




FAST FACTS

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING AND INITIATIVES

J.E.D.I. Crew teaches students the importance of working together as a crew to achieve Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion.

Care Giver Crew provides a forum for parents and guardians to learn and share ideas to support student health and achievement.

Power Readers & Literacy for Liberation is a community read-aloud program that nurtures students' proficiency, engagement, confidence and analysis of literature before the 3rd grade. We aim to remove barriers for students by providing them with the tools to increase their literacy and the confidence to find their inner voice and cultivate changemaking.

Pieces of Me is a once year celebration that honors the identities of EMSA students. This is a night that consists of a student created art gallery, fashion show and entertainment.

Passion Projects compels students to research, design and create change to positively impact their surrounding community and environment.
