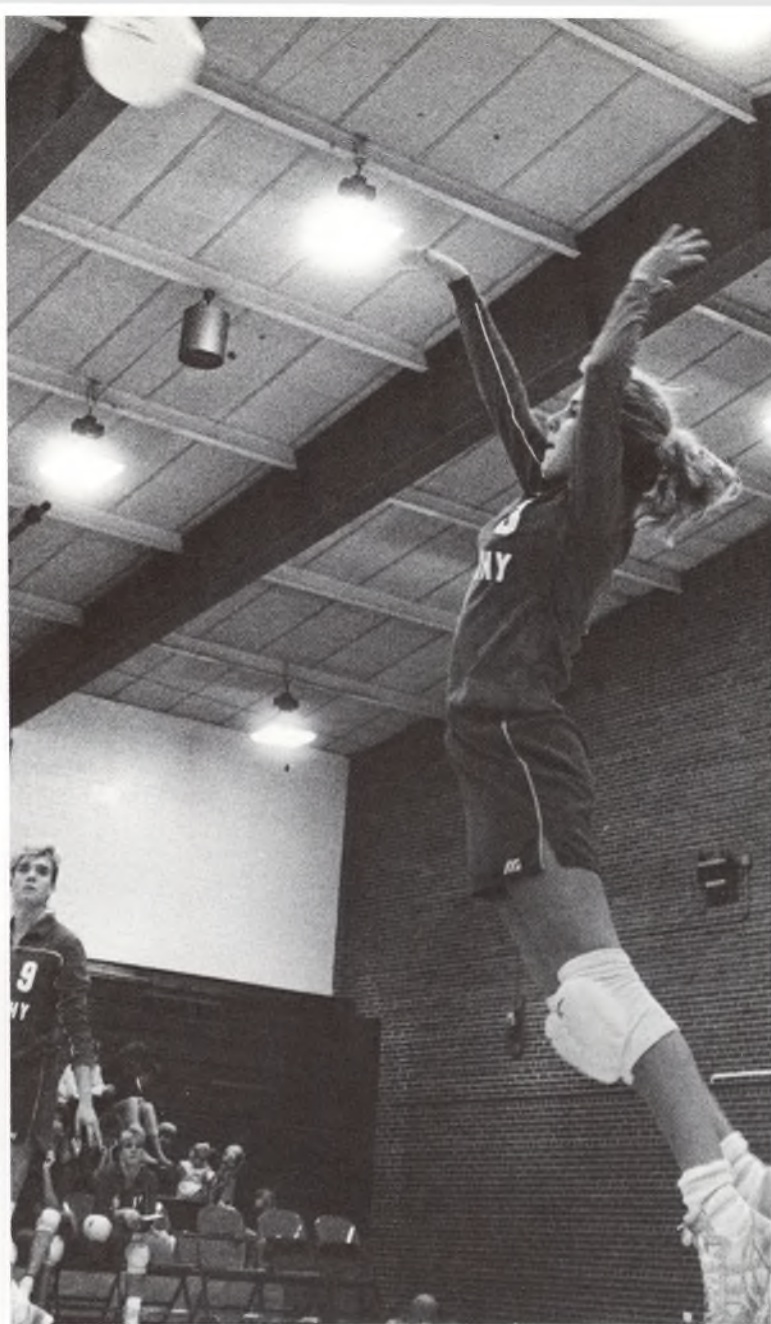


# Varsity Volleyball

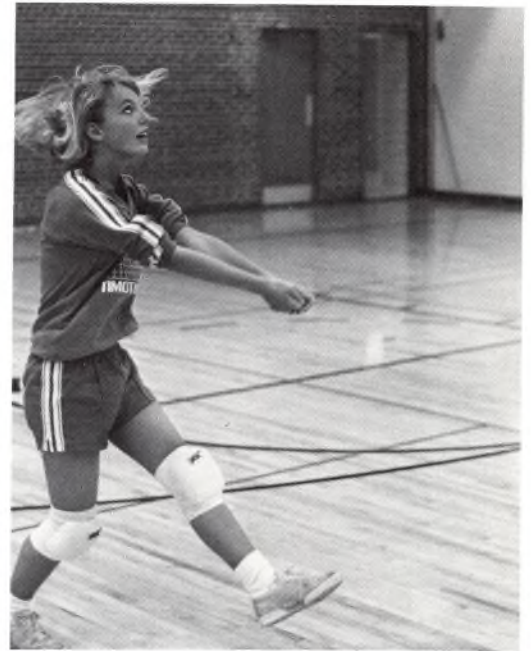

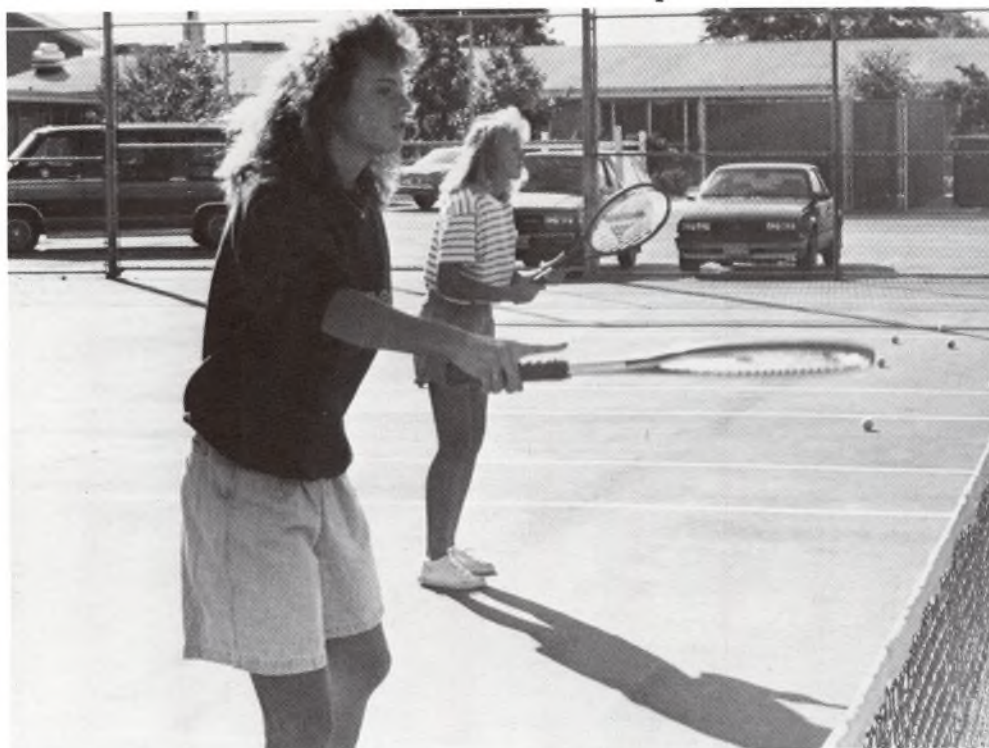


