1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The health and safety of the Twin Valley School District (TVSD) staff and students remains, as always, the top priority for the organization. The TVSD Leadership Team and Pandemic Team continue to take critical steps and make decisions that protect the health and safety of our organization in the ongoing response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

In response to the expiration of statewide mitigation orders, TVSD has identified organizational standards and expectations, which outline the protocols expected of all staff members as the organization transitions forward. Protocols include the following:

- Self-screening for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Following mandated Pa Department of Health reporting requirements.
- Practicing hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette.
- Use of face coverings as required through mandates and orders.
- Option to clean and disinfect one's workspace.
- Maintaining physical distancing protocols if deemed appropriate.
- Staying informed of state and/or federal guidance.
- Participating in required training (current employees as well as new hires as part of their onboarding process)

Expectations are based on the latest state and/or federal mandates. The Leadership Team and Pandemic Team will continue to monitor communications. As conditions change related to COVID-19, protocols are subject to change.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

TVSD educational programs will once again be fully in-person in the Fall of 2022, pending any change in state and/or federal mandates.

TVSD educational programs and services may shift between in-person and virtual depending on health circumstances, as Administration determines appropriate/necessary and/or as directed by the State. TVSD has applied for and been granted emergency instructional time authorization and will consider multiple factors of student and staff health, safety, and well-being when making decisions regarding instructional models.

TVSD employees are provided guidance to contact their appropriate personal health care provider for social, emotional, and mental health services. Employees are encouraged to contact the Human Resources Department for additional information, support, and guidance on an individual basis.

ARP ESSER Requirement

- Universal and correct wearing of masks.

- Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing (e.g., use of cohorts/podding).

- Handwashing and respiratory etiquette

- Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation

Strategies, Policies and Procedures

- We will continue to follow all orders and mandates related to universal and correct wearing of masks if required. If necessary, the District mask exemption procedure will continue to be followed.
- Staff are expected to stay informed of the latest information and resources available.

- TVSD will adhere to the latest state and/or federal mandates relative to physical distancing.
- Physical distancing, when possible, will continue to be recommended for indoor spaces, regardless of vaccination status, if required by mandates and orders.

- Appropriate handwashing and respiratory etiquette is expected from all individuals on District property and/or events associated with the District.
- Protocols include:
 - Washing one's hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
 - If soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol (for staff and older children who can safely use hand sanitizer).
 - Avoid touching one's eyes, nose, and mouth
 - Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, or cough or sneeze into one's elbow.
 - Increase monitoring to ensure adherence among students.

- TVSD will adhere to the latest state and/or federal mandates related to cleaning and ventilation.
- The use of universal precautions designed to minimize the transmission of communicable diseases will continue to be implemented as appropriate. Hand sanitizer and cleaning materials will remain available.
- Limiting shared materials and use of toys that cannot be easily cleaned will continue to the extent appropriate.

ARP ESSER Requirement

- Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments
- Diagnostic and screening testing
- Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities
- Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies
- Coordination with state and local health officials

Strategies, Policies, and Procedures

- Staff will continue to be encouraged to share in the cleaning and disinfecting of shared equipment and/or furniture/items within one's office/classroom.
- Additional cleaning and disinfecting measures/protocols may be required as deemed appropriate or directed by mandates depending on circumstances.
- DOH considers COVID-19 a communicable disease. As such, it is among DOH's listing of reportable diseases.
- Staff are required to report a suspected or known case of COVID-19 to their supervisor within 12 hours.
- Staff must follow the recommendation of their attending physician.
- If required, TVSD will report positive Covid cases as well as close contacts to the appropriate governing body.
- Staff are required to follow the recommendation of their attending physician.
- Staff, students, and community members are encouraged to discuss the vaccination options with their attending physician.
- Special accommodations or health care needs of students with disabilities will be addressed through the IEP process.
- Accommodations may include, but are not limited to, adapted service delivery models when appropriate and/or other health and safety precautions as outlined in an individualized health plan).
- As with any communicable disease, TVSD will contact the appropriate governing body if required.
