

ARAMARK wants to make your students' breakfast and lunch an enjoyable and nutritious experience. This brochure will guide you through the food service policies and procedures at Keeneyville District 20.

Payment for Meals

Cash or Check:

You can deposit money on your child's account by sending a cash or check (made payable to Community Unit District 2D) to school. We will deposit the funds to your child's account.

Place payments in a sealed envelope with your student's name and grade listed on the outside of the envelope. Please ensure that a contact number is included on the front of all checks submitted as payment.

Food & Fees (SFA) | Keeneyville ESD 2D (revtrak.net)

Take advantage of District 20's online purchasing system. It makes providing for your child's breakfast and lunch easy. Your child's account balance is completely maintained in the system, including cash on account and purchase history.

** Typically posts to student account within 24 hours, but can take longer due to external factors.**

A la Carte Pricing

A complete a la carte price list is available in each cafeteria. A wide variety of a la carte items are at the secondary schools with a minimum selection at the elementary locations including milk and second portions. A la carte items <u>cannot be charged</u> to a student account. All items must be paid in full at the time of service with either a cash payment or through the student account.

Meal Prices

2022-2023 School Year:

Student Paid Breakfast: \$ 1.80 Student Reduced Breakfast: \$.30

Student Paid Lunch: \$ 3.20 Student Reduced Lunch: \$.40

A la Carte Milk: \$.90 per carton

Free and Reduced-Priced Meals

If you are the parent of a student who participates in free or reduced priced meals, or think you may be eligible, please contact your school office to find out how to apply. You MUST reapply at the beginning of each school year, as the prior year's application is only valid for the first 30 days of school. If your circumstances change, you may apply at any time during the school year for financial consideration. Contact the district business office at (630) 894-2250 for additional details.

Charging of Meals

Per the Hunger-Free Students Bill of Rights, students will be allowed to choose a full breakfast and/or lunch (including choice of entrée, fruit, vegetable, grain, and milk) regardless of whether the student has the ability to pay or has a negative student balance on their meal account.

Meals are considered full reimbursable meals and will continue to be debited from the student's meal account.
Unpaid student accounts, including student fee accounts and student meal accounts, are subject to collections.

Please note that ala carte items including single cartons of milk, may not be charged to a student's account under any circumstances.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is "Offer Versus Serve?"

Under the "Offer Versus Serve" provision, Public Law 97-35 "Offer Verses Serve" allows a student to make food choices from a selection of food items on the cafeteria serving line. Research studies have shown that allowing students to make their own choices has reduced waste, increased participation, and increased the consumption of fruits, vegetables, and grains.

How does the Office of Food Services determine the portion size served in each meal?

When menu planning takes place, the USDA requires that all planned meals meet the nutritional requirements for the highest grade level served in a building. For example, a school servicing grades K-5 will have meals served to meet the nutritional requirements of a fifth grader. Meals are based upon the appropriate calories, nutrient requirements, vitamins, minerals, sugar, and fat restrictions. Because Keeneyville District 2D participates in the National School Breakfast and Lunch Programs, these regulations must be closely adhered to by the Office of Food Services.

What if my child has a special dietary need?

You must provide the school nurse with a doctor's statement of need for care. The school nurse will then provide a copy of the doctor's statement to the Office of Food Services.

Arrangements will be made to reasonably accommodate the student's special dietary needs.
