She went on to ask how our numbers are compared to others in the district? 18-19 school year RES was the lowest number of level 1's in the district. Sub groups performance 11% growth with students with disabilities.

Mrs. Moore-One of the things that when it comes to our subgroups-Every school is in the same category with students with disabilities. Every school has to improve that subgroup. All district schools are also monitoring their african american students. We don't need the fed. Gov. to tell us what we need to improve. We are not satisfied with their growth that is why we set those goals. Some schools are out performing us in science-but in subgroups we are comparable to the district.

Mr. Terry asked about the early warning systems with students and teachers but nothing with parents-How does that impact the parents? What is their involvement with the early warning

systems? There is a team of staff, student services team, that have resources to put together, plans and resources for students and parents to support the student and the family. Mr. Terry is still concerned about telling parents about the early warning systems. Mrs. Doutrick explained the MTSS process and how we involve parents.

Mrs. Soto questioned if we offer a GED program. She would like to see that offered to parents, siblings, to boost their self-esteem, confidence in supporting their children. She questioned if there was a cost, Mr. Lee would get back with her on that.
