The 2021-22 school year was a successful one for the Warren High School Athletics program. A sense of normalcy was restored as restrictions on fan attendance at sporting events as the result of the COVID-19 pandemic subsided. New schools and state-of-the-art facilities for football, volleyball, soccer, basketball, and track & field were unveiled with lots to be celebrated. The Fall season saw the Football team once again advance to the playoffs and the Girls Soccer team claim the Sectional title. The momentum from Fall continued into the Winter months as the Girls Basketball team advanced to the Regional final and the Boys to the District semi-final, and Hayley Snyder won her unprecedented 3rd consecutive wrestling State Championship. The Spring brought more success as the Boys Track team captured the District title, the boys and girls track teams combined to send 8 athletes to the State Track Meet, and Softball finished with a winning season. In all, the Warriors claimed 1 League title, 4 Sectional and 2 District Championships, had 7 athletes claim All-Ohio honors, and 11 seniors signed to continue their athletic careers at the collegiate level

Football

Coming off the historic 2020 season which saw the Warriors earn the programs’ first trip to the post-season, Head Coach Matt Kimes and his staff faced the challenge of replacing 15 seniors and navigating through the continuing pandemic. The young Warriors managed to finish 3-7 in the regular season, and with a new playoff format and a few quality wins in a strong schedule, earned the programs’ 2nd trip to the post-season. Their season ended with an opening round loss to the region’s top seed Bloom Carroll.

Eleven seniors will graduate, including the teams’ top tackler LB JT Rice and 2-way mainstay Dennis Pettey, as well as Hunter Vincent. However, 14 lettermen, most notably record-setting So. RB Jason Williams, So. QB Trent Taylor, and fellow Fr. DB’s Nick Cressey and Landon Fairbanks and an influx of talent from the Junior High program lead to great optimism in 2022. The Warriors will once again be very young, but the experience they gained this past season and a revised schedule due to the collapse of the ECOL should benefit the squad moving forward.

Soccer – Boys

A new year, the return of two talented seniors to the program after a 1-year hiatus, and a new Head Coach were not enough to reverse the fortunes and allow the Warriors to avoid the programs' 4th consecutive losing season. First-year Head Coach Jon Hurley and his Warriors finished 4-9-5 and lost in the opening round of the Sectionals to annual nemesis Athens by a 2-1 score. A closer look, though, will reveal that the Warriors were close to a major turnaround if not for 5 ties and 7 losses by a mere 1 goal. The ladies finished 11-8-1, hosted and claimed the Sectional title with shutout wins over Miami Trace and Circleville, and along the way rewarded Coach Pinkerton with his 100th Varsity win as a head coach in a 2-0 decision over Athens. If not for four, 1 goal losses, 2021 would have been truly a special season. Led by Seniors Alysa Pinkerton, Macie Smith, and Grace Bolden, and the return of a talented trio of Juniors in Alexis Frazee, Payton Alloway and Sophie Cochran, the Lady Warriors made a strong run in the post-season before succumbing in a quagmire at perennial nemesis Fairfield Union in the District semi-final, a game that was stopped 3 minutes into the second half. Wrestling

The 2021-22 Warren Wrestling squad, led by Head Coach Jeff Parsons, enjoyed another solid season. Freshman sensation Aden Strahler (165 lb) finished 5th at Districts to earn an alternate spot to the State Championship tournament, while Sophomore Jason Williams claimed District honors with a 6th place

finish in the 175 lb. weight class. Earlier in the season, Senior Brodie Tait earned All-OVAC honors with a 6th place finish.

Hayley Snyder once again garnered the programs' headlines as she became the schools' only 3-time state champion as she claimed the 110 lb. State Title at the Ohio Wrestlers Association Girls State Tournament. Furthermore, at the prestigious OVAC Championships, Hayley became the first female to place (7th in 113 lb weight class) in the 68-year history of the tournament. In addition to Snyder, Sophomore Kylee Tait and Senior Zarah Strahler qualified for the Girls State Championship. Tait came away with a runner-up finish in the 140 lb. weight class. Next season, the OHSAA will usher in a girls' division for the first time to the OHSAA State Wrestling Championships.
