This Articulation Agreement (“Agreement”) dated _____ between Northeast Wisconsin Technical College (NWTC) and College of Menominee Nation (CMN) supersedes all prior agreements for the Program named below.

Introduction and Rationale:

This Agreement will allow required coursework taken in the Program at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College to transfer and satisfy requirements within the Degree/Major at College of Menominee Nation.

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide a seamless transfer process for students from NWTC who desire further education to enter College of Menominee Nation and their Bachelors of Science degree in Elementary/Middle School Education license.

Conditions:

The terms of this Articulation Agreement apply only to NWTC students who successfully complete the Program, meet the admission requirements for College of Menominee Nation, and have a Declaration of Major approved for the Degree/Major. Students will need to apply to CMN and complete all requirements outlined in CMN’s transfer policy. Students will also need to apply to the Bachelor of Science degree program, pass a background check, and meet any testing requirements as outlined in the Teacher Education departments policy related to admission.

Additional criteria as needed, such as start date of AAS program

Students are required to successfully complete all degree requirements to earn a degree at the College of Menominee Nation These degree requirements are in the online catalog.

Articulated Courses:

Students who successfully complete the Early Childhood Program at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and meet the admission requirements of College of Menominee Nation will transfer 58 credits towards the Degree/Major Courses will be assigned by course-to-course and/or block equivalency as listed in the tables below.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS AND PROVISIONS


1. Courses must be recorded on an official transcript for students to receive credits from the Agreement.
2. Each institution has the right and responsibility to make changes to its curricula and enrollment standards to maintain its academic integrity and meet accreditation standards. Such changes, if any, will be communicated to the other institution as they occur through the office of each institution responsible for implementing this Agreement.
3. To receive the credit transfer set forth within this Articulation Agreement, the candidate must have received an associate degree through the Institution Program program.
4. CMN and NWTC will provide academic advising to NWTC students inquiring about CMN. CMN and NWTC will share materials, catalogs, and other information to facilitate their understanding of requirements and programs. Institution will assist CMN in arranging recruitment events on its campuses.


5. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach its student population. Both parties will adhere to each institution's standards for the use of its name and logo. Each institution may provide a link to this Agreement and/or the other institution at its website, with notice to the other party.
6. Both parties agree that failure to maintain regional accreditation will be grounds for termination of the Agreement.
7. This Articulation Agreement is effective enter date and will be reviewed every 5 years on enter date, after any changes to the Undergraduate Catalog at CMN have been approved. Both NWTC and CMN agree to notify each other of any curricular changes in a timely manner.
8. This Agreement may be terminated by either institution by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the designee at the other institution at the address set forth above. If the Agreement is terminated, students at CMN who have obtained the NWTC Program shall be allowed to complete their programs under the terms of the Agreement.


