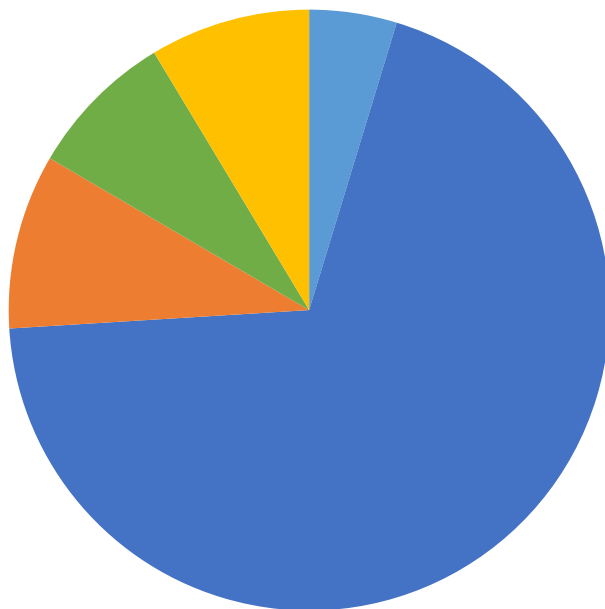

LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

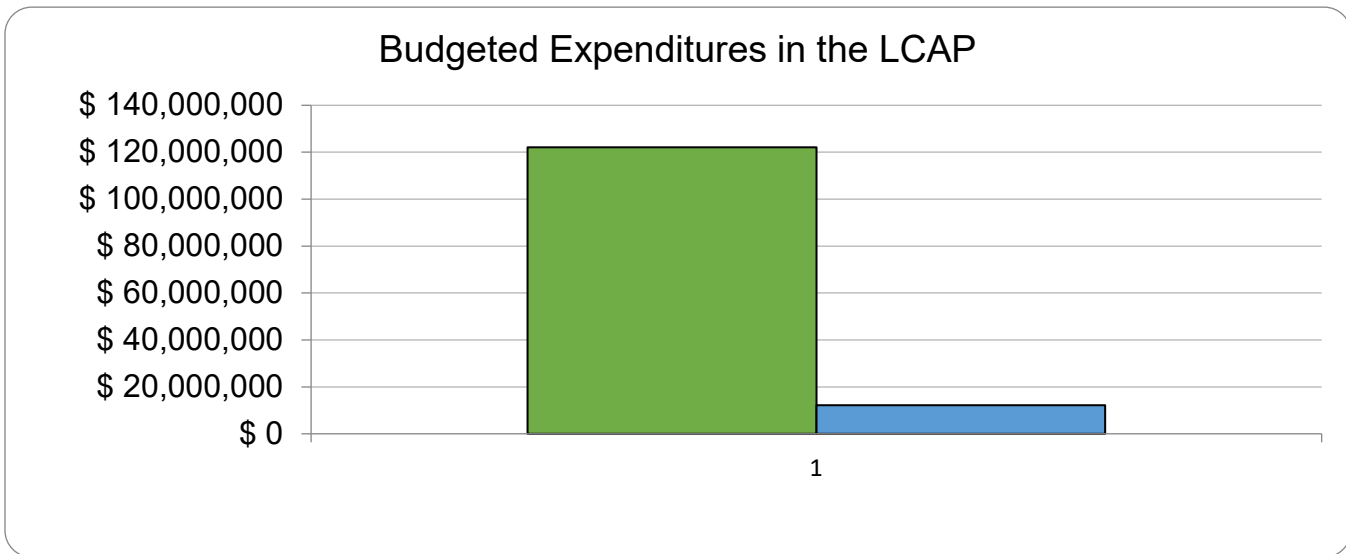
Projected Revenue by Fund Source



This chart shows the total general purpose revenue San Luis Coastal Unified School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for San Luis Coastal Unified School District is \$121,497,516.00, of which \$89,933,701.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$11,429,163.00 is other state funds, \$9,651,908.00 is local funds, and \$10,482,744.00 is federal funds. Of the \$89,933,701.00 in LCFF Funds, \$5,722,471.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

The LCFF gives school districts more flexibility in deciding how to use state funds. In exchange, school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) that shows how they will use these funds to serve students.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much San Luis Coastal Unified School District plans to spend for 2022 – 23. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

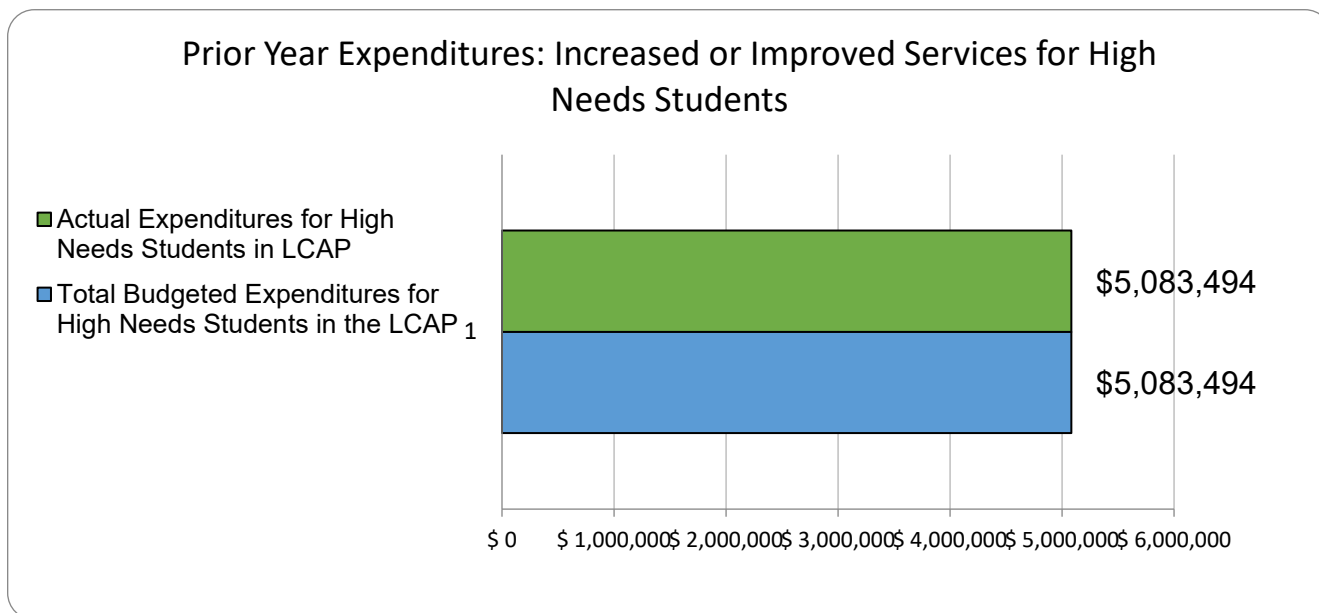
The text description of the above chart is as follows: San Luis Coastal Unified School District plans to spend \$122,153,250.00 for the 2022 – 23 school year. Of that amount, \$12,148,150.00 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$110,005,100.00 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:

The LCAP is a small portion of the overall SLCUSD budget. Most of the funds outside of the LCAP are used for personnel costs, roughly 80 to 85% of the overall budget. The other funds are used to pay for materials and supplies, purchasing equipment, utilities, facilities and maintenance, transportation, and a variety of other expenditures to assist us in running the school district and addressing districtwide needs.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2022 – 23 School Year

In 2022 – 23, San Luis Coastal Unified School District is projecting it will receive \$5,722,471.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students.
