




SHARKS

Did you know that New Smyrna Beach is the SHARK BITE CAPITAL OF THE WORLD? Yes, that's right – the world. More bites than South Africa and more than Australia's Great Barrier Reef. We live in an area with an immense amount of biodiversity. Our estuaries are breeding grounds for thousands of aquatic species, and that includes many species of sharks! Some sharks may be a tad more aggressive than others. Sharks like bull sharks, black tip sharks, spinner sharks, etc. have their pups in the lagoon and sometimes these young, inexperienced sharks mistake swimmers and surfers for something other than human. Hence, a bite. For many years, George Burgess, professor emeritus and spokesman for the International Shark Attack File at the University of Florida, insisted that shark attacks are cases of mistaken identity and should be called "bites" not "attacks." He explains that hyperbole often directs humans' feelings and fears surrounding sharks, and since people tend to hate what they fear, sharks fall into the role of "the hated monster." Most people disregard the immense importance sharks play in aquatic ecosystems. Think about it: aquatic camouflage, schooling behavior, and even speed, all arose as self-protective behaviors in response to the top predators—sharks! The fact is, you have a greater chance of winning the lottery or being struck by lightning than you have of being bitten by a shark in the SHARK BITE CAPITAL OF THE WORLD.

Here's the thing... Sharks have a very low fecundity. That means they don't mature quickly and when they do, they don't produce an abundance of offspring (so, say, the opposite of mice). Therefore, they are not a sustainable species to harvest or kill.

And here's the other thing... Most shark species are endangered, overharvested, and misunderstood. But one of our students set out to change that...

Recently, as part of a lesson to conserve and protect our natural resources, Katie Vordenberg began an online petition to protect sharks. The petition is now international, with over 72,000 signatures. Her petition explains the number one issue facing sharks today. Needless to say, having one of our students make such an impact (expanding a school assignment from grassroots to international communities) is quite an accomplishment! As of right now, Katie's petition has reached every continent in the world! Please read the petition and consider adding your name!

Katie Vordenberg started this petition to President of the United States and 21 others.

My goal with this petition is to create awareness about sharks and hopefully create better laws to protect them. More than 100 million sharks are being killed every year for their fins. They have their fins cut off, and are thrown back into the ocean to die slowly. Sharks are needed in the world because they serve a massive part in our ecosystem. They balance out the oceans and remove the weak and the sick. They ensure species diversity. Their disappearance can set off a chain reaction throughout the ocean and even effect the people who are on the shore. Many shark species are being threatened with extinction because they don't have the chance to reproduce quick enough with the amount that are being killed each year. Sharks are "functionally extinct" in one of five of the world's coral reefs. This finning of sharks will affect the environment, and the food chain massively. Keep our sharks safe and in the water where they belong. Every signature helps and is beneficial to helping these magnificent creatures repopulate and get off of the endangered list. It is estimated that by 2040 sharks will be completely extinct. Let's help reverse this and change the world one step at a time. Save the sharks.
