

This year's New Smyrna Beach Youth Council Task Force concluded by presenting their official proposal to the City Council and Mayor on Tuesday May 14th. This year's members, Chairwomen Shelby Balmer, Vice-chairwomen Peyton Zitzka, members Olivia Graeff-Fanelli, Morgan Hibel, and Tahmina Tisha have met biweekly at city hall to develop a plan of action for NSB from the youth perspective. This year the council discussed many topics from population density, economic growth, environmental concerns, and public safety. But ultimately, the YCTF decided to make a proposal on the continue beautification of our city. The official proposal is to ask the city to fund 6 Shark statues (animal was decided on a poll taken at this year's SGA food festival). These statutes would be decorated by local artists and placed on sites along the "NSB loop". The purpose is to add a colorful art to exemplify the city reputation and tradition to the enhance the charm of our city. These statues would serve as markers around the city. The long term goal of the Youth Council Task Forces is for the city to continue erecting these statues; creating a free scavenger hunt type activity for local and tourist families in the future. The Youth Council Task Force is a group of students whom are officially appointed by the local government. As members, these students must abide by state laws that require all meetings to be open to the public and keep official records which can be found on the city website.




