Foreign Language Course Options

At Malden Catholic, we provide three language offerings – **Spanish, Latin and Italian**. **Latin** and **Italian** are only offered at the Honors level, which is generally for students whose HSPT entrance test profiles in Verbal and in Language Skills are at the 50th %ile or above. **Spanish**, however, is offered at all three levels, Honors, Accelerated and College Preparatory. Any choice of language, taken as a three-year program, will fulfill our foreign language requirement.

All three language studies will incorporate an introduction to rich language, culture, history, geography, literature, and the arts. Integrating all four-language skills (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) will develop basic proficiency competencies, either simply as exposure to a modern Romance language form of expression and the critical thinking skills within or as a foundation for continued study. Students will have many opportunities to utilize the target language in a wide range of activities.

If your son or daughter had a 7th or 8th grade Spanish language-based full-year course meeting two to five times a week, then he/she is eligible to take a placement test for Spanish 2.

Placement testing for Math and Spanish will take place on May 3rd or May 5th. More information will be available if your child is eligible.

Dress Code – Boys Division

We have made our dress code consistent and complementary to our educational goals. We trust that it best serves the image of Malden Catholic and our students. It is our belief that an important part of the educational experience requires a student's attention to his personal appearance. We also maintain that our students should understand the meaning of situation-appropriate attire. Therefore, neatness and cleanliness are the prevailing considerations.

Students are required to be in dress code during the entire school day, and when they are conducting official school business.

PANTS: Chino, "Docker-type" pants or dress corduroy only. Pants must be khaki, navy, or grey, free of designs or embroidery work. No jean styles, cargo or painter's pants, no cut or altered pants. Pants with drawstring waist or banded/elastic cuffs are not allowed.

BELTS: Leather belts in black or brown or the MC-monogrammed belt must be worn. No suspenders.



MC Monogrammed Belt

SHIRTS: An MC-monogrammed solid color, long or short sleeve, button-down Oxford shirt or an MC-monogrammed polo shirt, purchased only from the MC's online apparel store. Shirts must be buttoned up to (but not including) the top button and must be tucked neatly in one's pants. All students are required to own one Navy blue MC polo shirt.

MC LOGO APPAREL: MC logo apparel only may be worn over a regulation MC shirt. No other fleece or apparel is authorized. Turtleneck shirts may be worn underneath a regulation MC shirt. Students may not wear "overshirts" or long-sleeved T-shirts under short sleeve MC shirts. MC ¼ Zip Pullover may be worn over an MC Polo shirt. Winter coats are not allowed.

FOOTWEAR: Shoes or sneakers and socks are to be worn at all times. Students may not wear slippers, moccasins, or sandals. All shoes must be tied. Students may wear hiking boots during cold or inclement weather provided they are worn inside the pants and laced up.

Dress Code – Boys Division

PERSONAL APPEARANCE: Students must be clean-shaven at all times. Hair is to be neatly trimmed on all sides with the length not to exceed the top of the collar in the back and the eyebrows in the front. There are to be no ponytails, no mullets, nor are there to be any designs shaved into the head. Hair length, style, color, or cuts that present an unkempt, ostentatious appearance, or that reflect poorly on the school will not be tolerated. Students will be given a day to make the correction or face disciplinary action including suspension. Sideburns must be no longer than the bottom of the ear. No extreme hair styles or hair colors. Jewelry of any kind around the neck or wrist is limited to small chains.

- Earrings and body piercing are not allowed (covered or uncovered).
- Shell, rope, and large chain-type necklaces and bracelets are not to be worn.
- Head coverings of any kind shall not be worn in the building at any time during or after school hours, or at any school function.
- Tattoos and body scarring are highly discouraged. Any student with a previously existing tattoo must cover it at all times during the school day, and at all school-sanctioned activities.

PROVISIONAL DRESS CODE:

Liturgies, Funerals, Semi-Formal and Other Events: All students must wear *dress shoes* (no boots or sneakers), *plain white dress shirts*, *khaki pants*, and *Malden Catholic ties* when the school community gathers for school wide liturgies or other occasions as announced by the Administration. Malden Catholic ties can be purchased from the MC uniform store, [Collegiate House](#). When attending school funerals or wakes or other occasions announced by the Administration students are expected to be attired in dress pants, dress shirt, tie and sport coat. Students are expected to be similarly attired at other formal events as announced by the Administration.



