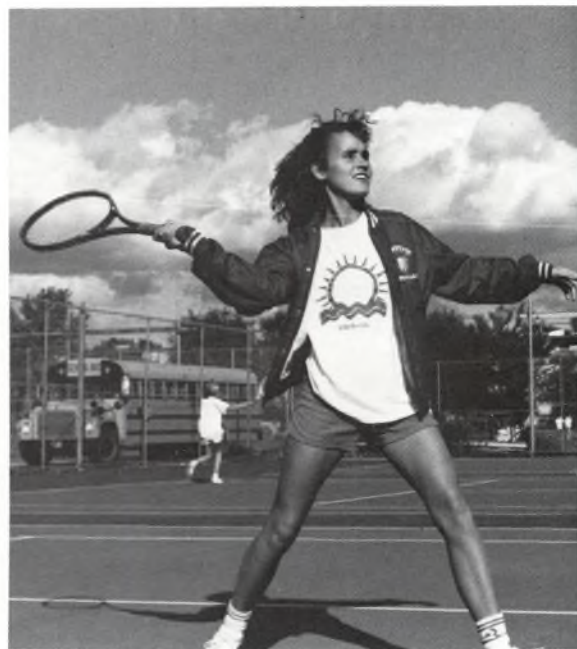
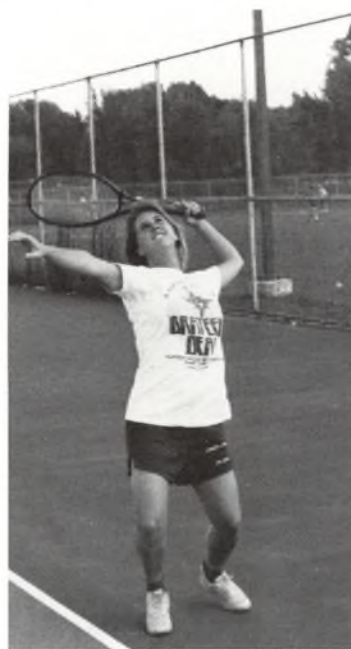




## GIRLS TENNIS

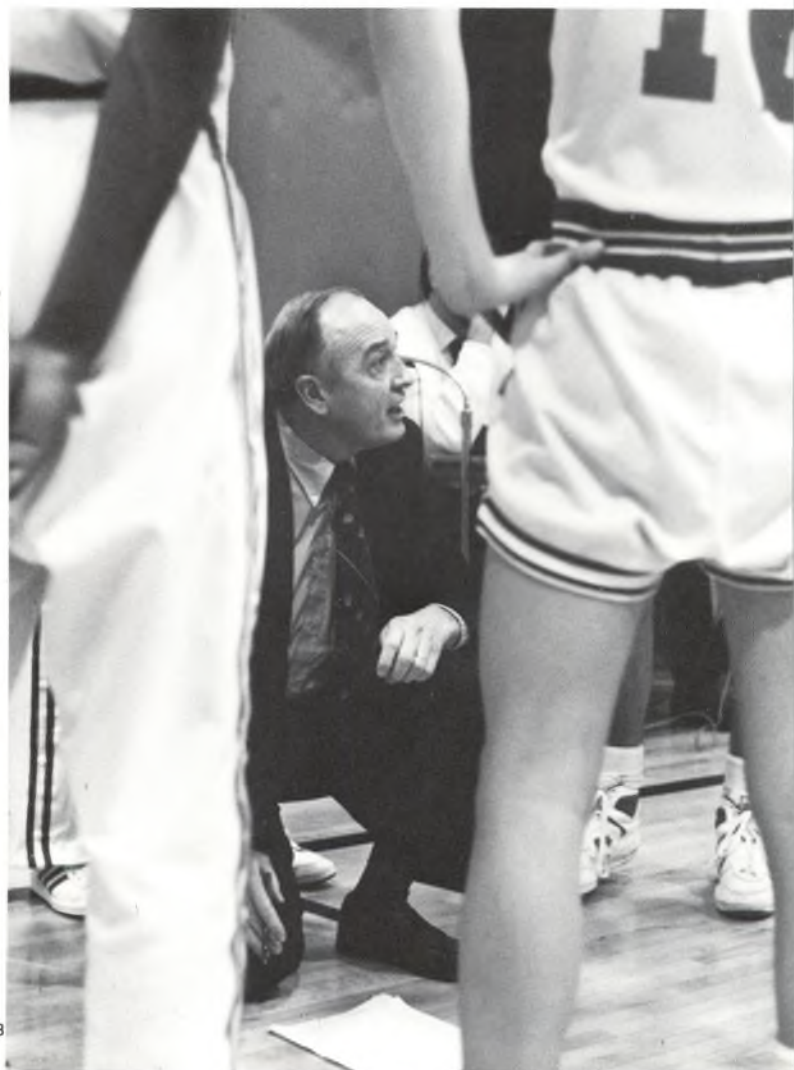
Senior Ken Greenfield, a two year starter, was given special mention recognition at the All-Conference meeting and sophomore Jim Smith was given honorable mention status.

