

From the Superintendent

It feels like summer break began just a couple of weeks ago, while for others, the summer may not have gone by fast enough. Either way, the buses will be rolling, and school will be back in session very soon. Our custodians, building and grounds supervisor, and summer workers have done a tremendous job making our buildings and grounds look great for the coming school year. We cannot wait for our staff, students, parents, and community to see the improvements. As we prepare for the start of a new school year, below are a couple of the projects completed over the summer, as well as some safety updates:

Media Center Upgrades:

Liberty and Heritage Elementary: The library/media centers in each building have been refreshed with new flooring, seating, and tables, transforming them into Innovation Labs. Most of these upgrades were made possible utilizing 21st Century and other grant funds.

All K-5 students will be able to use these Innovation Labs, providing extension and hands-on activities in the areas of Science, Math, and Social Studies. K-5 students will still be able to check out books during their scheduled time of science extension lessons, but many books have been shifted into the classrooms, so students have daily access to more of these valuable resources.

River Valley Middle and High School: The library/media centers have also been upgraded with new flooring and furniture to create an open footprint, allowing for a more inviting space. Teachers claimed some books to build classroom libraries, while books and resources that are regularly checked out will remain in the library/media center. These upgrades were possible using the federal Elementary/Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) grant dollars.



Safety:

Earlier this year, the nation witnessed what unfolded at Robb

Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas. This tragedy is a reminder that the safety of our students, staff, and community is our top priority at River Valley Schools. Stay tuned for an update from River Valley Schools in the coming weeks where we will highlight safety strategies in our schools. As we begin a new school year, we remind all students, parents, staff, and community members to remember the phrase: "See Something, Hear Something, Say Something."

Create a first week of school planner.

Treasurer's Talk

General Fund. Bond Fund. Classroom Facilities Maintenance Fund. Have you ever wondered what these terms mean?

In Ohio, school districts receive funding from the state and local communities. State funding makes up approximately 39% of our revenue, while local community support makes up the remaining 61%. Local revenues come from real estate taxes and the earned income tax levy for residential and commercial property owners in our district. Additionally, we received federal grant funds to help cover unexpected expenses related to COVID-19. This additional funding has allowed us to improve our facilities and increase educational opportunities while also protecting and supporting our students and staff through the pandemic.

At home, we pay our bills through our checking or savings accounts. School districts pay our bills out of something called funds. River Valley has three main funds related to our state and local revenues. These funds are the general fund, classroom facilities maintenance fund, and the bond retirement fund. General fund expenses are for things like instructing students, student support, and transportation. The bond retirement fund is for repaying the bond we used to construct our buildings in 2001. The classroom facilities maintenance fund is connected to the bond and accounts for less than 1% of River Valley's total expenses paid for district-wide building and facilities maintenance.

Did You know that roughly 74% of our general fund expenditure budget is spent on instruction, pupil support and instructional support?

Our bond repayment will conclude in 2023, which means we will no longer have the bond retirement fund or the classroom facilities maintenance fund as revenue streams. To help us plan for this date, we created a capital improvement plan to estimate the annual, as well as long-term, expenses we will incur related to ongoing facilities maintenance projects, technology, furniture and equipment replacement, school bus replacement and any other expenses that will have a useful life of at least five years.

> One of the projects on the capital improvement plan is new roofs for our buildings. As we continue to face frequent leaks and general roofing issues, this project will need to be a priority in the near future. The roofing project alone is estimated to cost over \$3.9 million.

Being fiscally responsible has a direct benefit to our residents and business owners. We are always looking for ways to save money or find creative revenue streams, such as grant funding, to save our taxpayers' money. Over the last few years, district employees have worked diligently to reduce overall expenditures. As a result, our revenues have outpaced expenses for two years in a row. With the continued support of our community and strong fiscal stewardship from our staff, we can continue to expand the opportunities we provide our students, prepare for future large-scale projects, and support our day-to-day expenses.

Did you know that our last school levy passed was our 1% earned income tax in 2019. Prior to that, the last levy was a renewal in 2017

Food Service News

Summer Food Program

Our summer lunch program had another successful year. Although it looked different than in the past couple of years, we were still able to provide over 6,000 delicious and nutritious meals to children in our communities. The Lunch Bunch did a fantastic job balancing the bumps of program restrictions, hot weather, and rainy days and had a blast serving all the kids that came out. Thank you for sharing your summer with us! I also want to send out a heartfelt thank you to all our community partners that came out and provided many fun activities for all our kids. Without you and these activities, a summer program could lose steam very quickly.



Universal Free School Meals Have Ended

The USDA program that has allowed us to serve free meals to all students has officially come to an end. As we begin our 2022-23 school year, I want to be sure everyone realizes we will be charging for school meals. As in the past, we strongly encourage each household to fill out an Education Assistance Application (formerly called free and reduced meal application) as soon as possible. Only those who complete this application and meet the guidelines will be eligible for waived or discounted fees associated with lunches, school fees, and athletic play to participate fees (potential savings of up to \$1650 for one student, depending on the grade and involvement of the student). You can find these applications in the Food Service section on our website (rvk12.org) under Departments, You can also pick up a paper application from any building office, or at any of our Lunch Bunch summer food sites during meal service.

Fresh, Flavorful, & Fun

As our food service department moves towards the more traditional focus of account balances and filling out applications, our cafeteria staff members are determined to make our meals anything but "traditional school meals." We will continue with our fresh-made hot breakfast sandwiches every day for breakfast at the middle and high school, our pop-up iced coffee bar at the high school, and continue our push to provide fresh vegetables and salads in all of our cafeterias. In addition to those, you will see a few new things such as the addition of a new state-of-the-art air frying oven in November, a serve yourself, fresh fruit bar by spring time, some great new recipes that will wow your taste buds, and we can't forget a few tasty treats at dessert time.
