Daily Schedule

Please arrive to VMS with plenty of time to be punctual for homebase.

- Monday, Wednesday Friday: Homebase begins at 8:10 am (arrive so you're ready to engage at 8:10!)
- Tuesday and Thursday: Upper School Homebase begins at **9:00** am (Upper School students can use 8:10 9 am to meet with teachers, to work on homework in or out of the building, or to sleep a bit later!) Be ready to engage by 9 am.
- Student schedules will be available to all students and parents on August 19, via the Veracross Portal.

Students NEW to Vail Mountain School:

We look forward to seeing new students at New Student Orientation for Upper School on
Friday, August 19 at 10 am. At 11 am we will host a BBQ for all new students and their families
in grades K-12. Parents and students new to Vail Mountain School will join us for lunch with the

Orientation Trip and Groups:
