

The Big Picture with Fr. Bob



Dear Friends,

On Monday, we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although it is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year, we still should look for ways to honor Mary in our hearts and in our lives. We believe that Mary, the Mother of God, was taken to heaven, body and soul, after her earthly life. This took place because of Mary's unique role

in salvation history. Mary is not only the Mother of God, but she is also the spiritual mother of all the redeemed. The Church has always seen in the Blessed Mother a foreshadowing, a preview, of our future glory. We look to the day when we will enter heaven, body, and soul, when our Lord returns in glory at the end of time.

Throughout the ages, holy men and women have looked to Mary for her powerful intercession and her motherly care. I have never come across a saint who has not held Mary in high esteem. Saints model for us how we should love Mary as our spiritual Mother.

What's on Deck with Fr. Dudek



Just like many of you, I was able to get away for a short vacation this summer, and I'd like to share one of my experiences.

I enjoy history, and on Saturday, August 5th, I had the pleasure of touring the home/museum of Frank Murphy, which is located in Harbor Beach, MI. There is no other person from the State of Michigan who has held so many high-level offices in government at so many different levels.

Frank Murphy was a cradle Catholic, and throughout his life and service at the local, state, and national level, one can see how he lived and emulated the Gospel.

Here's a short chronological list of some of his major accomplishments...

- ~Law Degree from the University of Michigan
- ~A veteran of WWI
- ~First U.S. District Attorney for Eastern Michigan
- ~Detroit Recorder's Court Judge
- ~Major of Detroit during the Great Depression
- ~Governor General of the Philippines
- ~Governor of Michigan
- ~U.S. Attorney General
- ~U.S. Supreme Court Justice

Frank Murphy was faced with several challenges through his disguised career, but there are four situations where his faith, I believe, helped to guide him in making four unpopular decisions that history has shown to be not only Right, but also Just.

First, as Detroit Recorder's Court Judge, he presided over the famous Dr. Ossian Sweet trials, which earned him national acclaim. In June 1925, a prominent black medical doctor Dr. Ossian Sweet and his family were arrested and charged with the murder of one member of a white mob, which gathered with the clear intent of intimidating the Sweets. Rocks were thrown at the house and a window was broken.

As the presiding Judge, Frank Murphy instructed the jury that "a man's house is his castle" and that Dr. Sweet had the right to defend it, if he had good reason to fear for the lives of his family or their property. These rights, he noted, belong to black people as well as whites. The Sweet family was acquitted of all charges, and an important legal precedent had been set.

Second, as Mayor of Detroit, Frank Murphy's innovative solutions for assisting the poor during the Great Depression caught the attention of President Roosevelt, who later became a mentor to young Frank Murphy. Some say that Frank Murphy's ideas and solutions while Mayor were incorporated into FDR's New Deal.

Next, while Governor of Michigan, Frank Murphy helped to negotiate the historic General Motors sit-down strike of 1937. Many called on him to send in the Michigan National

Guard into the plant to remove the striking auto workers. He wisely chose not to follow that advice, and the documents that were written from the deliberation of the strike would go on to become the charter for the United Auto Workers, UAW.

Finally, Justice Murphy wrote one of the dissenting opinions for the controversial Korematsu v. U.S. case, which focused on the constitutionality of the internment of Japanese Americans on the West Coast during WWII. In his dissent, Frank Murphy argued that the United States wasn't rounding up German Americans or Italian-Americans. so we shouldn't for the Japanese Americans. He also harshly criticized both the majority and the military order, writing that the internment of the Japanese was based upon "the disinformation, half-truths and insinuations that for years have been directed against Japanese Americans by people with racial and economic prejudices." In 1998, President Bill Clinton awarded Fred Korematsu the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Throughout Frank Murphy's life, he exemplified Catholic Social Doctrine by championing the human rights for the people from our region, state, and nation. Below is a quote that sums up his advocacy for all those citizens of our great nation who were considered to be living on the margins of society.

"The law knows no finer hour than when it cuts through formal concepts and transitory emotions to protect unpopular citizens against discrimination and persecution." ~Frank Murphy

Mission Appeal

The Keta-Akatsi Diocese Ghana

Keta-Akatsi Diocese was created 25 years ago out of the Diocese of Keta–Ho. It is along the Atlantic Ocean close to the Republic of Togo border. The Diocese covers an area of 7,470 Square Kilometres: (2,885 Square Miles). The diocese has a total population of 785,000 people, and 15.3% are Catholics.

Most of the people in the area are peasant subsistent farmers and small-scale canoe fishermen. There are different religious practices in the diocese. There are Christians, Muslims, the strongest group is the traditional religions. They even influence many of the other religious groups. This situation challenges us to intensify our evangelization ministry.

The Diocese has 77 priests; the majority are diocesan clergy, and few are religious missionaries. There are 28 parishes and quasi-parishes with 189 outstations or mission stations which have no priest in residence. These outstations are shared among the parishes.