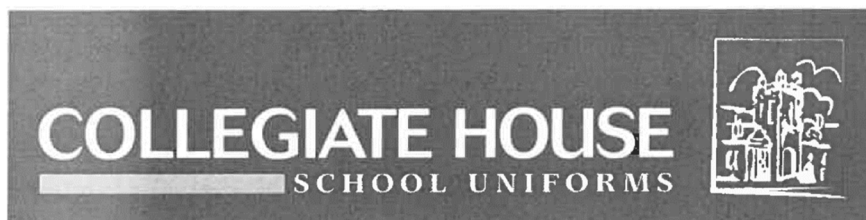

It is our belief that an important part of the educational experience requires a student's attention to her personal appearance. We also maintain that our students should understand the meaning of situation-appropriate attire. Therefore, neatness and cleanliness are the prevailing considerations.

Students are required to be in dress code during the entire school day, and when they are conducting official school business.

PANTS: Grey, navy, or khaki-colored pants only. Pants must be free of designs or embroidery work. No jean styles, cargo, yoga, or painter's pants, no cut or altered pants. Pants are required to have a button on the waist band and a zipper. Pants with drawstring waist or banded/elastic cuffs are not allowed.

SHIRTS: An MC-monogrammed navy or grey polo shirt, purchased only from the MC uniform store may be worn. A white button-down oxford/dress shirt may also be worn under an MC monogrammed sweater. All students are required to own one Navy blue MC polo shirt.

MC LOGO APPAREL: MC logo apparel only may be worn over a regulation MC shirt. No other fleece or apparel is authorized. Turtleneck shirts may be worn underneath a regulation MC shirt. Students may not wear "overshirts" or long-sleeved T-shirts under short sleeve shirts. Hooded sweatshirts and hooded jackets are not allowed. Winter coats are not allowed.

FOOTWEAR: Boat shoes, flats or low-cut sneakers and socks are to be worn at all times. Students may not wear heels, slippers, moccasins, sandals or open toe shoes. All shoes with laces must be tied. Students may wear boots during cold or inclement weather provided they are neat.

Dress Code – Girls Division

PERSONAL APPEARANCE: Hair must be neatly groomed and of natural color. Final judgment about what constitutes “natural color” lies with the administration. Students will be given a day to make the correction or face disciplinary action including suspension. No extreme hair styles or hair colors.

- Visible body piercing other than pierced ears, including tongue and nose piercing, is not allowed.
- Head coverings of any kind shall not be worn in the building at any time during or after school hours, or at any school function.
- Tattoos and body scarring are highly discouraged. Any student with a previously existing tattoo must cover it at all times during the school day, and at all school-sanctioned activities.

PROVISIONAL DRESS CODE:

Liturgies, Funerals, Semi-Formal and Other Events: Girls must wear dress shoes (no boots or sneakers), plain white dress shirts, khaki color pants or kilts, and Malden Catholic V-Neck pullover sweater when the school community gathers for school-wide liturgies or other occasions as announced by the Administration. Summer Reading 2022

WHY READ DURING THE SUMMER?

To keep your skills sharp... It's good for you!

University of Tennessee, Knoxville, faculty members Richard Allington and Anne McGill-Franzen completed in 2010 a three-year study showing a significantly higher level of reading achievement in students who did summer reading. They found that children who do not read in the summer lose two to three months of reading development while kids who do read tend to gain a month of reading proficiency.

Research shows that reading just twenty minutes a day drastically improves school performance, vocabulary, thinking skills and reading skills. Research also demonstrates that choice makes a very important contribution to achievement, so we will allow you a choice within a limited range of books.

Below you will find the necessary information for your summer reading assignment. This summer, the Theology Department is leading the program.

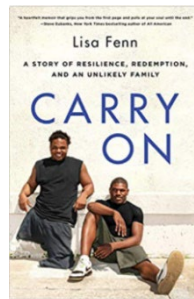

2. IDENTIFY A SPIRITUAL VALUE AS A THEME IN THE BOOK

A theme is a central, unifying idea that that helps the reader to understand something about themselves and their world through the reading experience. This year, we are asking you to choose **one** of the Five Spiritual Values of Malden Catholic High School and the Xaverian Brothers and think about how that value is demonstrated as a theme in this book.