# Girls Tennis

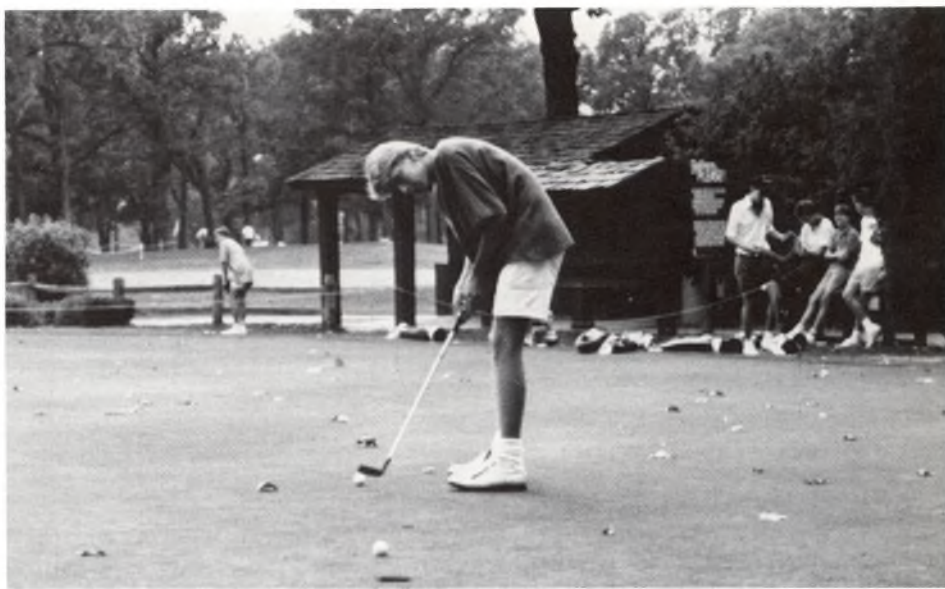


# Varsity Golf

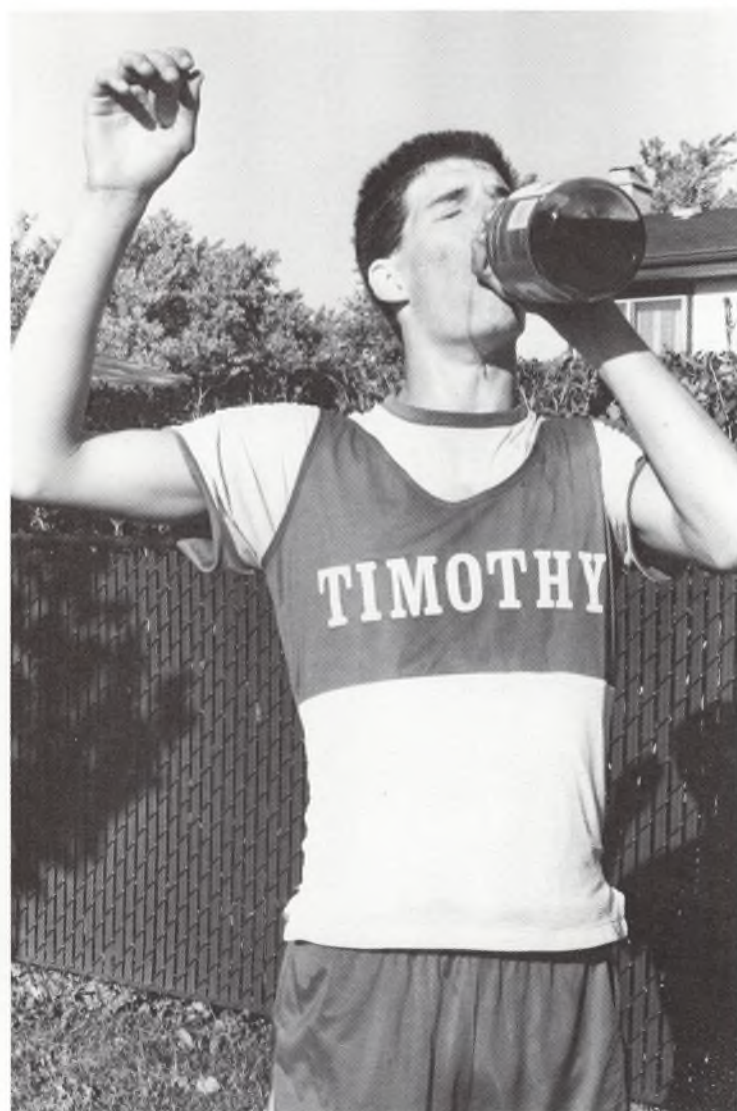