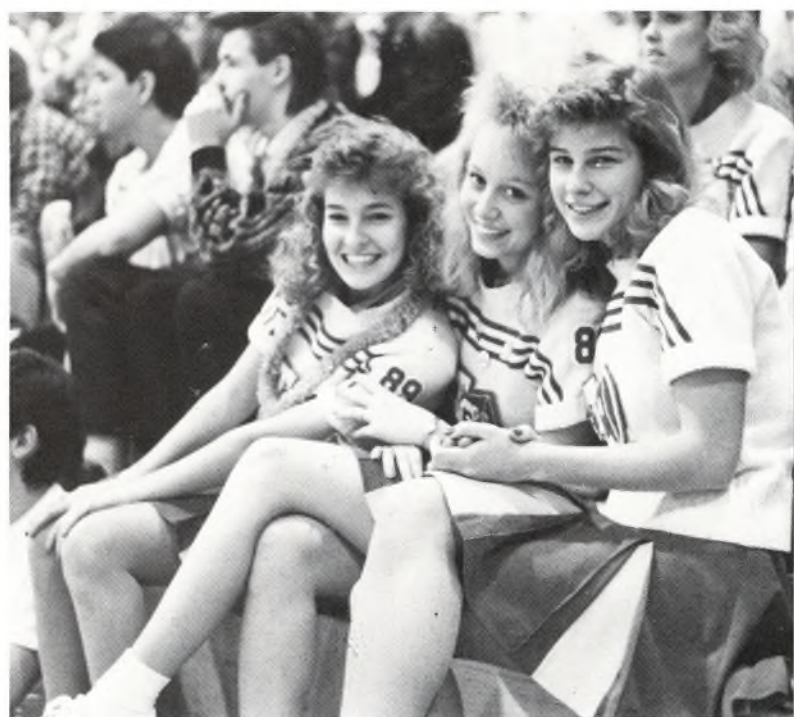

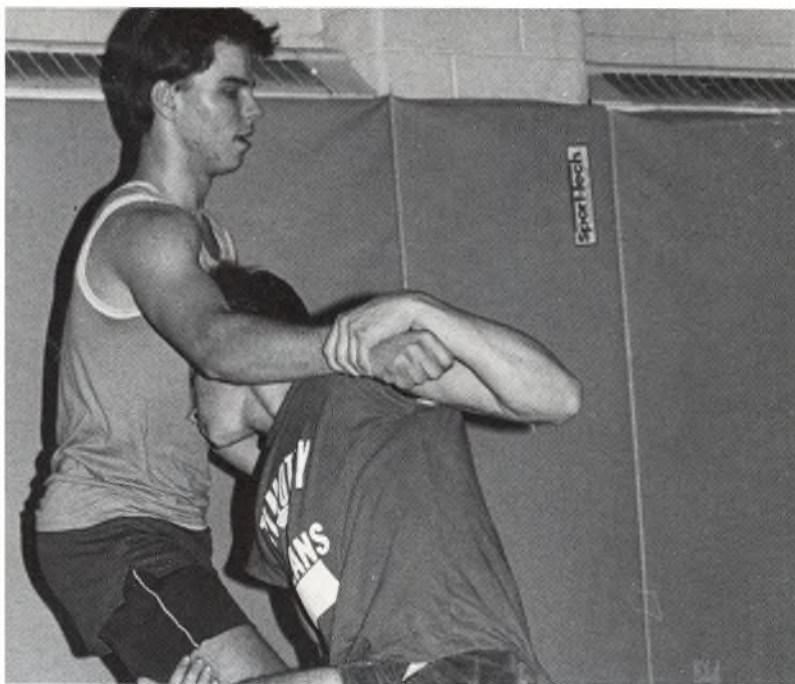

the catwalk, yodelling the theme to "Tarzan