The Five Spiritual Values you may choose from are:

Simplicity – simplicity calls us to focus on what truly matters most in our lives: family, faith, friends, and the common good of humanity. Simplicity frees our hearts and minds to choose good and work for justice.

Humility – humility is the recognition that God is the source of all good things in our lives. Zeal empowers us to have an intense passion for bringing about the more abundant life that Jesus proclaimed. The value of zeal helps us to recognize that special things are only achieved with hard work, effort, and commitment.

 - **Provide** an overview of the book's content, which includes the main characters, the main conflict, and the resolution to the problem faced by the main characters (no more than 1-2 paragraphs).
 - **Select** one of the Five Spiritual Values listed and described above and **explain** how the book illustrates the spiritual value that you selected. **Make clear** which value you choose, and use at least 4 direct quotations or examples, with the page numbers from the text, to support your choice.
 - Finish your essay by **briefly explaining how** this book has helped you better understand the spiritual value you chose, *and* how you are looking forward to living out this value at Malden Catholic this year.

- Your Reflection Essay is due on the Friday of the first week of school to your Theology teacher.
- Your grade for the summer reading assignment will go into the gradebook as a 1st Quarter test grade for your Theology class.

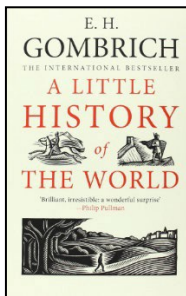
Summer Reading Assignment - AP World History



MIAA Medical Requirements for Athletes

As per the MIAA Rules and Regulations Governing Athletics [July 1, 2021 – Jun 20, 2023](#);

56. **Student Eligibility Coverage/School Requirements: Physical Examinations/Medical Coverage/Concussions**

- 56.1 All students must pass a physical examination prior to participation in High School Athletics. **A physical exam covers the student for 13 months from the exam date.** A student's eligibility will terminate once a physical has reached the 13-month limit.

Physical examinations must be performed by a duly registered Licensed Physician, Physician Assistant or Nurse Practitioner. The Sports Medicine Committee recommended physical examination form is in MIAA Members Only Fillable Forms.

- 56.1.3 All students are required to take the on-line National Federation Concussion Course or other MA Department of Public Health recognized education program following regulations as put forth by the Department of Public Health in regard to the Concussion Law and can be found at <https://www.mass.gov/service-details/statewide-sports-concussion-initiative-ma-law-and-department-of-public-health>.

Concussion Education Summer Requirement

As you know, recent research on head trauma has underscored the need for general awareness of safe practices following head injury. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Public Health now requires that all students participating in any activity including gym class, intramural sports, and athletics must learn about the consequences of head injury and concussion through on-line training programs and written materials. Since head injury can happen outside of athletics, too, we want all students to be informed through the taking of a short, free on-line summer course.

To help ensure the safety of all Malden Catholic students, we are requiring that all students this summer must complete a free online course and return a certificate of completion to the School Nurse. The certificate will be generated automatically at completion of the course. The program is brief, taking only about 20 minutes. (Parents might benefit from viewing the course, too!)

Students will bring the certificate of completion to their August Orientation, unless they are Fall athletes, in which case they will be required to submit their certificate on the first day of practice in order to participate.

The school nurse will see ailing students and determine whether to treat them or to send them home. The nurse will dispense prescribed medication during the day to any student under a doctor's care. Such medication should be accompanied by a doctor's medication order and be in a labeled prescription bottle. (Medication should be kept in the Health Office and not on one's person or in one's locker.)

Additionally, in the event we cannot contact you immediately, we need your permission to administer emergency treatment to your child, and/or to arrange for the transportation of your child to any acute emergency facility. Once at that facility, they may provide treatment that may be medically necessary. All of this is with the understanding that every effort will be made to contact you before a transfer.

Student Technology

Student-Provided:

- **Windows 10/11 Laptops**

All students are required to bring their own [Windows 10/11 laptop](#). Other devices such as MacBooks, Chromebooks and iPads are not allowed as some courses require the use of software that will only run on a Windows-based computer.

MC-Provided:

- **Wireless Network**

Malden Catholic's wireless network is comprised of over seventy-five 802.11ac wireless access points distributed throughout the school building, including one per classroom. This summer, MC will be upgrading our wired and wireless networks. As part of this work, we will be installing state-of-the-art 6E wireless access points that will support next-generation Wi-Fi with software programmable radios supporting 5 and 6 GHz concurrently.

