Before signing the pledge sheet, please take time to read the Athletic Code. Below is a condensed version of the Athletic Code. Please see Student Handbook for complete explanation. *Athletic Code is in effect and enforced year-round.*

Athletic Code (abbreviated version)

- I. **Academics:** All athletes, grades 7-12, will be expected to do passing work. Passing will be determined in each class at the grade reporting time periods. Please see Student Handbook for complete reference to Academic eligibility for mid-term, quarter, and semester reference.
 - A. Any student on the ineligible list shall be ineligible for a period not less than 15 consecutive days. Special consideration may be given by the administration to students with exceptional difficulties. (Special Note: For Term 1, the period of ineligibility will be the lesser of (1) 21 consecutive calendar days beginning with the date of earliest allowed competition in a sport or (2) one-third of the maximum number of games/meets allowed in a sport (rounded up if one-third results in a fraction.)
 - B. Any student who is on the midterm ineligible list will be ineligible for competition or performances until he/she is at a passing level in the class or classes.
 - C. Any Middle School or High School athlete receiving more than one "F" shall be ineligible until the next grading period.
 - D. Any Middle School or High School athlete receiving an "incomplete" will be allowed to participate & compete for 5 days in which school is in session to allow them time to bring the grade to passing. If after 5 days the student's work remains incomplete, they will be ineligible for a period not less than 10 consecutive days in which school is in session.

- II. **Drug, Tobacco or Alcohol Use, Possession or Distribution:** An athlete shall be subject to disciplinary action at any time for violations involving (a) the use, possession, buying or selling of alcoholic beverages, tobacco, any controlled or any performance enhancing substance as defined by law; (b) attendance at events/parties where drugs and/or alcohol are being illegally consumed or used, and (c) flagrantly violating School Board Policy on "Students Rights and Responsibilities".
****TRAINING VIOLATIONS ARE CUMULATIVE OVER A FOUR-YEAR PERIOD.****
 - A. First violation: the athlete shall lose eligibility for the next 4 weeks or 4 (interscholastic) events in which the athlete is a participant, whichever is greater. (Reduction of penalty available through S.A.P.--see complete Code.)
 - B. Second violation: the athlete shall lose eligibility for the next 8 weeks or 8 (interscholastic) events in which the athlete is a participant, whichever is greater. (Reduction of penalty available through S.A.P.--see complete Code.)
 - C. Third & subsequent violations: the athlete shall lose eligibility for one year from the date of the violation. (Reduction of penalty available through S.A.P.--see complete Code.)

- III. **Attendance:** All athletes must be in a full day of attendance to be able to participate in practice or game/event on that day. **Athletes marked as "Personal" for more than half the scheduled school day may not participate that day.** The only exceptions to this requirement are: legitimate medically excused absences not to exceed one-half day; family emergency; or administrative approval. **An athlete shall be in attendance the full day after a performance and/or competition unless there are extenuating circumstances as determined by the principal.**
 - A. First violation: a warning.
 - B. Second & subsequent violations: the athlete will forfeit one performance and/or competition for each infraction.
 - C. An athlete shall forfeit one performance and/or competition for each day, or part of a day, he/she is found to be truant.
 - D. An athlete shall forfeit one performance and/or competition for each offense resulting in either an in-school or out-of-school suspension.

- IV. **General Conduct:** Any student who is involved in any conduct unbecoming an athlete contrary to the ideals, principles and standards of this school and the W.I.A.A. will be referred to the Athletic Director and/or Principal for action.
 - A. **Unsportsmanlike Conduct and Other Unacceptable Behavior** not specifically covered in the Athletic Code, but which are contrary to the spirit of the Athletic Code, are subject to an appropriate penalty at the discretion of the Athletic Director and/or the Principal, taking into consideration the seriousness of the offense, any harm or injury to person or property, the remorse of the athlete and any other relevant factors.
 - B. **Unlawful or Delinquent Behavior** is a violation of any civil or criminal statute, ordinance, regulation or court order (except for minor traffic offenses). The penalty shall be ineligibility for participation in athletics for one to eight weeks or games, and the amount of the suspension will be determined by a panel including the Principal, Athletic Director, a head coach and any other pertinent representatives based on the type and severity of the violation.

INSURANCE INFORMATION

The Gale-Ettrick-Trempealeau School District does not insure students for injuries sustained while participating in extracurricular activities. Parents may acquire information about purchasing a minimal insurance coverage plan through the District Office. The Board of Education recommends that all students participating in interscholastic sports be insured before they begin practice.