# Cross-Country

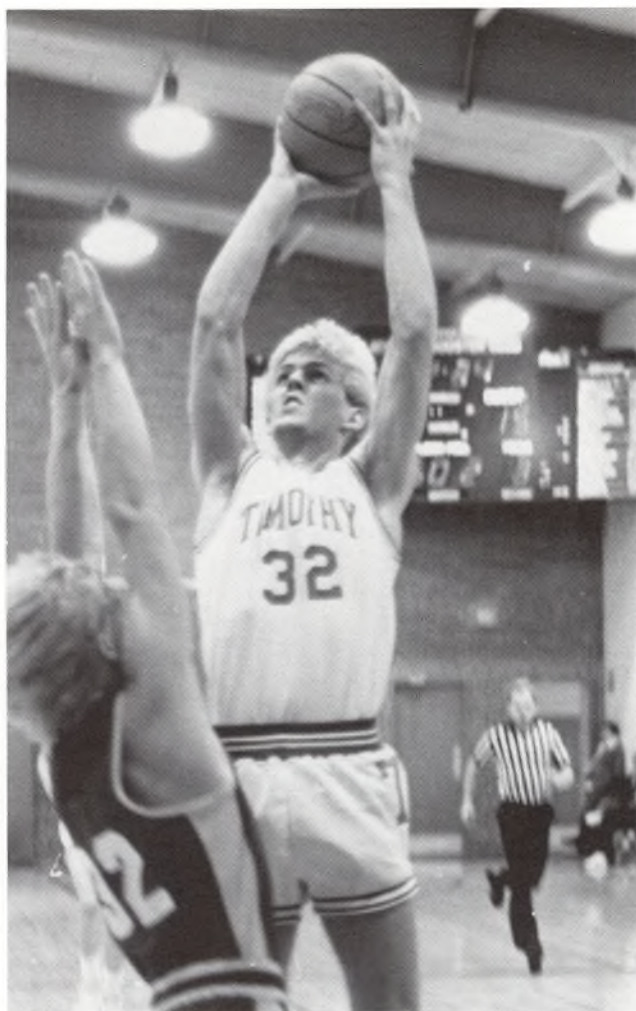

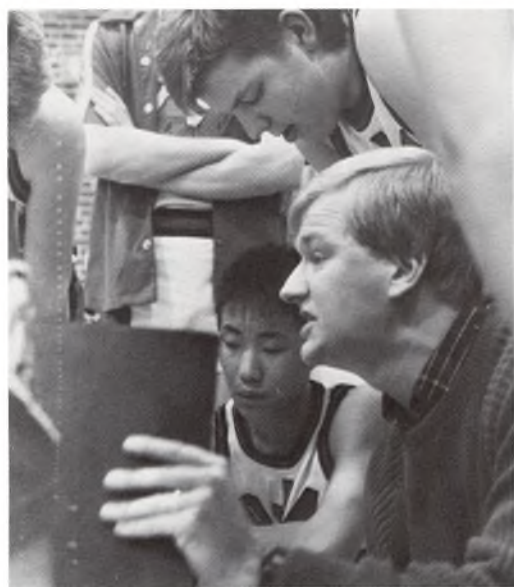

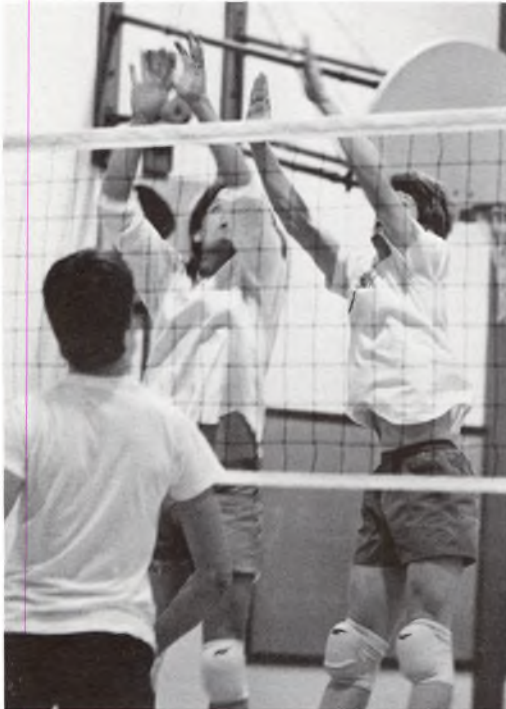


