REFLECTIONS

2020 will long be remembered as the dreaded year of the coronavirus and the COVID-19 pandemic. However, a virus did not deter Warrior Nation of one of its finest years in Warren Athletics. The Fall season saw the Football team post a 7-2 record and advance to the 3rd round of the playoffs. The momentum from Fall continued into the Winter months as the Boys Basketball team advanced to the Regional semi-final and the Girls to the District final, and two wrestlers won State Championships. The Spring saw more success as Baseball and Softball both finished with winning seasons and the boys and girls track teams combined to send 11 athletes to the State Track Meet. In one of the best sports years ever at Warren, the Warriors claimed 3 League titles, 6 Sectional and 2 District Championships, had 13 athletes claim All-Ohio honors, and 13 seniors signed to continue their athletic careers at the collegiate level.

The 14-member Girls Cross Country team of first-year coach Ryan Werry put together a solid season improving on last years' showing. The 2020 Boys Cross Country team flourished under first-year mentor and ECOL Coach of the Year Ryan Werry. The team dominated the competition throughout the season, finishing with 9 team titles and 1 top 5 finish. The team ran to an ECOL title, and finished 4th in the District and qualified for Regionals. The “five” of Seniors Matthew Rauch and Justin Pate and Juniors Bryson Angelo, Brennan Perdue, and Andrew Vincent each earned honors at the conference and/or district levels. Bryson Angelo (113/168) qualified for State with a 26th place finish in the Regional. The 2021 season appears bright with the return of the teams' talented junior class of runners.

Football

2020 was a historic season for Head Coach Matt Kimes, 740 Zone Coach of the Year, and his Warrior Football Team. A shortened regular season due to the COVID-19 pandemic could not derail the Warriors from what was destined to be a special season. In the 6 game regular season, the Warriors finished 5-1 and earned their first post-season appearance in program history. As an 8th seed and a playoff host, the Warriors entered uncharted waters and defeated opening round opponent Columbus East 45-0. This was followed by a dramatic 35-28, come-from-behind home win over perennial playoff team John Glenn. Unfortunately, the Warriors playoff run ended the following week on the road at St. Clairsville, as the hosts handed the Warriors a 26-0 defeat. The Warriors ended the season 7-2, the best record this century, and recorded the first back-to-back winning seasons since the 1998 and 1999 campaigns.

An abundance of talent (15 seniors) will graduate, including the record breaking “pass and catch connection” of Kurt Taylor and Evan Gandee. Both will graduate as the programs’ best players at their positions. Taylor set career (5,526), single season (2,682), and single game (476) passing yardage records, as well as TD passes for a game (7), season (27) and career (55). Gandee established records for receptions for a game (19), season (73) and career (174), receiving yardage for a season (1,039) and career (2,568), and receiving touchdowns for a season (11) and career (23). Taylor and Gandee and their teammates in the class of 2021 returned Warrior Football to relevance. 2021 will usher a new look and a young squad, but recent success at the Middle School level creates optimism that they can remain competitive.

Golf - Boys

ECOL and District Golf Coach of the Year Nathan Evans was masterful in his management of a young (9 of 11 underclassmen), but very talented Boys Golf Team as he led them to an impressive 2020 season. Seniors Seth Dennis and Chance Weihl and Junior Caleb Davis formed a formidable trio that helped lead the Warriors to first place finishes at the ECOL and Sectional tournaments. Jr. Nathan Heft proved reliable throughout the season and Edward Kehl (So.) emerged as a solid contributor down the stretch. The Warriors once again captured the Washington County Tournament and won 7 of 8 duals enroute to a 92-39 overall record.

Seth Dennis put together a dominant Senior season on the links by earning ECOL and DI Southeast District 1st Team and Player of the Year honors, as well as All-OVAC 1st Team honors. Seth became the first Warren individual male golfer to qualify for the State Tournament in two different seasons. Soccer – Boys

The Warriors were much improved in 2020, but a tougher schedule with the addition of the talented ECOL teams led to the programs' 3rd consecutive losing season. Key injuries in the middle of the schedule derailed what was a great start (5-2-1) to the season for the program. After a 1-5-1 skid to end the regular season, the injured became healthy and returned to the field and the team made a nice showing capturing the Sectional Championship in an upset OT win over Marietta. Ten seniors will graduate, leaving Ben Goodman, Josh Yost, Brayden Hurley, and Hunter Hanes as the only returning players with post-season honors. That, combined with a JV program that has gone winless the past two seasons and the retirement of 21-year veteran Head Coach Ekrem Eksi, the architect of the Warren's Boys and Girls soccer programs, at the end of the season poses some concern. Much work in rebuilding the overall program will await the new coach, but the cupboard is not bare as several young kids with varsity experience return for the coach to further develop.

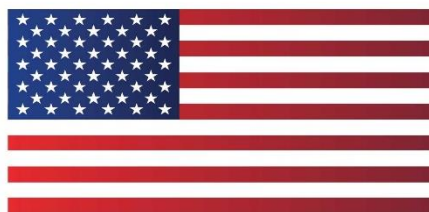
- **73** Warren High School student-athletes earned Warren Athletics All-Academic honors. To be recognized, they must have earned a 3.5 cumulative grade point average.
