Scholarships and Exhibition

LEH offers Scholarships for KS3 (Year 7-9), KS4 (Year 10-11) and Sixth Form (Year 12-13) students.

There are no Scholarships awarded for Prep School. An Exhibition is a recognition of exceptional ability and promise and will be decided at the dicretion of the Headteacher.

The bestowal of any award carries with it privilege and responsibility. Every award holder is expected to set an example to other pupils in their approach to life at school and their area of specialism in particular.

All Scholarships and Exhibitions are reviewed annually. The review will consider the progress of award holders in their chosen field of expertise and whether the holder continues enthusiastically to fulfil the obligations associated with the award. School holds the right to withdraw the Scholarship or Exhibition based on the results of annual review.

It is possible to apply for a means-tested bursary alongside an Exhibition or scholarship award.

Applications for Scholarships, Exhibitions and Busaries will be closed by 30 June for next academic year.

What is the difference between a scholarship, an exhibition and a bursary?

Scholarships and Exhibitions are not means-tested, unlike Bursaries, which are. You can hold both an Exhibition or Scholarship and a Bursary if your family's financial situation meets the bursary criteria.

All Scholarship and Exhibition awards offer a financial discount against the basic termly tuition fee, of the percentages given below.

Scholarship and Exhibition Academic Scholarship

KS3 (Year 7-9), KS4 (Year 10-11) or Sixth Form (Year 12-13) Application Process

If you are an external applicant and you wish to apply for the Academic Scholarship, you should indicate this on your Application Form by ticking the appropriate box and submitting your form by the deadline.

If you are a parent of an existing LEH child moving into KS3, KS4 or the Sixth Form, you will receive a letter from the Headteacher asking if your child wishes to apply for any of the scholarships. If you would like your child to be considered for an Academic Scholarship, you should complete and return the Scholarships Form by the given deadline.

Open to

All internal and external applicants applying for the Academic Scholarships need to sit special exams, including English and Maths alongside one subject of your choosing. Shortlisted candidates will be informed to come back for another interview.

Expectations of an Academic Scholar

Given the academically selective nature of the school, we expect all students to show intellectual curiosity. We are looking for someone who has a very inquisitive mind and well-developed independence of thought. These are the kind of things which will be looked for during interview.

We expect all academic scholars to continue to exhibit the qualities which they demonstrated at interview. Whilst there is no expectation of a certain standard of outcome and performance under examination, we expect scholars to achieve effort grades above the average for the school. This requires a high level of focus and active participation in lessons. In addition, they should show interest beyond the classroom, including attendance of lectures and academic clubs and a willingness to enter into school competitions and national competitions.

It is envisaged that these high expectations will not be a burden to the scholars since they will take these in their stride and really enjoy the intellectual challenge as they progress through the school.

Academic Exhibitions

Academic Exhibitions are awarded to younger applicants to recognise their academic potential. This will be awarded at the discretion of the Headteacher.



Scholarship and Exhibition Art Scholarship

KS4 (Year 10-11) or Sixth Form (Year 12-13) Application Process

If you are an external applicant and you wish to apply for an Art Scholarship, you should indicate this on your Application Form by ticking the appropriate box and submitting your form by the deadline.

If you are a parent of an existing LEH student moving into KS4 or the Sixth Form, you will receive a letter from the Headteacher asking if your child wishes to apply for any of the KS4 or Sixth Form scholarships. If you would like your child to be considered for an Art Scholarship, you should complete and return the Scholarships Form by the given deadline.

As an Art Scholarship applicant, your porfolio will be reviewed. In addition, you may wish to submit additional pieces of work. These could include work created on courses or in sketch books.

Please write a short explanation of why you are applying for the Art Scholarship and what you hope to study when you leave school and submit this information with your application.

Open to

The Art Scholarship is open to external and internal candidates entering KS4 or the Sixth Form. Applicants should be planning to study A Level Art.

What happens on the day?

Selected applicants will be invited to attend a short interview.

Expectations of an Art Scholar

You will be invited to create artwork for the school over the course as an Art Scholar.

Art Scholars enjoy

As an Art Scholar you will receive complimentary tickets to gallery trips.