Students must register their Windows 10/11 laptops in order to access and use MC's wireless network. Registration instructions will be emailed to students this summer.

- **Internet Access**

Students will be able to access the Internet using their registered Windows 10/11 laptops on MC's wireless network. All inbound and outbound Internet traffic is inspected by a perimeter firewall that protects MC's wireless and wired networks and connected devices from attacks, malware, and other web-based threats. Additionally, since Malden Catholic receives partial reimbursement for our Internet Access from the FCC via their Schools and Libraries E-Rate program, our firewall also has web filtering in place to ensure that Malden Catholic provides all students with [CIPA-Compliant](#) Internet Access.

- **Microsoft 365**

All Malden Catholic students have Microsoft 365 accounts which provides them with access to online services such as OneDrive (cloud storage up to 1 TB), Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, Outlook, etc.

Important note: You do not need to purchase Microsoft Office. As part of our license agreement with Microsoft, all students can download and install the latest version of Microsoft Office onto their laptops at no cost.

- **G Suite for Education**

All Malden Catholic students will also have Google's G Suite for Education accounts which provides them with access to online services such as Google Drive (unlimited cloud storage), Docs, Sheets, Slides, Classroom, etc.

- **[Sophos Endpoint Advanced with Intercept X](#)**

Malden Catholic provides each student with a copy of Sophos Endpoint Advanced with Intercept X that must be installed on the student's laptop before the laptop can be used on Malden Catholic's wireless network. This endpoint protection software is integrated with Malden Catholic's Sophos firewall to provide comprehensive protection of all computing resources utilized at Malden Catholic.

Student Technology

- **MC Email Addresses**

All active students are provisioned with their own @maldencatholic.org email address that they are to use for academic purposes and when communicating with MC Faculty and Staff.

- **Single Sign-On (SSO) Credentials**

Incoming students will be assigned their own single sign-on credentials that will consist of a user ID (MC Email Address) and a unique one-time password. When students activate their SSO account, they will be prompted to enter their unique one-time password and will then be prompted to enter a complex password that meets the following requirements:

- Must be at least 8 characters
- Cannot be longer than 32 characters
- Cannot contain the student's first and/or last name
- Have at least 1 letter (a, b, c...)
- Have at least 1 number (1, 2, 3...)
- Have at least 1 non-alphanumeric characters (special characters): (~!@#\$%^&* _ - +=`|\(){}[];:"'<>.,?/)
- Include both uppercase and lowercase letters
- Cannot contain only one character (i.e., "111111" or "aaaaaa")
- Cannot contain consecutive characters (i.e., "123456" or "abcdef")

Students will use their SSO credentials to log into both their Microsoft 365 and G Suite for Education accounts. Students will also use the same user ID to log into LancerLink. While students can select their own LancerLink password, it is highly recommended that they use their SSO password. *Fewer things to remember = fewer things to forget.*

- **Second-Factor Authentication**

Malden Catholic has implemented Second-Factor Authentication on our Microsoft 365 Accounts to protect all student, faculty and staff accounts from unauthorized access by off-campus individuals. New students will be sent instructions in July on how to remotely complete the setup of their MC-provided Microsoft 365 accounts. During this process, each student will be asked to provide their cell phone number to complete the setup of Second-Factor Authentication on their account. On a specified interval, remote Microsoft 365 account users will be asked to reauthenticate by entering an authentication code that Microsoft will send to the account holder's cell phone.

- **Classroom Web Portal - LancerLink**

All Malden Catholic students have accounts to access LancerLink. LancerLink is Malden Catholic's classroom web portal which provides real-time integration with teachers' gradebooks, classroom pages (homework, resources, etc.) and student information. Students can view current grades and scores for their classes on interactive dashboards. LancerLink activation instructions for student accounts will be emailed to parents early in July.

Students will use their MC-provided email address to login to their LancerLink accounts.

