Basic Allowance for Subsistence (BAS):

- If you are authorized to mess separately, you'll receive approx. \$372 per month tax free

Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH):

- If authorized to reside off base, you'll receive a tax free housing allowance each month. Amount may increase based on marital status and local housing costs

In the Air Force, your pay increases in three different ways:

1. Annual Cost of Living (Pay raise the 1st of each calendar year)
2. Promotion (Based on individual merit & qualification requirements)
3. Seniority (Based on total years of active service)

You'll also save money through other saving entitlements:

3. Low Cost Recreational Facilities
4. Clothing Authorization
5. Low Cost Life Insurance
6. Retirement Plan

AIR FORCE EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

If you're interested in higher education, the Air Force has a number of In-Service programs to help you reach your goals. The following are some of the Educational Programs available in the Air Force.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF THE AIR FORCE (CCAF)

The Community College of the Air Force is an avenue open for all Enlisted members to advance their education by earning an Associate in Applied Science degree directly corresponding to their Air Force job. The college is regionally accredited.

The Community College of the Air Force enables Enlisted members to earn a college degree while they are still in uniform. The CCAF, along with the US Air Force Academy and other military academies, is a federally chartered, accredited degree granting institution. CCAF is the only institution in the armed services that awards an Associate's Degree to Enlisted personnel. It is also the world's largest community college. Through CCAF, all Airmen receive college credit for their technical training, which they can supplement by taking college courses while off duty. CCAF documents your training and education with an official transcript and affords you the opportunity to obtain an Associate's Degree.

The Community College of the Air Force's accreditation is reaffirmed by the Commission of Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. More than 150,000 personnel have earned a CCAF Associate in Applied Science degree.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

When Air Force members register for off-duty courses at an accredited college or university on or off base, the Air Force pays up to 100% of the tuition. The member pays only the cost of books and supplies.

COLLEGE CREDIT BY EXAMINATION

This testing program offers the opportunity to gain college credits by examination at NO COST to active duty personnel. Civilians and dependents are charged a fee. DANTEs offers Subject Standardized Tests, CLEP General, and CLEP Subject Exams. Individual's can earn 3-12 college credits for each exam successfully passed. A maximum of 30 semester hours of degree-applicable examination credit may be applied to satisfy degree requirements.

MONTGOMERY G.I. BILL

Automatically enrolled upon enlisting in the Air Force. Non contributory. More than \$83,000 is available for education after 3 years of active duty service and is available for your use up to 15 years after separation from the Air Force. Transferable to dependent spouses and children.

AIRMEN EDUCATION & COMMISSIONING PROGRAM (AACP)

The Airman Education and Commissioning Program (AACP) offers active duty enlisted personnel the opportunity to earn a commission while completing their bachelor's degree. Student will attend Officer Training School (OTS) upon completion of their bachelor's degree. Those selected for AACP remain on active duty and are assigned to an Air Force ROTC detachment. Their duty is to attend school as a full-time college student (to include summer terms). In addition to full pay and benefits, AACP cadets are provided with a tuition/fees scholarship of up to \$15,000 per year and an annual textbook allowance of \$600. AACP cadets may participate in the program for 2-3 years, depending on their major, prior academic preparation, and age limitations.

AIRMEN SCHOLARSHIP & COMMISSIONING PROGRAM (ASCP)

The Airman Scholarship and Commissioning Program (ASCP) offers active duty enlisted personnel the opportunity to earn a commission while completing their bachelor's degree as an Air Force ROTC cadet. Those selected join an Air Force ROTC detachment and become a full-time college student. The Air Force provides them with a tuition/fees scholarship of up to \$15,000 per year, an annual textbook allowance of \$600, and a monthly nontaxable stipend of \$250-\$400. This scholarship will be awarded for 2 to 4 years. Airmen with some or no college credit may apply. Scholarships are awarded in a variety of fields.
