


Health Education provides students with the knowledge and skills they need to be healthy throughout their lifetime. The intent of a comprehensive health education program is to motivate students to maintain and improve their health, prevent disease, and avoid or reduce health related risk behaviors.

Comprehensive health education addresses 14 component areas under Florida State Statute [1003.42](#) (2)(n) Required Instruction:

K-12

- Community Health
- Consumer Health
- Environmental Health
- Family Life
- Mental and Emotional Health
- Injury Prevention and Safety
- Nutrition
- Personal health
- Prevention and Control of Disease
- Substance Use and Abuse
- Prevention of child abuse, Exploitation, and Human Trafficking

State Statute 1003.42 **Required Instruction**

(n)1. Comprehensive age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate K-12 health education that addresses concepts of community health, consumer health, environmental health, and family life, including:

- a. Mental and emotional health.
- b. Injury prevention and safety.
- c. Internet safety.
- d. Nutrition.
- e. Personal health.
- f. Prevention and control of disease.
- g. Substance use and abuse.
- h. Prevention of child sexual abuse, exploitation, and human trafficking.

2. The health education curriculum for students in grades 7 through 12 shall include a teen dating violence and abuse component that includes, but is not limited to, the definition of dating violence and abuse, the warning signs of dating violence and abusive behavior, the characteristics of healthy relationships, measures to prevent and stop dating violence and abuse, and community resources available to victims of dating violence and abuse.

3. The health education curriculum for students in grades 6 through 12 shall include an awareness of the benefits of sexual abstinence as the expected standard and the consequences of teenage pregnancy.

HB 545 (2021) Parents' Bill of Rights

184 (d) Procedures, pursuant to s. 1002.20(3)(d), for a parent
185 to withdraw his or her minor child from any portion of the
186 school district's comprehensive health education required under
187 s. 1003.42(2)(n) that relates to sex education or instruction in
188 acquired immune deficiency syndrome education or any instruction
189 regarding sexuality if the parent provides a written objection
190 to his or her minor child's participation. Such procedures must
191 provide for a parent to be notified in advance of such course
192 content so that he or she may withdraw his or her minor child
193 from those portions of the course.

HB 241 (2021) Reproductive Health and Disease Education

31 (d) Reproductive health and disease education.—A public
32 school student whose parent makes written request to the school
33 principal shall be exempted from the teaching of reproductive
34 health or any disease, including HIV/AIDS, in accordance with
35 ~~the provisions of s. 1003.42 (3)~~. Each school district shall, on
36 the district's website homepage, notify parents of this right
37 and the process to request an exemption. The homepage must
38 include a link for a student's parent to access and review the
39 instructional materials, as defined in s. 1006.29(2), used to
40 teach the curriculum.



HB 241 (2021) Reproductive Health and Disease Education

55 (b) All instructional materials, as defined in s.
56 1006.29(2), used to teach reproductive health or any disease,
57 including HIV/AIDS, its symptoms, development, and treatment, as
58 part of the courses referenced in subsection (3), must be
59 annually approved by a district school board in an open, noticed
60 public meeting.

61 (3) Any student whose parent makes written request to the
62 school principal shall be exempted from the teaching of
63 reproductive health or any disease, including HIV/AIDS, its
64 symptoms, development, and treatment. A student so exempted may
65 not be penalized by reason of that exemption. Course
66 descriptions for comprehensive health education shall not
67 interfere with the local determination of appropriate curriculum
68 which reflects local values and concerns. Each school district
69 shall, on the district's website homepage, notify parents of
70 this right and the process to request an exemption. The homepage
71 must include a link for a student's parent to access and review
72 the instructional materials, as defined in s. 1006.29(2), used
73 to teach the curriculum.

84 (b) Provide a process for public review of, public comment
85 on, and the adoption of instructional materials, including
86 instructional materials used to teach reproductive health or any
87 disease, including HIV/AIDS, under ss. 1003.42(3) and 1003.46,
88 which ~~that~~ satisfies the requirements of s. 1006.283(2) (b) 8.,
89 9., and 11.

90 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021.




