# investment for the future




Over the last few years, the Principles of Investing class has become a staple in the BSM curriculum.

Steve and Tami Schroll are parents to two BSM alumni – **Adam** '02 and **Libby** '04. Back when Adam was a senior and Libby was a sophomore,

Steve and Tami were trying to figure out how best to give back to the school. Their children would both be graduating soon, and they wanted to give back to a community that had been so great to their family.

The Schrolls wanted to be very intentional with their gift. Their gift needed to be something with lasting impact that directly affected the Red Knight student experience. After some discussion with our Advancement team and some personal reflection, Steve and Tami made a generous \$50,000 donation in the form of an endowed student investment portfolio. This portfolio has since served as the foundation for BSM's Principles of Investing class.



Steve Schroll shared:

"I wanted to help enhance the breadth and depth of the BSM experience. Having always been in investing, it just made sense to give in this manner."

As a career financial professional with an MBA from the University of Minnesota's Carlson School of Management, Schroll has seen and helped many young adults begin their own careers. Often times, these students transition to professional careers with a lot of theoretical knowledge and learned facts but without much, if any, experience with actual money. Schroll thought it imperative that Red Knights get as much real world exposure as possible. "I wanted to help enhance the breadth and depth of the BSM experience. Having always been in investing, it just made sense to give in this manner," shared Schroll.

Over the last few years, the Principles of Investing class has become a staple in the BSM curriculum. In addition to a few marketing, accounting and other finance classes, Principles of Investing is now the most in demand class in the business department. This coming school year, the class has expanded from two to three sections with more than 60 students registered.

Since 2011, Mr. John Sabol has taught Principles of Investing through a mix of curriculum and practicum. Having been a financial analyst at Piper Jaffrey and a hedge fund trader, Sabol knows how important it is to combine standard teaching and learning with hands on experience. "There are a number of basic equations, theories and principles you need to know to be financially prudent. By giving our students the opportunity to put these learnings into action and deal with real money, they have a clear advantage going in to college," Sabol explained.

As the semester goes, a majority of the first month or two is spent on curriculum. Students learn such things as portfolio theory, time value of money, valuation and risk. After this, classes form small groups to analyze stocks from their current portfolio and research potential stock options. Then, the rest of the semester is devoted to trading stocks in and out of the portfolio based on Excel modeling, class presentations and student voting. Sabol manages the portfolio and may reinforce a principle or two every now and again, but other than that, decisions and classroom discussions are led entirely by the students.

"Steve wanted students to have a better understanding of money before they went off to college or the real world. He comes to class every semester to check in with students, share his expertise and remind them of the importance of financial literacy," said Sabol.

"At the end of the day, I want to help BSM students develop confidence when dealing with financial matters. Even if they don't make finance their vocation, at least they aren't scared away by the subject. Every time I visit, I am excited to see how each group of classes has progressed, and it's a true privilege to be able to make a difference," Schroll reflected.

Since 2002, the student-managed portfolio of roughly 12-15 stocks has continued to perform well. Despite a launch shortly after the 9/11 tragedy, a housing market collapse and a recession, the endowed fund has seen consistent growth. Roughly 14 years later, the portfolio has gone from that original \$50,000 to more than \$110,000. When the endowment was first set up, it was stipulated that whenever the portfolio valued more than \$100,000, BSM could take out six percent to be used by the business department. As a result of the success, a live stock ticker has



been purchased for the business classroom, a few scholarships have been awarded for students who demonstrate need and take specific business classes (including Principles of Investing) and BSM has added Business Professionals of America (BPA) to its extensive list of extracurricular activities. And just this past spring, junior Billy Madden '17, placed 9th in the personal finance division at BPA's national tournament in Boston.

"Overall, I am very pleased with how things have gone. Our gift continues to make an impact, and I feel it has been a positive experience for everyone involved. My hope is that more individuals, parents or alumni, see the value in such a program and feel motivated to offer their own time, talent or treasure," concluded Schroll.

As Ehrmantraut recalls, "We were down to two schools, but after stepping foot into BSM, I knew right away it was the best choice. The love and peace I encountered on that first visit was more than enough."

