



After more than two decades of service as the BSM librarian, Lynn Bottge has retired. We thank Ms. Bottge for her contributions to the Red Knight community and wish her well.



For more than 1,000 years, Christians have made the pilgrimage to the site where legend says the remains of the Apostle St. James were laid to rest.

"I hiked from June 22 to July 25. It was a time to pray and reflect, and a cultural experience. Being away from friends and family made me realize all the more how much I value them. Also, Spanish food is delicious!"

Gift annuities support BSM into the future

Frank Spinner '59 came to Benilde in 1956 from De La Salle to get an education and play football, basketball and baseball. At the beginning of his junior year, he was named the starting quarterback; but, a broken leg in a pre-season scrimmage ended his football career. Nonetheless, he was a Benilde student in the late 50s – focused and tough. He healed and continued playing basketball and baseball for the next two years, earning All-Region honors in basketball in 1957-58 and 1958-59. Frank also excelled in the classroom and in leadership roles. He was voted Junior Class President and Senior Class President and President of Student Council. He says sports taught him dedication, and being a member of the Student Council instilled in him leadership.



Frank graduated from Benilde and went on to St. Thomas College. While there, he became reacquainted with Barb (whom he met in 8th grade at Annunciation before she moved out of state with her parents), who was now a student at the University of Minnesota. They married in April 1962.

After graduating from St. Thomas, Frank, now with a wife and family, decided to postpone his teaching and coaching dream. Instead, he got into banking. Frank worked for 25 years at what became Wells Fargo and US Bank. In 1986, after the family was grown, Frank and Barb went to work for Father Flanagan's Boys Town in Omaha. Because of his degree in education and coaching, Frank finally realized his dream of working with young men. He instilled in these boys the same discipline and focus on academics that the Christian Brothers did in him 27 years earlier.

That's not all he's passed along. Frank and Barb have established several charitable gift annuities. The annuities provide retirement income and tax deductions for the Spinners now and will later help Father Flanagan's Boys Town and Benilde-St. Margaret's. While their annual giving largely supports Benilde-St. Margaret's Annual Fund, the couple's annuity will fund Endowed Scholarships for deserving students.

Speaking of students, Frank and Barb's grandson, **Carter Burn** is a junior at Benilde-St. Margaret's. He's following in his grandfather's footsteps as an excellent student, an athlete, and a volunteer for non-profits in the area.

Although Frank and Barb had established previous Gift Annuities, they attribute their gift to Benilde-St. Margaret's to the help and persistence of Richard Olson, the Vice President of Advancement, who provided the gift illustrations and described where the need is the greatest at BSM – financial aid for deserving students. "Richard continues to keep me informed and gives me good ideas regarding the needs of the school," said Frank.

"Benilde provided an education that helped provide my family a good living. Without scholarships and financial help, I would never have made it. My support now is like repaying a debt."

ON BEING CATHOLIC

Our Lady of Peace Chapel: A History of Community

Throughout the BSM campus, signs and symbols of our Catholic faith are visible. Most prominent among them is our chapel, which was dedicated to Our Lady of Peace.

The altar was blessed in October 2001 by Archbishop Harry Flynn. The student body was asked to suggest names for the chapel. When the September 11, 2001, tragedy occurred, the new space was used for prayer services. Subsequently, the students unanimously chose the chapel name.

During the planning process, the Faith Formation Department faculty and students from the liturgy committee class met with the architects, who then created an intimate design that brings liturgical celebrants and the congregation close together. The ceiling begins to soar upward from the back of the room toward the west and over the altar. The wall behind the altar includes several windows that bring sunlight and warmth into the space and through which the outdoor cross can be seen. As a backdrop to the altar, a large crucifix is suspended above a display of three icons representing the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, the Christian Brothers, and the Benedictines, three religious orders whose legacies and charisms enrich Benilde-St. Margaret's.

The crucifix above the altar bears the corpus that used to be on the crucifix that once hung in the main hallway in Benilde High School. The corpus has hung in Benilde-St. Margaret's since the merger of Benilde High School and St. Margaret's Academy in 1974.

The altar was donated jointly by the Benilde High School and St. Margaret's Academy Classes of 1971. Before the oak hardwood floor under the altar was installed, BSM students, faculty, and staff signed the underlayment, creating a sort of time

capsule symbolic of the continuity of the community that meets and prays regularly in the chapel.

The tabernacle was a gift from Father Arnold Weber, past president of BSM, and his parishioners at Holy Name of Jesus in Medina. It was the second tabernacle from the old church of



Holy Name, the first one having been destroyed in a fire.

The statue of the Blessed Mother – Madonna della Strada (Madonna of the Streets) – was donated by Suzanne Dunn in memory of her mother, Mrs. James McGraw.



In 2012, the Christian Brothers of De La Salle High School presented BSM with relics of St. Benilde along with the original Vatican documents authenticating the relics. They are displayed in a case in the chapel.



The Stations of the Cross along the walls were a gift from the BSM Parent Association. The set of ceramic altar ware was crafted by Jean Nelson, CSJ and donated at the time of the chapel dedication along with a large celebratory, processional candle that was crafted by Gerrie Lane, CSJ. The holy water fonts at each door came from the original chapel in Benilde High School.

