BOARD OF EDUCATION AWARDED

The OSBA (Ohio School Boards Association) has recognized Northmont's Board of Education as a Gold Level Board for the 5th year in a row. There are only three schools in the Southwest **Ohio District that have this five-year** distinction. Two board members, Jane Woodie and Bruce Clapp, were also recognized for 20 years of service at the annual Southwest Ohio District Regional meeting in March.

Northmont has realized energy reduction since energy efficient upgrades have been made to various building HVAC systems, having two new energy efficient buildings through the OFCC projects, and having the energy savings agreement with Waibel Energy Systems, the Southwest EPC (Educational Purchasing Council), and DP&L. This comparison was done on a baseline from an entire fiscal **year during 2013-14 (FY2014)** of energy usage, including electric & natural gas and compared to the most recent full fiscal year to current (7/2015-2/2017). Through energy conservation measures from our staff and students, equipment upgrades, and monitoring the district as a whole we have reduced the cost per square foot by \$4.63 or a decrease of 32% just over the last several years.

Project Based Learning is a teaching strategy that engages students in real-world learning experiences while focusing on key knowledge and skills students need to learn. The first staff days back from Winter Break were used as training days to teach the entire staff the concepts and to engage them in some PBL projects. From PK to high school, staff have embraced the strategies and used creative means to teach standards. Preschool students created blueprints and followed them to build and present inventions. Middle school students studied rocks from all over the country and designed creative ways to present what they learned to their peers. High school students studied "zombies" for personality traits. Elementary students learned about and sampled an array of fruits and vegetables.
