




All Regents Exams (US Hist & Govt excluded due to cancellation)





- 4 = well qualified
- 3 = qualified
- 2 = possibly qualified
- 1 = no recommendation

Students achieving grade level or above proficiency was 62%.









Students Achieving At/Above Grade Level Diagnostic 1 Through 3












Grade 1 Instructional Reading Levels (Fall to Spring)




Grade 2 Instructional Reading Levels (Fall to Spring)





Grades 1-5 -% Reading At or Above Grade Level (DRA and QRI - Reading Inventory Assessments)