The priests visit these outstations attached to their parishes regularly, which means visiting them during the week. Otherwise, these stations are cared for by lay people, we call catechists. The catechists conduct service/worship with the people whenever there is no priest. They help prepare the people for the sacraments and call for the priest when there is an emergency.

The Diocese also has Educational, Health and Social facilities which contribute to the social and moral development of the people in addition to our primary task of evangelization. Your contributions will primarily help our priests visit the outstations on a regular basis and help also in the following Diocesan institutes:

St. Theresa Institute: This is an institution for physically challenged children. Most of the physically challenged people are left out in the society. The family will usually spend their meager income on "able" children, not on the physically challenged. In effect, these children are ignored. This institution makes a statement to the society that these children are important and able. They pursue normal education to High School level and some in addition learn trade, e.g., printing, leather works, dress making, home economics, Information Technology etc., so as to equip them to be independent in the future.

Good Samaritan Home is an institution for mentally challenged children. Some of the children have Down syndrome or are children with mental defects from birth. These children are otherwise neglected by their families, some starved to death. Many of our people believe these are spirit children and so are not welcomed in the family. The church takes these children in and cares for them. Some of them may live with us forever. Some are gradually linked with their family in order to educate them that these children are also gifts of God. Your generosity will help to make the message of God's love to these unfortunate children loud to our cultures here in the diocese.

St. Agnes Girls' Institute is an institution for young women who were prevented from going to school because of the poverty of their parents. Some of the girls also dropped out of school because they got pregnant, so the parents refused to pay for their school fees. Some of the girls also left the ordinary education system in the country because they did not get a good academic foundation in the beginning. St. Agnes gives these girls the opportunity to learn a trade, e.g., catering, dress making, ICT and other practical lessons for human development. Many of these girls find it difficult to pay the fees of the institution. The girls have difficulty feeding themselves in the hostel provided by the institution. Your generosity will help the directors of the institution to provide the equipment and tools and care for the girls.

Conclusion

The pandemic continues to have its effects upon us as a church and a country not to mention the impact of the Russian-Ukraine War. These have reduced our Diocesan activities and finance to around 50% capacity. We are gradually picking up but more effort and resources are needed to bring us at least back to where we were. Your contribution to the Keta-Akatsi Diocese will enable us to preach the Gospel of Christ to all and help these challenged children and young women. May God bless you and your generosity in these difficult and challenging days. My special blessings and greetings to all the members of the Church of the Divine Child, Michigan. Thank you and be assured of my prayers. See you soon.



From supporting the March for Life, to donating over 1,500 ultrasound machines to crisis pregnancy centers across the country and supporting the Special Olympics and ISR programs to help those with special needs. As God's children, we have worked tenaciously to build a culture of life in our world.

Our latest program in this effort was unveiled recently by the Knight's Supreme Council and is called ASAP, Aid and Support After Pregnancy. ASAP helps mothers and babies by supporting pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes. Millions in Funding to Help Pregnant Women & Their Babies Vetoed Out of Budget

Gov. Gretchen Whitmer this week vetoed more than \$20 million in funding from next year's budget that would have assisted pregnant women in need, promoted adoption as an alternative to abortion, and supported pregnancy centers that help women who choose to carry their children to term. Together with some \$16 million vetoed from last year's budget for similar policies, the Governor over two years will now have eliminated over \$36 million that otherwise would have benefited pregnant women who choose life for their babies.

"Although terribly unfortunate, it is not unexpected that the governor would, again, take the extreme position of vetoing funding to help pregnant women in crisis. Vetoing this funding alienates tens of thousands of women and families who receive assistance from non-profit pregnancy resource centers each year," said Rebecca Mastee, J.D.,



policy advocate with Michigan Catholic Conference (MCC), in a statement issued this week in response to the budget vetoes.

"By eliminating these helping hands for women who want to have their babies, the Governor is, in effect, taking away their 'choice' - the choice for childbirth," Mastee said, who added that the vetoes over the past two years show "pro-abortion advocates have fully committed to push abortion extremism on our state over the well-being of women in need."

The spending programs vetoed by the Governor, all of which were strongly supported by MCC, included:

- \$10 million to promote adoption programs in the state;
- \$4 million for grants to assist pregnant women who lack a safe home;
- \$3 million for the maternal navigator program that promotes childbirth and alternatives to abortion;
- \$2 million for a tax credit for parents who choose adoption;
- \$1.5 million for grants to pregnancy resource centers to provide services to women who carry their children to term;
- \$700,000 for the Parenting and Pregnancy Services program to assist pregnant women and those in crisis pregnancies with support toward childbirth; and
- \$50,000 to develop materials to inform medical care providers that the Department of Health and Human Services will not use state dollars to fund abortion.

The Governor vetoed similar funds out of the education budget she signed last week, which would have gone to universities and colleges to establish pregnancy centers to serve students who are pregnant.