BSM is very glad she chose to become a Red Knight. Her dedication and faith to both God and school was an overwhelming example of what we want in all of our students. "Sabrina is one of the most faithful and faith-filled individuals I have ever met. She is a committed and multi-talented young woman with a bright future," shared Campus Minister Mike Jeremiah. "She absolutely deserves the Al Reger award."

During her six years as a Red Knight, Ehrmantraut was an integral part of many fine arts related extracurricular activities. She was in choir, pop choir, drama, the One Act play, peer ministry, speech and NHS, to name a few. "I love music, reading and analyzing any kind of writing and sharing my faith. At BSM, you have the opportunity to really express yourself in more than one way without being judged," she explained.

As she looked back at her time at BSM, Ehrmantraut rattled off a list of faculty and experiences that had positively influenced her life. "I was probably closest with Mr. J; he was just always there for me no matter what. I could pretty much name the entire English department for helping me explore and further develop my love for all things reading, writing and researching. Then there's Ms. Stockhaus and Mr. Petroski who inspired my passion for music and enabled me to express my faith through singing." Ehrmantraut said.

This fall, she will be attending the College of Saint Benedict in St. Joseph, Minnesota where she plans to major in secondary education. Ehrmantraut plans to stay involved in a number campus ministry activities and hopes to find a choir as well. If her career as a Red Knight is any example, we know she'll make her mark up at St. Ben's too.

In the words of choir teacher Nancy Stockhaus, "Sabrina is an individual who knows herself very well. She has a balance of faith, confidence, intelligence and empathy for others. She is an incredible role model for other young adults around her."

## **Brandon Banks**

This year's Al Reger award winner, Brandon Banks, was known on campus as a calm and effective leader. "Brandon has always been about solving problems that matter. Though he was the one being honored, Banks was very quick to recognize the many faculty and staff who made an impact on him during his BSM experience. "I feel like I could name everyone who has taught me from both the junior and senior high. A few that come to mind right away are Mr. Hoemke and Ms. Shea. In his junior high English classes, Mr. Hoemke pushed me to find my voice and speak up for things in which I believe. As my debate coach and morality teacher in senior high, Ms. Shea was a major influence on me. She really challenged my thinking and helped shape who I am today." Banks reflected.

Banks is a true reflection of what it means to be a Red Knight, and we are confident he will live out BSM's values as he pursues a mechanical engineering degree at Purdue University. "BSM has helped me build leadership skills both in and out of the classroom. This community has allowed me to express my opinions and has taught me to adapt to different issues in a constructive and respectful manner," he concluded.


# Top athletes get ready for collegiate competion

# **Amanda Kautzer**

The 2016 Athena Award recipient, **Amanda Kautzer** '16, discovered her passion for multiple sports while at BSM, one by mistake.

After moving on from the swim team in 7th grade, Kautzer was debating which sport to take up next. She decided to give alpine skiing a try. However, when it came time to attend the sports meeting, she went to the wrong one and ended up at the Nordic meeting instead. "I couldn't be happier that I made that mistake," she said.



Athletics aside, Kautzer's resume was equally impressive off the field. She has had great success in other extracurricular activities and in the classroom. She was involved in Math League, Red Knight Volunteer Corp, NHS and orchestra. Even with this busy schedule, she managed to stay focused on academics to earning a 4.0 GPA and being named a valedictorian for the class of 2016.

"BSM has been a great school for Amanda. While she was skiing internationally, she still had the ability to complete her coursework and maintain that 4.0 GPA through online school. It's a great advantage that not all schools offer. She couldn't have done it without the amazing support from her teachers," shared Carl Shaffer, Kautzer's Nordic coach of four years.

Ironically and humbly, out of all her successes, her fondest memory as a Red Knight is her teammates' achievements. "I've been training with some of these people since 7th grade, so to see them achieve these big breakthroughs makes me so happy."

As she retires her Red Knight gear, Kautzer is excited for her future. "There are no limits for me. I don't know what's going to happen in the next five or ten years, but I am sure it's going to be great!" she exclaimed.