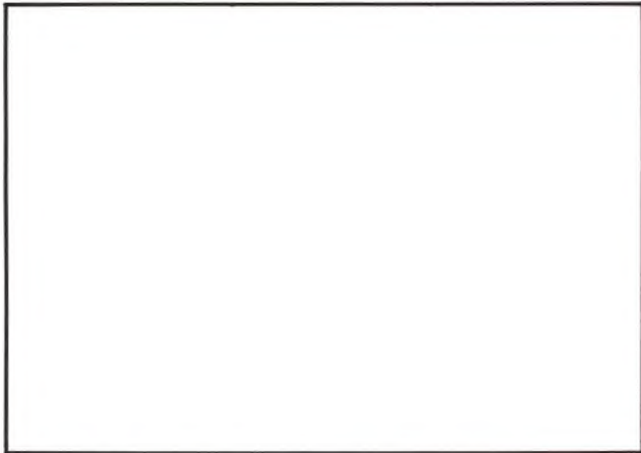
saves the armadillos".

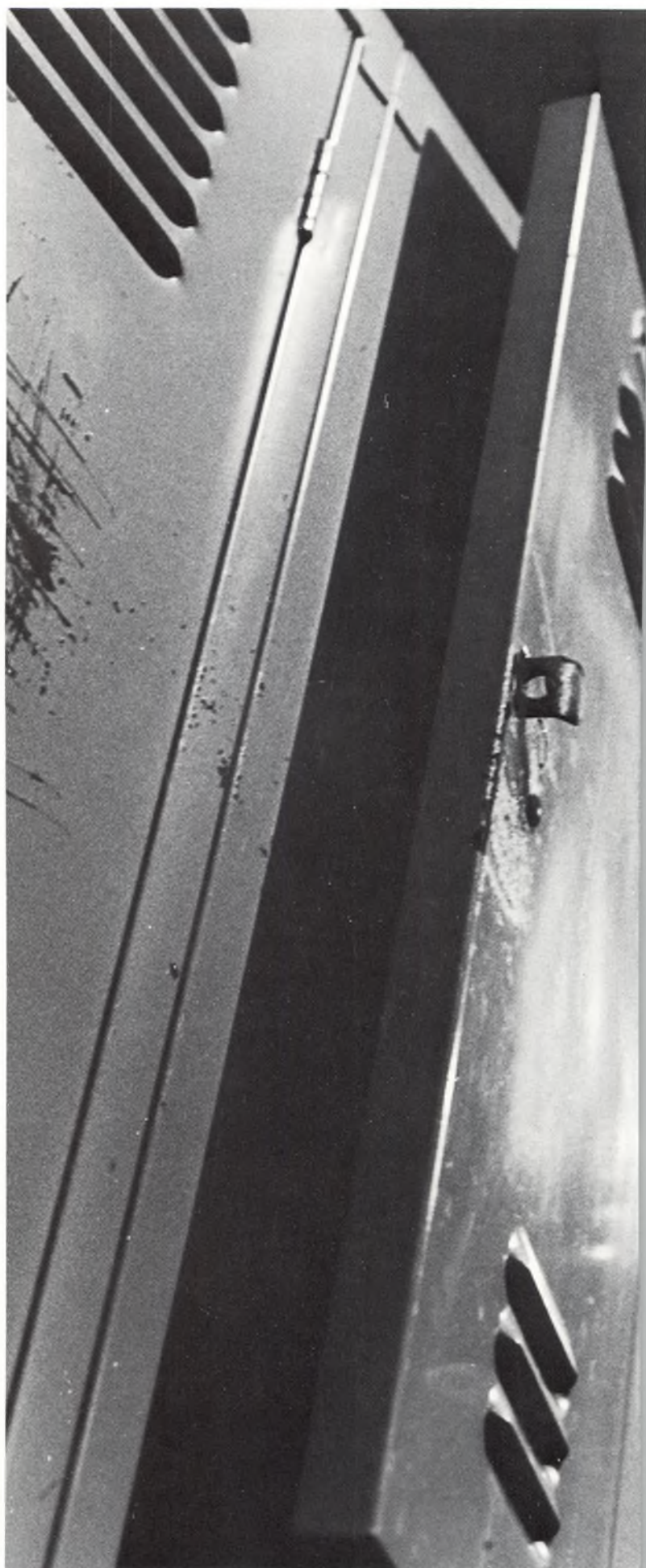






# LOCKERS
