Online Verification It is time for families to complete online verification for the start of the school year! We look forward to welcoming students back in just a few days and these are some important back-to-

school steps for our families as they get ready. These forms include permission forms, health history review, and a medication

permission form. There is also an athletic packet for secondary students.

SMSD families can verify enrollment by following these steps:

- Visit smsd.org.
- In the top navigation bar, click on "Skyward" and log in to your account.
- Under "Home" you will see "2022-2023 Student Annual Online Verification."

There you will find directions that walk you through the entire process. If you do not have an account yet, or if you have questions, you may contact your child's school office after July 26, 2022 to inquire about setting up account access. Click here to find your school, and click on the school link for contact information at the bottom of the school website. If you are unsure what school your child will attend, click here to use our school finder or view boundary maps.

Free and Reduced Lunch Families are also encouraged to complete an application for free or reduced priced meals as part of online verification. Over the last few years, federal school meal waivers made free meals for all students possible. Congress has not extended that provision for this school year. Filling out the application can benefit families in multiple ways. For qualifying families, it can mean increased state and federal funds for staff and resources at your child's school, certain types of reduced fees, and free or reduced-price meals.

**Service Free and Reduced** web page. Families who are directly certified are encouraged to complete a Consent for Disclosure form in <a href="Skyward">Skyward</a> which gives SMSD Food Service permission to share a child's eligibility status information with the programs families designate on the consent form.
