Important Dates

- Applications for financial aid are due on February 10, 2023
- Late Applications: Families are always encouraged to apply for financial aid, even if the deadline has passed; however, DeLaSalle cannot guarantee financial aid for families who apply late

Who should complete an application?

- All families are encouraged to submit an application through TADS
- One application is required from the household where the student(s) reside. If a student(s) live in multiple households or parents have shared custody, each household is required to apply for financial aid

Where can I obtain an application?

- Online applications are available at <u>www.mytads.com</u>. We highly recommend that you download the financial aid worksheet (available in <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>) prior to completing the online application
- When starting the online application, you will need to create a username and password which will be used again for the financial aid and tuition management modules in TADS

What do I enter on Section 22 of the application?

- Enter "DeLaSalle" as the first school in this section
- Use the dropdown menu for each dependent who will/may attend a tuition charging school in the upcoming year

How do I complete my application on-time?

- To avoid delays in processing your application, your should immediately submit photocopies or upload your supporting documents:
 - W-2 Statements
 - 1099 Statements
 - Most recent pay stubs
 - Most recent Federal Tax Return
 - Most recent Corporate Tax Return (if applicable)
 - Documentation for all other sources of income (social security, welfare, food stamps, unemployment, child support, workers compensation, etc.)

When will I find out if I qualified for financial aid?

• All need-based grants and merit-based scholarships are reflected on the student(s) Tuition Agreement, which is typically sent after the registration process is completed