## *“Men’s” Volleyball Club*

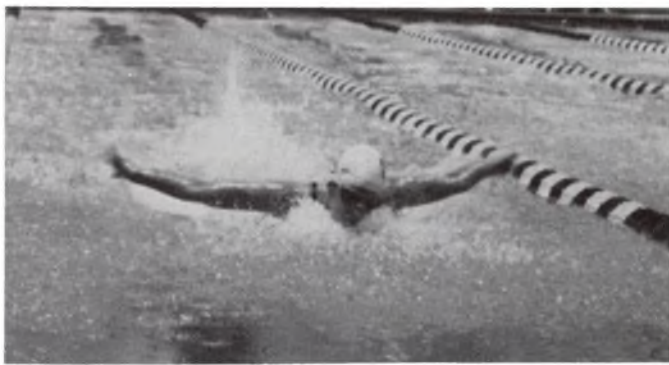


# Swimming

# Mock Trial

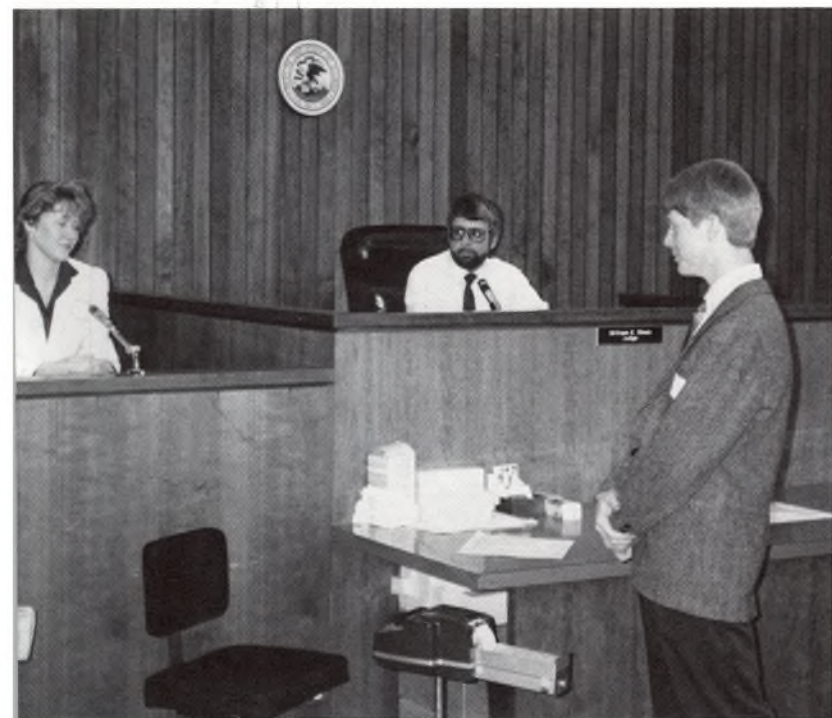

