THE SCHOOL

Sayre School, founded in 1854, is downtown Lexington's only independent coeducational college preparatory school, serving students age two through grade twelve. The school has a 50-acre athletic complex which includes four fields for football, soccer and lacrosse, baseball and softball diamonds, ten tennis courts, and cross country course. The school is governed by a twenty-four member Board of Trustees.

STUDENTS AND FACULTY

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- Sayre School does not provide class rank because of the small graduating class size
- GPA is weighted + 1.0 point for Honors and AP
- Honors and AP classes have limited enrollment due to student qualifications and number of sections offered
- Most APs are not available until junior or senior years, and students enrolled in an AP course must sit for the exam
- 18 AP classes offered
- 24 Carnegie credits required to graduate

CLASS OF 2022 PERFORMANCE

- Members of the Class of 2022 were admitted to 112 different colleges in 26 states and the District of Columbia
- 63 seniors enrolled at 36 different colleges in 19 different states and the District of Columbia
- 100% college placement
- 100% college bound
- 82% of the senior class completed one or more AP examinations
- 86% of students received merit scholarships totaling over \$10.5 million
- \$160,000 average scholarship per student
- 2 National Merit Finalists; 1 National Merit Commended Scholar
- 8 seniors will participate in intercollegiate athletics
- 51% of seniors scored 28 or above on the ACT; 32% scored 30 or above
