WEST-SHORE CAREER TECH STUDENT PLACES THIRD IN NATIONAL CULINARY COMPETITION


Congratulations to West Shore Career-Tech Culinary Arts student Reagan Fishbaugh on finishing in third place in the Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) national competition! Reagan, who is entering her senior year, competed in the Level 3 Culinary Arts division.

Reagan qualified for the national competition by winning the FCCLA state competition. The national event was held in San Diego June 28-July 3 as part of the FCCLA National Leadership Conference. The competition required each competitor to prepare a three-course meal within 90 minutes. Students were judged on their knife skills, safety and sanitation, organization, culinary knowledge, cooking techniques, plate presentation, and tasting.

Reagan worked many hours outside of classroom time under the guidance of her instructors, Devan Corti and Rob McGorray, to help prepare for the series of FCCLA competitions. Fantastic work, Reagan!

Congratulations to the 284 seniors who walked across the Civic Auditorium stage to receive their high school diplomas in the 174th Lakewood High School Commencement! The graduates received their diplomas from Board of Education President Betsy Bergen Shaughnessy and Superintendent Mag-

gie Niedzwiecki in the ceremony held on May 27.

The Class of 2022 heard from the two classmates who were selected by their peers to speak, Sylvie Ballou and Noor Imtiaz, as well as faculty-selected speaker Collin Hunt.

During the ceremony, Principal Mark Walter recognized several

special student groups including those wearing National Honor Society stoles, French Honor Society ribbons, Career-Technical Honor Society medals, the seven students joining the military and the 40 students wearing Hawthorne Medals for ending their high school careers with a 4.0 GPA or better.

DISTRICT BOASTS DOUBLE WINNERS IN STOP HATE CONTEST

The District had much to celebrate following the announcement of winners in the annual and prestigious Maltz Museum Stop the Hate contest. Rising senior Jacquie Hudak was selected as the grand prize winner of the Youth Speak Out essay contest and Garfield Middle School's seventh-grade choir earned first place in the Youth Sing Out portion of the contest. Jacquie's essay on championing body positivity for girls in the face of a culture of body shaming was selected from among 10 finalists from Northeast Ohio schools. Jacquie's essay earned her a \$20,000 scholarship and \$5,000 for Lakewood High. The choir earned a \$3,500 anti-bias grant for Garfield.

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DISTRICT EARNS BEST COMMUNITIES FOR MUSIC ED AWARD AGAIN

Lakewood City Schools once again has been honored with the Best Communities for Music Education designation from The NAMM Foundation for its outstanding commitment to music education. The Best Communities for Music Education designation is awarded to districts that demonstrate outstanding achievement in efforts to provide music access and education to all students. The District has been awarded the designation every year since 2016.

To qualify for the Best Communities designation, the District answered detailed questions

about funding, graduation requirements, music class participation, instruction time, facilities, support for the music program and community music-making programs. Responses were verified with school officials and reviewed by The Music Research Institute at the University of Kansas.

Research into music education continues to demonstrate educational/cognitive and social skill benefits for children who make music. In a series of landmark studies by scientists and researchers at Northwestern University a link was found between

students in community music programs and life-long academic success.

The Lakewood City Schools offers music education from kindergarten through 12th grade. Instrumental instruction begins in 5th grade. Middle school offerings include classroom band, orchestra, and choir with extracurricular opportunities in all three. Lakewood High School's curricular offerings include five orchestras, four choirs, three bands, and several non-performance music electives. In addition, our high school extracurricular ensembles provide



numerous opportunities for our students to enhance their musical experience through groups such as the Lakewood Ranger Marching Band, The Lakewood Project electric rock orchestra, and Chamber Choir.


