Ryan Intermediate Receives National Recognition for Commitment to Empowering Students

Ryan Intermediate School announced that it has been recognized as a 2021-22 Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished School. It is one of just 282 schools across the U.S. to receive this honor for providing broad access to transformative learning opportunities for students through PLTW Launch.

This year Ryan Intermediate students learned through exploration and discovery in the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM) Lab by becoming hands-on problem solvers while collaborating with classmates. Through Programming and Patterns, students and staff explored control structures with coding such as events, loops, and conditional block-based programming. They were able to expand their computational thinking about how programs work and their applications within a computer.

The PLTW Distinguished School recognition honors schools committed to increasing student access, engagement, and achievement in their PLTW programs. To be eligible for the designation, Ryan Intermediate had to have at least 75 percent of the student body participating in at least one PLTW Launch module and had to offer at least one PLTW Launch module in each grade (K-5) during the 2021-22 school year.

"We are honored to recognize Ryan Intermediate for their unwavering commitment to provide students with an excellent educational experience despite the last two years having been some of the most challenging in recent history for students and educators across the U.S. due to the COVID-19 pandemic," said Dr. David Dimmett, Interim President and CEO of PLTW. "Ryan Intermediate should be very proud of their achievements in unlocking their students' potential and equipping them with the knowledge and skills necessary to thrive in life beyond the classroom no matter what career path they choose."

PLTW also honored Gull Lake Middle School for its fourth consecutive year of Distinguished School Status, one of only 134 schools in the nation.

Congratulations to our Scholarship Winners


