



# District Advisory Council (DAC) Report

# APRIL 2022

## Title I and IV Program Monitoring/Evaluation:

- The goal for using Title I funds is to increase the proficiency rate in ELA, Math, and other core content areas, which is measured by the CA Dashboard. Title I funds are not only used at the district level, but also at the school level to support students and staff.
- The funds for Title IV are very small. The purpose of the funds is to have well-rounded educational opportunities, safe and healthy students, and effective use of technology.

## Anti-Bullying:

- The Undercover Antibullying Team process is as follows: 1. Meet with the student; 2. Recruit team; 3. Progress monitor; and 4. Disband and celebrate. Part of this process includes students who are invited to be “undercover” in an exclusive group whose mission is to seek out bullying and to banish it. The students are asked to discuss together the strategies that the team can adopt to help the victim of bullying. The team then uses those strategies, which also assists in changing the bully’s behavior in a safe way without shaming them. This process is affective because it evokes empathy, the team has equal value, there is no blaming or shaming, and students enjoy the feedback.

## SSC Responsibilities Update #3:

- All the School Site Councils (SSC) are currently in the middle of finalizing their site's 22-23 School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA). There should have been or will be a presentation of the draft SPSA. This is a time to provide input and recommendations. The final copy of the 22-23 SPSA is then approved by SSC. The plan is due to Categorical Programs Department on May 6, 2022 to prepare them to be added to the School Board meeting agenda for June.

## Winter Submission (ConAPP):

- The ConAPP is presented to DAC twice a year. The Consolidated Application (ConAPP) is the process that the district takes to notify the state that we intend to apply for certain types of extra funding that is available to help our students and staff. When we apply for this funding, we assure the State that we will abide by all rules, regulations, and guidelines pertaining to the funding. The ConAPP indicates which type of funding the district is applying for, including Title I, Part A for low income and underachieving students; Title II, Part A for preparing, training, and recruiting high quality teachers and principals; Title III, Part A for English Learner student program/Immigrant Student Education; and Title IV, Part A for Student Support and Academic Enrichment, which included technology and social emotional well-being.

## LCAP Annual Update/Educational Partners Feedback:

- The Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) is a three-year plan (2021-2024) that represents the state funding. These funds help supplement the core program. The three LCAP goals are (1) academic achievement (ELA/Math/ELD); (2) school climate/campus environment; and (3) students, parents, and community support.
- More LCAP meetings will be hosted in the month of April and May. The same information will be provided at both meetings.