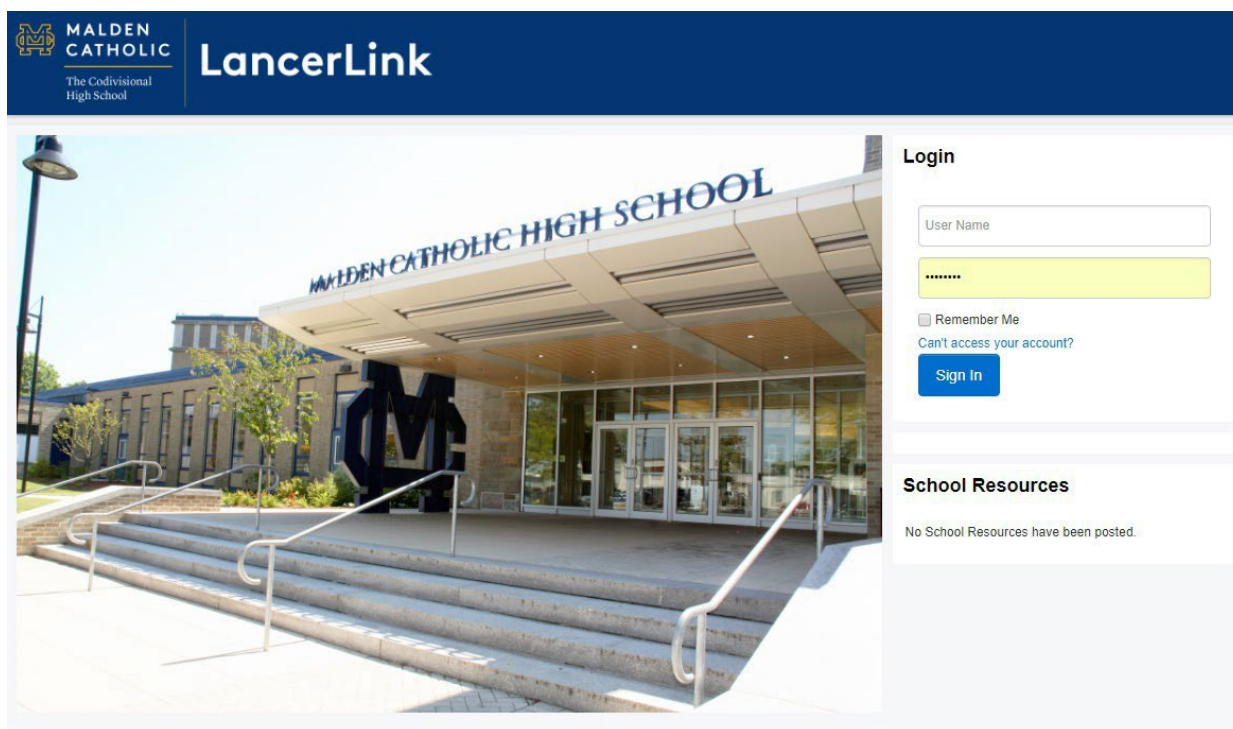

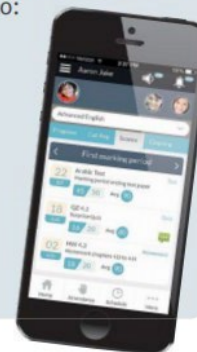

Parent Communications

Parent Email Addresses

Malden Catholic communicates with parents electronically using parent-provided email addresses. To ensure that you receive these communications, it is important that you not only provide us with the email address for at least one parent or guardian, but that you inform the Front Office of any email address changes.

Academic Information

Academic information and communications sent to parents and guardians is primarily delivered via email. Report Cards are emailed within two weeks after an academic quarter has closed. Course schedules are emailed out mid-July and then right before the start of the first and second semesters.

Mass Notification System

Food Account

Malden Catholic's cafeteria is operated by Aramark. Students can purchase breakfast and lunch with cash or by using their prepaid Aramark food account. Parents can choose to load funds to their child's Aramark food account with cash, checks made payable to "Aramark", or electronically by using PaySchools Central.

Aramark's online portal for loading money onto student lunch accounts is now live. Please visit <https://payschoolscentral.com> and follow steps for new user registration to create an account. Families will be asked to use their child's Student ID number generated by Malden Catholic when creating an account for the first time. Please note that credit card loading carries a 4.35% service fee and \$1.50 transaction charge.



Please note that new accounts cannot be setup until late August. Parents will receive an email from Malden Catholic once Aramark has set up all incoming Grade 9 and transfer students with food accounts. Your child's student ID number will be included in that email.