Scholarship and Exhibition Drama Scholarship

KS4 (Year 10-11) or Sixth Form (Year 12-13) Application Process

If you are an external applicant applying for KS4 or Sixth Form entry and you wish to apply for a Drama Scholarship, you should indicate this on your application form by ticking the appropriate box and submitting your form by the deadline.

If you are a parent of an existing LEH child moving into KS4 or the Sixth Form, you will receive a letter from the Headteacher asking if your child wishes to apply for any of the KS4 or Sixth Form scholarships. If you would like your child to be considered for a Drama Scholarship, you should complete and return the Scholarships form by the given deadline.

As a candidate (both external and internal applicants) you should also write a letter, addressed to the Head of Drama, setting out your reasons for applying for the Drama Scholarship and submit this with your application. Shortlisted candidates will be invited for an interview and/or audition.

Open to

The Drama Scholarship is open to external and internal candidates entering KS4 and the Sixth Form. The Drama Scholarship is likely to go to an applicant who is planning to study IGCSE Drama or A Level Theatre Studies but this is not a requirement.

What happens on the day?

If you have a particular interest in performance, you may be invited to audition. You will be asked to choose one of two options to prepare for performance in a workshop setting with the Head of Drama and the other candidates.

If you are applying with a primary interest in design or technical theatre you may be asked to prepare a brief presentation in response to a specific production brief.

All candidates invited to audition or to give a presentation will also be set a written task exploring their thoughts on the role of theatre in society.

Expectations of a Drama Scholar

We expect the Drama Scholar to act as an ambassador for the work of the department, both academic and co-curricular. It is therefore likely that they will have experience of IGCSE Drama and will take A level Theatre Studies. However, students that have not been able to take the IGCSE course should still apply.



Scholarship and Exhibition Drama Scholarship

We expect the Drama Scholar to have a proven enthusiasm for live theatre and will actively support all school productions.

The Drama Department has a range of leadership positions for students, and we would expect the Drama Scholar to apply for one or more of these at the appropriate time in the school year. Regardless of the outcome of this process, we expect the Drama Scholar to be an active ambassador for the department, volunteering to support department staff and fellow students across the full range of extra-curricular projects.

Drama Scholars enjoy

As a Drama Scholar you will receive complimentary individual Speech and Drama lessons, working towards LAMDA examinations; supporting your academic and production work, or helping you prepare for life after LEH. Technical and design students will have the option of a personalised mentoring programme.

The Drama Scholar will also receive complimentary tickets to theatre trips.



Scholarship and Exhibition Music Scholarship

KS3 (Year 7-9), KS4 (Year 10-11) or Sixth Form (Year 12-13) Application Process

If you are an external applicant and you wish to apply for a Music Scholarship, you should indicate this on your application form by ticking the appropriate box and submitting your form by the deadline.

If you are a parent of an existing LEH child moving into KS3, KS4 or the Sixth Form, you will receive a letter from the Headteacher asking if your child wishes to apply for any of the scholarships. If you would like your child to be considered for a Music Scholarship, you should complete and return the Scholarships Form by the given deadline.

Open to

To apply for a Music Scholarship at KS3 (Year 7-9), you should generally have a minimum of a Grade III Distinction or equivalent, although applicants with considerable potential who have been learning an instrument for only a short time should not be deterred from making an application. In addition, the Music Department is looking for talented young players with good aural and sight-reading ability.

To apply for a Music Scholarship at KS4 (Year 10-11), you should generally have a minimum of a Grade V Distinction or equivalent, although applicants with considerable potential who have been learning an instrument for only a short time should not be deterred from making an application. In addition, the Music Department is looking for talented young players with good aural and sight-reading ability.

To apply for a Music Scholarship in the Sixth Form (Year 12-13), you are expected to have the minimum of a Grade VII Distinction or equivalent. The school is looking for musicians who, although they may not be intending to study Music at A level, are able to make a serious commitment to the Music Department.

What do I need to prepare for my Music Audition?

Entry into KS3: As a shortlisted candidate, you will be expected to play one or two contrasting pieces (not exceeding 5 minutes altogether) on your first instrument. If you are offering a second instrument, you should prepare a short piece of no more than 3 minutes on that instrument. If more than two instruments are offered, please prepare a short piece of a couple of minutes on all instruments.

