

Future Ready Work Immersion Program at PaTTAN 2023-2024 Program Profile

Description

The Future Ready Work Immersion Program focuses on helping young adults with disabilities make a successful transition from school to a productive adult life. This unique immersion program serves students with disabilities who are over the age of 18 and looking for competitive or supported employment opportunities. Each student receives classroom instruction and hands-on experience through internships that are determined from assessments upon entry into the program. Through their work immersion experiences, students also develop employability, social, and independent living skills. The goal of the program is to have students transition to their adult lives with stable employment as quickly as they are able, exiting from school as deemed appropriate determined by the IEP team.

Placement Criteria

- Future Ready serves students with disabilities who are at least 18 years of age, have an IEP, and have transitional goals of competitive or supported employment. The most important criterion for acceptance into Future Ready is a desire to achieve employment.
- Participation is limited to up to 12 students per year. In order to be considered for the program, students must be referred by their home district, meet all eligibility requirements, and have a desire to find employment.

Exit Criteria

• This is a program for students who are in their final year of school. All successful participants will graduate upon completion of their identified transition plan that includes stable, competitive or supported employment.
