#### Wrestling and Volleyball are in full swing!

We're excited to continue our athletic success and have 50 wrestlers and over 120 volleyball players participating this season. We're mixing it up in wrestling this season and competing against the IEML. These schools include: Newport, Colville, Deer Park, Lakeside, Riverside, and Medical Lake. Northwood is looking forward to hosting three different meets, including our final competition versus our district rivals, Highland & Mountainside. Our volleyball teams will compete in the GSL, which includes: Salk, Chase, Sacajawea, Garry, Shaw, and Glover. The final volleyball tournament for 8th grade will be held at Highland, our brand new middle school, at the end of the season. GO HUSKIES!

#### COVID Testing for Basketball - 2022

Basketball is considered a high contact indoor sport. Athletes that are vaccinated do not have to undergo testing unless a positive case has been identified on their team. Unvaccinated athletes will need to be tested 2x per week to participate in basketball. Test will take place before school from 7:15-8:00am. It would be very helpful if you are able to drop your athlete off during that time period. If they must take the bus, they will need to report to room 142 as soon as they get off of the bus.

In order to be tested, ALL athletes must have testing registration and a consent form complete. The form can be found on the district COVID Testing website. A link will be sent out via email through FamilyID. Please make sure this is completed prior to the start of the season.

#### 7th BASKETBALL Starts After Winter Break - Registration is Open

Please register your student-athlete on FamilyID, which is found under the "Activities" tab on our website. Our registration numbers determine our game/practice schedules, coaching positions, and how we can utilize our facilities.

Athletes with incomplete paperwork or unpaid fees two school days prior to the start of the season WILL NOT be able to begin practice until completed and could lose the ability to participate for a portion or all of the season.

If your child does not have a physical (good for 2 years), please get it scheduled & provide a copy to the Northwood Business Office before the first day of practice.

Fees include: ASB \$15 & Participation \$35. Fees can be paid at the business office or online through TouchBase, which can be found on the "Quick Links" under the "Our School" tab.

#### After School Activity Buses Must Be Reserved

Activity buses will be available for athletes that need a ride after practices. Pick-up time at Northwood will be at 5:00pm. All athletes must wear a mask. Failure to comply or other misconduct wi


