Page 33 - Cut Class	Amended: A Saturday Detention will be issued for the first and second offense (first offense was an administrative detention)
Page 34 - Tardiness to School	Added: Students must arrive by 11:07AM in order to be considered present in school for the day. (was 11:33am, but our half-day schedule changed)
Page 35 - Senior Privilege	Deleted: during a first or last period study hall. (Seniors can leave at any point during the day for senior privilege when they have a study hall)
Page 37 - Honor Roll	Added: Students will make the Honor Roll if all grades in all subjects are 82.5 (B) and above. Honor Roll is published on amsacs.org within three (3) weeks after grades are posted to student and parent PlusPortal accounts. An Incomplete (I) in any course will prevent the student from being included. Student names will not be published if a parent/guardian has opted out of publishing their student's information on the student demographic form sent each school year. (previous honor roll section featured only detail about the B or higher grade requirement)

Page 38 - Incompletes	Timeline adjusted: 15 days (used to be 10 days, that timeframe was deemed too short - wanted to allow students more time to turn in work)
Page 71 - Tech Violations	Clarified: Students violating this policy will be reported to the Administration via referral to the dean's office. Disciplinary action can occur from either the teacher or the dean's office. Students may also lose access to their school computer account. Additional consequences may be included depending on the nature of the infractions.
Page 71 - Upper School Cell Phones	Changed: Students can use their cell phone prior to the first bell at 7:55am or until they enter their first period classroom and after the final bell of the school day at 2:45 pm. Students can be in possession of their phones, but they should not be seen or heard during the school day. Students may not use cell phones during passing time/outside in between classes. (added clarification around cell phone use once the student enters classroom in the morning and during transition time and outdoors)

<p>Page 75 - Dress Down/Spirit Wear</p>	<p>Added:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Pants or skirts must be worn on the hips● Shoulders must be covered● Shirts/tops must sufficiently cover the front, back, and sides of the body. Undergarments and belly/midriff may not show at any time● Shirts may not be tied in the back to be made tighter● Shorts/skirts must have an inseam of at least 4 inches● Clothing should not be overly baggy or droopy● No conspicuous stains, discoloration, fraying, fading, or tears <p>(The above rules have been in the handbook but not specifically repeated in the Dress Down Day section).</p>
