Over the past few weeks, a few astute parishioners have noticed that a crucifer has not always been present during the processions on Sunday mornings and several have asked questions about this practice and even the procession itself. First of all you should understand that not having the cross in procession has not been intentional. Simply stated the absence of the cross on those rare occasions has been evidence that our acolyte participation is low and indeed still recovering from the disruption that Covid caused us. Not all of our acolytes can carry our large processional cross, nor are they adequately trained to be the lead server during the Eucharist, but out of practical necessity the Gospel Book has led the procession on several occasions. Please know that we are working on this issue but we are in need of volunteers.

Someone stated that we are used to bowing when the cross passes us, and that is absolutely correct! When we have competing images of Jesus in procession, it can be confusing. But theologically, we understand that the Gospel Book and the Cross are both icons of Jesus Christ. The Gospel Book itself represents the Word of God. The empty Cross represents the resurrected Christ, and even the torches are symbolic of the light of Christ. It is then appropriate to bow or reverence either leading icon during the procession. This is really no different than reverencing the icons of Christ at the front of the church when you enter or exit your pew. The empty cross, the altar, the reserve sacrament and even the lighted candles all act as icons or symbols of Jesus in various ways, but we

don't stop to parse them before we act out of reverence.

In fact the rule of thumb for our Sunday procession is as follows: if one acolyte, the Cross leads; if two acolytes, Cross then Gospel Book; if three acolytes, Gospel Book and two torches is preferred, but can also be Cross, Gospel and Clergy Cross, or Cross and two torches; if four acolytes, Cross, then torches and Gospel Book; if five acolytes (our standard), Cross, torches, Gospel Book and Clergy Cross. During certain occasions you will note that we may add flags, streamers, banners, thurible (incense pot), palm branches and even the Paschal Candle. All are liturgically and theologically correct but are changed to serve various purposes and mark special occasions, just as a third clergyperson on our staff will also change how the symbols are arranged during the procession.

I encourage you to pay attention to the symbols we use in our liturgy and when you have questions I hope you will take time to ask me, Forbes or Amanda. Everything we do or say revolves around our theology and beliefs in Jesus as Lord, and how we understand our ritual, symbols and practices only serves to increase the value of our liturgy and to reinforce the depths of our faith.

## Come as you are for Compline Sunday, July 17 7:00 pm, in the church

The last of the four services in the Daily Office (BCP, p. 127), Compline is descended from the night prayers said before bed at the end of the monastic round of daily prayer. Compline is a simple office including a confession of sins, one or more psalms, a short reading from scripture, versicles and responses, the Lord's Prayer, collects which ask for God's protection during the night to come, and the canticle Nunc dimittis. A hymn for the evening may follow the short reading from scripture. The collects may be followed by a time of silence, along with free intercessions and thanksgivings.




