Student Population

The Bolles School is an independent, co-educational day and boarding school founded in 1933. One of the most ethnically and religiously diverse independent schools in the Southeast, Bolles currently enrolls more than 1,750 students in Pre-K through Grade 12 on four separate campuses.

Bolles actively seeks students who represent diverse backgrounds ethnically, culturally, religiously and socio-economically. In fact, Bolles students come from 59 different countries and speak 35 languages. While day students comprise the majority of the student population, the boarding program at Bolles has the capacity for 78 students and currently enrolls students from 25 countries and 12 states. For 2022-23, the School awarded more than 5 million in needbased financial aid to 295 students, not including faculty tuition discounts.

COVID-19 Response

In the spring of 2020, as a response to the COVID-19 crisis, all classes from March 24 to May 15 were conducted remotely through our Schoology platform. Classes were held in accordance with our regular, rotating class schedule with adjustments to class time and homework expectations based on suggested limitations of screen time required for virtual instruction. During the 2020-21 school year, classes began in a hybrid model. From August 13 to October 15, 2020, Bolles students alternated between in-person and virtual synchronous instruction every other day. On October 20, 2020 all students were able to return to daily in-person instruction although they had the option to continue to attend classes virtually through the remainder of the 2020-21 school year.

Extracurricular Activities

Bolles offers 50 student-run clubs, numerous school organizations, athletics and fine and performing arts opportunities. Students can explore their creativity through chorus, dance, band, visual arts and theatre. Our internationally recognized athletic program emphasizes the importance of good sportsmanship and the power of play — children developing not just academically, but also physically, socially and emotionally. With our rotating schedule, students have dedicated time for club meetings during Activities Period held from 10:30-11:20 a.m. every day of the school week except Wednesday.

Curriculum

Students must earn 22 credits to meet graduation requirements. Bolles operates on a two-semester academic year with a six-week summer session. Each semester is 18 weeks, with a nine-week reporting period. English classes are limited to 15 in the Upper School. Other classes are limited to 20. All courses are taught at a college preparatory level. Our expansive curriculum includes six world languages, 38 Honors courses, and 29 AP Courses. Course levels are marked on the transcript by "R" (Regular), "H" (Honors) and "AP" (Advanced Placement). Students must be recommended for, and in some cases submit an application, to be approved for Honors and AP courses. Bolles offers additional courses through Global Online Academy (GOA), providing students the opportunity to work virtually alongside teachers and peers around the world while exploring specific areas of interest.
