<b>POLICY TOPIC DESCRIPTION</b>
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TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE BOARDS POLICY
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<b>POLICY STATEMENT</b>
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The Pikeville High School Tradition of Excellence Boards will be displayed in the cafeteria of the high school. Awards recognized on the Board of Excellence are statistical leaders from each sport (Football, Volleyball, Boys Basketball, Girls Basketball, Baseball, Softball, Boys and Girls Track, Boys and Girls Tennis, Boys and Girls Cross Country, Boys and Girls Golf, Archery, Boys and Girls Soccer, and Wrestling), Mr. and Mrs. Pike High, Best of the Class, Stephen R. Flanary Memorial Award, National Merit Finalists, Individual State Champions for Governor’s Cup.

Mr. and Mrs. Pike High are chosen by students in grades 9 – 12. A list of every male and female senior is given to students and they vote for one of each that they believe best represents Pikeville High School.

School statistics leaders in various categories (categories chosen by coaches) for each sport will be displayed. Transfer students cannot use statistics gained from another school/team to break a school record. Due to Senate Bill 128, the following will be used to determine school career statistics leaders for each sport. 1. Individual game and season statistics will be eligible for record each year. 2. Spring sports will count all years, including holdback year, due to the loss of the 2020 season except for current 9<sup>th</sup> graders (2020-2021) because they were not at the varsity level when the season was cancelled. 3. The holdback year can only enhance an athlete’s career statistics but cannot take away from his/her statistics for any career records. An example would be if a softball player had 60 hits in a season their first 9<sup>th</sup> grade season but had 62 hits their holdback 9<sup>th</sup> grade season, the 62 hits could count for the career statistics instead of the 60 but not both. Likewise, if a softball player had 62 hits their first 9<sup>th</sup> grade season and 60 hits their holdback 9<sup>th</sup> grade season, the 62 could count for career statistics instead of the 60.

Other accolades posted will be Best of the Class (Valedictorians and Salutatorians – see High School Graduation Policy for selection criteria), Stephen R. Flanary Memorial Award (See Varsity Awards Policy), National Merit Finalists, Individual state champions for Governor’s Cup.
