Northmont is dedicated to providing an excellent education, meeting the schools' day-to-day operating costs, and providing the necessary educational tools for our more than 5,300 students.

The Board of Education passed the final resolution at the June 24, 2019 board meeting to place a renewal levy on the November 5, 2019 ballot. This levy will not increase taxes and will not have to be voted on again. The community first passed this levy in November of 1990. This levy brings in \$5.4 million dollars for the district's daily operating expenses and is vital for day-to-day operations.

Bond Refinancing Saves Additional \$1 million

Currently, the Northmont Board of Education is involved in a refinancing action that will save approximately \$1 million in additional bond dollars. These actions create a scenario allowing the bonds to be paid off sooner. This is in addition to the \$5.6 million that was saved in 2018 when tax laws eliminated a provision allowing government entities to advance refund their bonds, which is similar to a homeowner refinancing a home mortage.

State Report Card Data Released

On Thursday, September 12, the Ohio Department of Education released the Report Cards for each school district in the state.

Northmont received an overall grade of a C. Teachers and administrators will continue to review and analyze all of the data from this Report Card to help make decisions that will best meet all of the students' needs. Some of the highlights from this past year include:

- **Over 95% of Northmont's passage rates are above the state average
- **Third, seventh, and eighth grade English Language Arts Tests' passage rates showed significant improvements from the year before
- **The "Improving At-Risk K-3 Readers" grade improved from the year before

According to the Ohio Department of Education, "Ohio School Report Cards are not the only measure of the success or accomplishments of a school or district. Many elements combine to form a teaching and learning community, and Ohio's districts and schools have many points of pride to share."

Unity Day/Rocks



Each year, Northmont High School staff members lead a series of full-day events for freshmen to teach the culture/climate that is desirable at Northmont High School. Students participate in small group and large group activities and hear speakers focusing on concepts like belonging and empathy.

In keeping with the theme of the week, city leaders from each of the jurisdictions that comprise Northmont have been invited to paint symbols of the community on large rocks in the rain garden adjacent to the high school. These rocks will stand as a reminder that all the communities stand together in support of Northmont students.

District Safety Committee

Northmont's Safety Committee is comprised of representatives from the cities of Clayton, Englewood, and Union public safety departments, as well as school principals and administrators. This group meets monthly to communicate about the needs of the district and to ensure all State of Ohio mandates are in compliance within each building. State required fire, tornado, and safety drills are held in each building based on current law. The committee discussions and recommendations are targeted to provide consistancy among the different buildings around the district.

Last year the Middle School took part in a mass evacuation that included components of bleeding control and rescue breathing. In August the transportation department observed a simulation of a bus accident with participation from CareFlight and the Northmont Drama Club. These trainings take months of preparation to coordinate and a lot of cooperation from the various jurisdictions that make up the Northmont community.

Mr. Geyer has nine years of coaching experience and played lacrosse in college. He said he coaches because he has a "passion to pay it forward and do what I can to help grow the game."