Entry into KS4 or the Sixth Form: As a shortlisted candidate, you should prepare one or two pieces of approximately 5 minutes duration in total on your first instrument and a short piece, no more than 3 minutes, for a second and third instrument if appropriate.



Scholarship and Exhibition Music Scholarship

What happens on the day?

The first ten minutes of your audition will be for warming-up and rehearsal purposes. There will be a room set aside for this. During your audition you will perform your prepared pieces (details above) and participate in sight-reading, some brief aural tests and a short interview. You may be asked to talk about the context of your pieces.

If you require an accompanist, you are welcome to bring your own. Alternatively, one of our professional accompanists is also available for the audition. They will rehearse with you immediately before your audition. The accompanist fee will be in the region of 200 rmb.

Expectations of a Music Scholar

We expect a Music Scholar:

- To commit to the major school music groups relevant to their instrument, as agreed with the Director of Music.
- To prioritise weekly music rehearsals and concerts for those groups at which they perform.
- To be an ambassador for the Music Department and to lead by example with enthusiasm and commitment to the department.

Music Scholars enjoy

- Performing in a dedicated annual Chamber Concert, including a Scholars' Choir and Orchestra.
- The opportunity to play in assembly at least once a term.
- Participation in a chamber group with specialist coaching

Music Exhibitions

Music Exhibitions are awarded to younger applicants to recognise their musical potential. This will be awarded at the discretion of the Headteacher.



Scholarship and Exhibition Sport Scholarship

KS3 (Year 7-9), KS4 (Year 10-11) or Sixth Form (Year 12-13) Application Process

If you are an external applicant and you wish to apply for a Sport Scholarship, you should indicate this on your application form by ticking the appropriate box and submitting your form by the deadline.

If you are a parent of an existing LEH child moving into KS3, KS4 or the Sixth Form, you will receive a letter from the Headteacher asking if your child wishes to apply for any of the scholarships. If you would like your child to be considered for a Sport Scholarship, you should complete and return the Scholarships Form by the given deadline.

As an internal or external candidate, you should provide a sports curriculum vitae detailing your chosen sport, participation and achievements in your chosen sport and in other sports and, if appropriate, your sports outside school.

Open to

Sports Scholarships are offered to pupils who show exceptional ability in the sport of their choice (which may or may not be a school sport). If you are an internal candidate you will be expected to have made a significant contribution to sport during your time at the school and intend to continue with that contribution.

What happens on the day?

Selected applicants will be invited to attend a short interview.

Expectations of a Sports Scholar

As the Sports Scholar, your contribution will not just relate to your participation but will also include coaching and promotion of sport in general within the school. Other important factors include the level and breadth of contribution to school sport, reliability and leadership qualities amongst peers and performance as a role model for younger age groups.

Sport Scholars enjoy

Leading LEH sports teams, regularly captaining 1st teams and representing LEH at sporting competitions.



Scholarship and Exhibition STEM Scholarship (Sixth Form only)

The school will award one STEM Scholarship (Sixth Form only).

The recipient will be an applicant who demonstrates their passion for one or more STEM subject (Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Further Mathematics, Mathematics, Physics or Product Design) and intends to pursue further study and possibly a career path in a STEM related area. It is open to external as well as internal candidates.

Sixth Form (Year 12-13) Application Process

If you are an external applicant applying for Sixth Form entry, and you wish to apply for the STEM Scholarship, you should indicate this on your Application Form by ticking the appropriate box and submitting your form by the deadline.

If you are a parent of an existing LEH pupil moving into the Sixth Form, you will receive a letter from the Headteacher asking if your child wishes to apply for any of the Sixth Form scholarships. If you would like your child to be considered for the STEM Scholarship, you must complete and return the Scholarships Form by the given deadline.

Please provide a covering letter, addressed to the Head of Science Faculty, with your application explaining why you are applying and outlining your current plans for future study and potential career path. You will need to demonstrate a passion for your subjects and explain what you feel you could contribute to extracurricular life of the school.

Open to

The STEM Scholarship is open to external and internal candidates entering the Sixth Form to study STEM subjects. As a prospective STEM Scholar, you will be studying one or more STEM subjects at A Level.

What happens on the day?

Shortlisted applicants will be asked to give a short presentation.

Expectations of a STEM Scholar

The STEM Scholar is expected to be a positive role model for STEM and contribute to extra curricular activities.
