Each year, Northmont's fleet maintenance department is charged with the task of preparing and presenting each of the district's school buses to the Ohio State Highway Patrol for an annual inspection. The process consists of a top to bottom, inside and out inspection of every bus. This year, the process began in early January and, in spite of adverse weather and inspections taking place between routes, Northmont marked the 30th consectutive year of receiving a 100% inspection rating on the first round.

Drop off for kindergarten and first grade students begins at 9:00 a.m. Students arriving early will not be admitted until that time unless they are going to latchkey or breakfast. Breakfast begins at 8:45 a.m. Pick up for students in the green and yellow hallway is at 3:45 p.m. Pick up for students in the blue and orange hallway is 3:55 p.m. Staff members will be outside to assist the students and drivers. Please be patient during the first few weeks of school as everyone learns the routine.

Drop off and pick up for preschool is at the back parking lot off of Hoke Road. Parents are not to enter this lot before 9:20 a.m. for AM drop off or 4:00 p.m. for PM pick up. Parents must park and walk to the doors to meet their child.

Northmont Students Show Improvement State Expectations Rise Significantly

This spring Northmont administered the State Achievement Tests in grades 3-8 and the State End of Course Tests at the high school. Results will arrive this summer and then the State Report Cards will be generated and released in August. Significant changes to the State Report Cards will impact the district's and buildings' report cards this fall. The State radically changed the "Indicators Met" section. The target passage rates for each test has increased to 80%. In order to meet an indicator, districts must have 80% of their students score proficient or higher on tests that are more rigorous. This is a large jump for some of the tests. For example, in order to meet the indicator for the 3rd grade English Language Arts (ELA) test on the 2016 Report Card, districts needed a 68% passage rate. This year, districts will need an 80% passage rate. Early data indicate that Northmont students improved in 3rd grade ELA, but it will not be enough to reach the 80% target. Because of this increase in the targets, districts will likely see the number of "Indicators Met" on the report card drop this year. The other change to the "Indicators Met" section is that the Ohio Graduation Test results are no longer included. Northmont has always met these five subject area indicators. The bottom line is that we continue to see growth and improvement in the results and are confident our students are learning and growing through the experiences they receive at Northmont. We will continue to analyze the State Report Card results and use this data, when appropriate, to continue to ensure Northmont is providing an exceptional educational experience for all of our Thunderbolts.

Northmont Staffers Receive Grants

*MARTHA HOLDEN JENNINGS FOUNDATION

Mrs. Julie Knapke and Mrs. Maria Schreiber, teachers at Northmoor, and Mrs. Stephanie Reynolds, a teacher at the Middle School are the recipients of grants from the Martha Holden Jennings Foundation. Mrs. Knapke and Mrs. Schreiber received their grant for excellence in team teaching. They were nominated because of their collaboration, communication, and differentiation in the classroom. Mrs. Reynolds' grant was for excellence in teaching science, and she was nominated because of the leadership role she played in creating common assessments, curriculum maps, and labs in the Middle School science department.

*NOAA CLIMATE STEWARDS GRANT

Mrs. Jennifer Stormer, a gifted intervention teacher, was awarded a \$2,000 NOAA Climate Stewards grant. Mrs. Stormer's students will be exploring energy sources, energy efficiency, and energy conservation. The \$2,000 grant award will make it possible for her 3rd and 4th grade students to travel to Dayton for DP&L's Student Energy Fair, and to travel to the Kleptz Early Learning Center in order to educate first grade students about energy concepts. The students will also have the opportunity to visit COSI at the end of the year to attend the Ohio Energy Project's Energy Banquet where they will present a scrapbook documenting their experiences. Each student will receive a kilo-watt meter to perform some energy consumption experiments at home.