This fall, she will be attending Michigan Tech University where she will pursue a degree in engineering. She also plans to run cross country and continue Nordic skiing in "some of the best snow in the U.S." As always, Kautzer will be keeping her schedule full and her possibilities endless.



Since then, Kautzer has earned 16 varsity letters in Nordic skiing, track and field, cross country and math league. A three sport captain, she has had quite the successful career as a Red Knight student-athlete. Kautzer has particularly excelled in Nordic skiing, even if by accident. In addition to being recognized with All Conference Honorable Mention 2016 in boys' Nordic skiing (Kautzer competed in both girls' and boys' races), she participated in the biathlon for the 2015-2016 Youth Olympic Games in Norway.

"The atmosphere from the games is hard to describe. Everyone there was super motivated, and they were obviously good at their respective sport. You want to achieve your highest potential, but everyone else around you does too. It was an incredible experience that I will never forget," Kautzer recalled.

# Cole Jacob

The youngest of three siblings, Cole Jacob '16, is used to having to work hard to be heard and get what he wants. "As the little brother, I guess you could say I have a bit of an aggression issue," he admitted. Luckily for BSM, he focused that aggression on the field excelling in both football and baseball. Therefore, it came as no surprise when he was named the 2016 Al Blasing award winner.

As a student, Jacob had a calm and polite demeanor about him. If you saw him walking down the hallways at school, he was almost certainly sporting some Red Knight athletic apparel. Under all of this was, and is, an intensely motivated athlete.

"I owe a lot to the BSM community. From teachers like Ms. Belanger who challenged me and kept me engaged in her English classes to others like Coach Hanks who had faith in me and helped me no matter what, I have always felt at home at BSM. I know they have prepared me for the future," Cole reflected.

On the football field, Jacob shined as cornerback and wide receiver. His ability to create plays on offense and track the ball on defense was unparalleled. In the words of Coach Joe Creer, "Cole made it his job to get that ball on both offense and defense. He's just a ball hog, and I mean that in the best way!" Capping off his BSM career, Jacob was able to lead a relatively young varsity team to a section championship and state tournament berth (only the third in BSM's history).

"His junior year, we played Holy Angels in a football game we were predicted to lose. Cole went out and played one of the best games I've seen in my 20 years at BSM, and we got the upset victory. He's just a great competitor. Athletic ability aside, Cole has also been a great leader on and off the field," shared Athletic & Activities Director Jerry Pettinger.

On the baseball diamond, Jacob stood out as reliable outfielder. Having played for most of his life, he most appreciates the team element of the game, and though he will be putting away his bat and mitt, Jacob knows he left nothing on the field. Whether it was that game sophomore year in which he hit two home runs or reaching the semifinal game in the state tournament this past season, it was a great career for Jacob.

Next year, Jacob will continue as a studentathlete playing football for North Dakota State University. He will stick to the defensive side of the ball, and he hopes to major in business. To future Red Knight athletes he shared the following advice: "It's always important to work hard at whatever you want to achieve; however, you can't forget to find balance in your life."

# Faculty of the Year

When presenting the award, Junior High Prinicpal Claire Shea reflected on how she's known Kuntz as one of her teachers, coworkers and friends. "I've had the privilege of knowing Dave since he started at BSM. He has always had the ability to make every student feel like a valued individual in his class. His innovative approaches to teaching difficult subject matter have been an invaluable part of BSM's Junior High experience," she said.

Shea also shared a few comments from those who had nominated Kuntz, and the sentiments were the same. "His leadership, in and out of the classroom, have been integral in building the culture and life of the Junior High," stated on faculty member. "There isn't a more deserving person who should receive this award this year!" exclaimed another.

Upon accepting the award, Kuntz was his usual humble self. "As an entire faculty, we have done an excellent job of adopting the 'striving together to solve problems that matter' philosophy and matching it with the school's mission. Teachers are introducing or building on innovative programs that challenge students to apply their learning in real-life situations. I know I would not have received this award without the encouragement and support of my colleagues, especially in the junior high. I feel incredibly honored."
