

















The 1989 Girls Track Team had a growing season with twice as many girls as last year. Coach Van Prooyen was both encouraging and firm. The team won various meets and provided good competition against some top ranked teams. Timothy finished seventh in the league, increasing their score by over thirty points from last year. At the Frosh-Soph. P.S.L. meet, Timothy brought home a second place trophy. Tiffany Dukes (440 meter dash), Sue Greenfield (2 mile run), and Michelle Canniff (high hurdles) qualified for the state meet, held at Eastern Illinois University.









Boys Track

Throughout the season, Timothy took part in various large competitions. At the famous Calvin Invitational, the team placed seventh out of eleven teams. Other important meets were the Oregon Invitational, at which our T.C. men placed twelfth out of twenty-five. Timothy placed third at the P.S.L. finals and fourth out of twenty-three teams at the I.M.S.A. sectional meet.

While the whole team fared above average, the varsity level track athletes performed outstandingly. Kevin Kiefer (800 meter run), Mike Harris (300 meter hurdles), and Kevin McNamara (3200 meter run) were all I.M.S.A. Sectional Champions.

The Frosh-Soph team took second place at the P.S.L. finals.













Swimming