The gold chalice and paten were a gift from **Rita Mitchell Hughes**, SMA '58, given in memory of her mother, **Yvonne Bonin Mitchell Ward**, SMA '20. The gift was presented to BSM in September 2007 by **Bill Bonin**, Benilde '61, Rita's uncle and the cousin of Betty Bonin Ferrian, mother of staff member **Mary Beth Liekhus**, SMA '68. The chalice belonged to Father Leon Bonin (1915-1995).

The BSM stole was a gift from the BSM Mother's Club to Father Arnold Weber. When he retired from Holy Name, he returned it to BSM. **Maria Fleischhacker** '09, made another stole, the red stole with the flame representing the Holy Spirit. **Alissa Nation** '09, made the altar cloth. They created the items as part of their Arts in the Church class, and donated them in 2008.

The chapel space was made possible through generous gifts from the families of Tom and Judy Mahoney, Gerald and Henrietta Rauenhorst, and Mark and Karen Rauenhorst. Along with donors, students, and faculty and staff, several other people have been instrumental in making the Our Lady of Peace Chapel at Benilde-St. Margaret's School a community focal point of our campus. We thank them all.

Last year, 188 BSM students took 356 Advanced Placement exams in 14 different subject areas. On a scale of 1-5, AP test-takers will pass with a score of 3-5. Eighty-one percent of the BSM students' scores were in the 3-5 range and 51 percent were in the 4-5 range. The average scores of BSM students taking AP tests compared favorably to the averages of all students taking the tests. Ninety-one percent of our Class of 2012 took the ACT test. The top 10 percent of the class scored 33 or better. One student achieved a perfect score of 36. Ninety-six percent of the Class of 2012 enrolled in four-year colleges; and, one percent went on to two-year or technical schools. Our students get into college at a rate that exceeds the national average.

Alumni parents tell us their students go to college ready to hit the ground running. Former students stay in touch with their teachers and tell of discovering, for example, that their writing skills are more advanced than those of their college classmates.

To meet BSM's high teaching standards and promote a 21st century learning environment, our teachers are focusing on professional development. They are proficient in the latest technology, and they collaborate with colleagues to be the best in their profession.

Benilde-St. Margaret's has been named an Apple Distinguished School for 2012-2013. The designation by Apple Inc. is reserved for schools that show outstanding leadership as measured by five practices: visionary leadership, innovative learning and teaching, ongoing professional learning, flexible learning environments, and compelling evidence of success.

"Benilde-St. Margaret's success starts with talented teachers using the best tools to enhance and transform the learning environment," said Steve Pohlen, BSM director of technology and learning. "For many years now, BSM has fostered a culture of innovation that energizes teachers to continuously pursue the most dynamic and effective learning and teaching methods."

The 1-to-1 laptop program and campus-wide access to Wi-Fi are two of many BSM assets serving "tech-savvy" students who are developing their critical thinking skills and feeding

their curiosity. Fifty-five Internet-based databases offer BSM students access to more information than ever could be stored in stacks of library resource books. The reconfiguration of the Moore Library space has made it possible for students to build into their schedules time for research, studying with their peers, and meeting with teachers or tutors in the Writing Center or Math Center.

The reversed/"flipped classroom" learning method implemented in Fred Hennen's junior high math class during the 2008-2009 school year uses laptops, podcasts, and the Internet to transform the classroom experience. With this method, which has captured the imagination of education experts who have observed Mr. Hennen's work, the teacher is less a "Sage on a Stage," and more of a facilitator who helps the students to accomplish their goals. Students' homework consists of viewing Mr. Hennen's lecture online and working on problems at their own pace at home. The problems that give students the most trouble are dealt with in class. As a result, students learn to take responsibility for learning, and they begin to appreciate the value of collaboration.

Jean Nightingale, chair of the math department, says her colleagues are developing another teaching method that combines classroom and web-based teaching for two classes. Precalculus Blended Online, a two-semester course for students who have completed Advanced Algebra or both Statistics and Functions & Trigonometry, will combine online resources with an onsite classroom-supported environment using a flexible schedule. Much of the classwork will be done online, but the student will meet with the teacher and other students two or three days per week. Students will meet with the teacher on a regular basis to make sure they're making progress. "The intended outcomes are exciting," said Ms. Nightingale. "Self-starting and independent students could move through more than one class per year. And, they'll be as involved in cutting-edge learning as they can be."

In the coming school year, students will be able to choose from a program of studies that includes some new, innovative courses. Forensic Science, an elective course for students who have earned at least a B in Biology, Physics, and Chemistry is an option. Creative communicators may choose to take Graphic Design, Photojournalism, or Video Journalism. The new Immigrant Literature course will have a service learning component that taps into the BSM mission to provide a curriculum that includes faith formation, academic rigor, and social responsibility.

BSM teachers share a commitment to ongoing professional development and growth in the context of collaboration, innovation and creativity. To keep the momentum of excellence going, BSM seeks to continually support and cultivate best teaching practices – to teach our students to solve problems that really matter.



Mary Ann McNeil '71




Molly Joseph '92
