

















FRESHMEN INITIATION




VOICES FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL


GIRLS TENNIS










BOYS TENNIS

The frosh-soph won 2, lost 3 and tied 1. It was a good beginning, and we look forward to more freshmen coming out for the team next year.










VARSITY VOLLEYBALL






WRESTLING






















CHAPEL








FOOD


