

Leadership Awards

Matt and Jacki Haughey

Matt and Jacki Haughey joined the BSM community in 2005, and their leadership in philanthropy, volunteerism, and stewardship has been extraordinary. Their calm and confident approach has enabled them to be wonderful problem solvers in many situations. Matt contributed behind the scenes and Jacki was a strong presence at school. She was very involved in the Parent Association, the auction, and the Spirit Shop. She approached all

projects, big and small, with the same enthusiasm and had a wonderful way of making all tasks fun and all other volunteers appreciated. Jacki touched many areas and organizers relied on her capable leadership and generous spirit. Last, but by no means least, is the generous financial support the Haugheys have shown Benilde-St. Margaret's in their eight year tenure. Their gifts have impacted the Haughey children and their peers and will continue to bless those Red Knights who follow in their footsteps.

Lee and Barbara Kopp

Lee and Barbara Kopp have never had a child attend BSM, but in 1988 they made their first gift to Benilde-St. Margaret's for tuition assistance. Those gifts have made it possible for BSM to award financial aid to many deserving students and annually provide Kopp scholarships to graduating seniors. The more Lee and Barbara became aware of the struggles and needs of BSM families, these struggles became personal to them and they wanted to provide even more assistance. Over the past few years the Kopp Family Foundation has provided funding to the "Random Acts of Kindness" fund. This fund provides assistance to BSM's neediest families and helps pay for bussing, academic field trips, college testing, school lunch and other incidentals that most families take for granted. Over the past 17 years, the Kopp Family Foundation has provided 25 gifts and almost \$175,000 in support to BSM students receiving financial aid.

Roger and Irma Scherer

Appropriately, Roger and Irma Scherer were honored during the 40th year of Benilde-St. Margaret's. As parents and grandparents they have personally experienced 30 of the 40 years of the merged school. They strongly believe in Catholic education and they have passed that belief on to their children. Nine family members are BSM alums, five are current students, and two are waiting in the wings. The Scherers have been most generous with their time, talent and treasure throughout the history of BSM. Roger served on the Board of Directors from 1978-1980, offering his business expertise in that first decade of the merger. A lifetime member of the Mothers' Club, Irma was very involved with many of their activities and she was one of the pioneers in the Spirit Shop. Roger and Irma have faithfully supported the mission of the school through their financial donations, their volunteer hours, and their most precious gifts – their children and grandchildren.

John Fleischhacker '65

After graduating from Benilde, John Fleischhacker attended the University of Minnesota to study engineering and then served in the Air Force. Throughout this time, he continued to work for and with his family's business, Lake Region Medical. In 1974 John struck out on his own and launched Daig Corporation, a medical device manufacturing company. John's vision and perseverance are credited with steering the company through chapter 11 bankruptcy in the early 80s to double digit growth in the mid-90s. Diag's success did not go unnoticed and it was acquired by St. Jude Medical in 1996. John and Dondi have three children and four grandchildren. The oldest two grandchildren, Brooke and Carson, are students at BSM.

There is a sense of serendipity in knowing that his grandchildren are studying engineering in the spot where he first established and ran Benilde's printing center when he was a student.

Jeanne Vonhof '70

From her days at St. Margaret's Academy to her successful career in arbitration today, Jeanne has refused to conform to society's expectation of women. As co-editor of the school newspaper, Jeanne lobbied for a more gender-balanced representation of professions at SMA's career day. At just 22 years old she testified before congress on women's rights, then went on to graduate from law school with honors at a time when over 85% of her

classmates were men. Jeanne has served on more than 18 listed industry and association arbitration panels. She is a published author, a nationally recognized speaker, and adjunct professor at Indiana University. Working on cases ranging from employee rights to labor strikes, in no fewer than 60 different industries, Jeanne has delivered opinions and interpretations on a dizzying array of issues. Her ambition and dedication to her profession set a standard of excellence few are able to match.

David Martin '83

Since graduating from BSM, David Martin has embraced change. He changed addresses multiple times before settling down in California. In 1999 he changed industries, leaving his

position of Managing Director at Montgomery Securities to become CFO of Hollywood Entertainment Corporation. When David left Hollywood to join a small start-up, Legend Films, as their CFO and CEO, he changed corporate culture. David is described by colleges and employees alike as visionary, a naturally creative and talented CEO, and sincerely good guy. His innate ability to bring out the best in those around him was key in transitioning Legend Films from restoration and colorization of black and white films to innovation. By capitalizing on their existing technology, Legend pioneered the creation of 3D special effects. Renamed Legend 3D, the company quickly grew to be the gold standard in the film industry and the nation's leading digital media and special effects company.