forward to see whether or not they would be the eighth finalist. "As the defense, Timothy Christian."

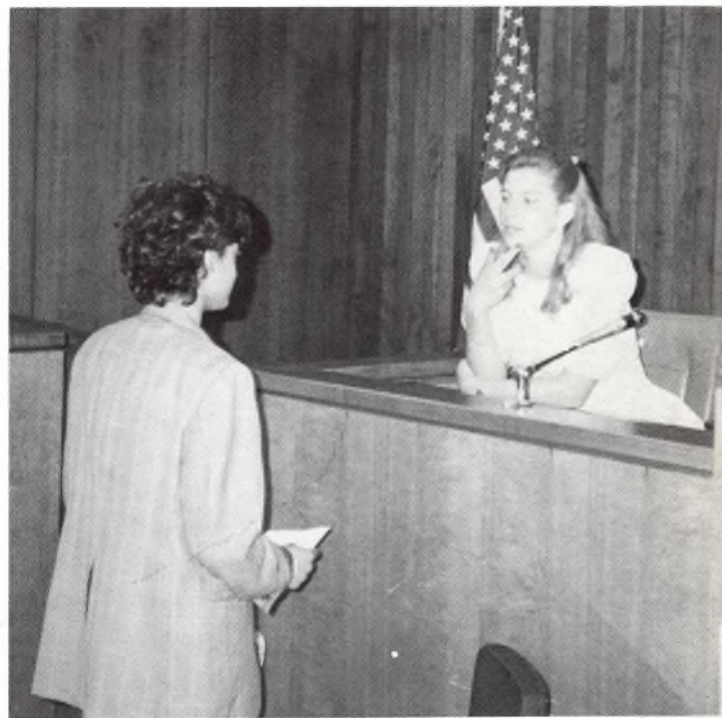
