# **College & Career Planning:**

Optional individual junior college planning meetings will begin in early February and be available until the end of the school year. In January you will receive an invitation explaining the process for making the appointment, if you so desire. In the meantime, your student should be utilizing SCOIR, our college planning platform, which is an excellent tool in the college search process. Additionally, SCOIR's YourScience is an excellent resource for career planning. Every student is required to complete the YouScience program and evaluate the results. We encourage you to attend the IA's Financial Aid Night on September 19th at 7pm and the College Admissions Panel in October. We also encourage students to attend the school visits from the college admissions representatives in the fall as well as local college fairs.

## **Standardized Testing:**

This is one of the busiest years for standardized testing. A detailed list of what to expect this year is in the Standardized Testing section of iatoday-Counseling. Please refer to the ideal standardized testing timeline to be informed of what to expect. More information will be sent home detailing information about the October PSAT to be taken at school. All juniors will take a free, college-reportable SAT test during the Michigan Merit Exam testing period in April - no registration will be necessary.

# **IB Requirements:**

Students will continuously work on their IB Courses. Students will work on CAS hours & reflections from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of junior year through March 15<sup>th</sup> of senior year. The CAS Coordinator will provide detailed information to the students regarding how to complete CAS requirements. Students will begin working on the Extended Essay in their CORE course 2nd semester of junior year and will complete it before summer. Please encourage your student to use solid time management and organizational skills to complete these requirements.
