Diversity and Equity

Northmont City School teachers and administrators have worked over the last two years with Strive Together, a national non-profit organization dedicated to ensuring the success of all children.

The work is data-driven and based on proven professional development models. This has commonly been referred to as Equity Fellows. Using district-wide, building, and student-level data, each building examines how students are succeeding with a closer examination of multiple student attributes--such as race, gender, and disability. The goal is to close achievement gaps. The plan includes using root cause analysis in order to locate barriers to student achievement.

The district has used other resources dating back several years to address gaps in learning and will continue to emphasize the importance of growth for every student.

Opportunities for Gifted & High Achieving Students



Northmont is committed to early identification of gifted students, which research shows is critical for the development of gifted learners. All students are tested for gifted identification at the end of first grade. Starting in second grade, students who are identified gifted in reading and/or math are grouped together and provided with differentiated instruction. In grades 3-6 services are provided by gifted intervention specialists to students identified gifted in reading, math, superior cognitive ability, and creative thinking. The focus of those services is on problem solving, critical thinking, and collaboration.

At the middle school, the services and learning opportunities include an advanced science course for students who are identified as gifted in science or demonstrate high achievement in science. We also offer a language arts class for students identified in reading, cognitive ability, and/or creative thinking. All students, regardless of identification, have the opportunity to take advanced level math courses and courses like Robotics and Modeling & Simulation.

The high school offers honors, AP, and College Credit Plus courses to all students. NHS also offers a wide range of courses in order to provide opportunities for students who have different career path interests. There are 15 honors courses, 17 Advanced Placement courses and nine College Credit Plus courses. Other course options include Pre-Engineering, Graphic Design, Intro to Programing & Computer Concepts, Modeling & Simulation, Video Game Development, Aerospace Engineering, Carpentry, Robotics, STNA, Graphic Novel/Comic Design, Entrepreneurship, Journalism, Acting for the Camera, ROTC, and many more.

Northmont is proud to offer these varying opportunities so students will be prepared for their next steps after graduation.

Preschool Registration

We are pleased to announce that on Monday, March 16, 2020, the Northmont Preschool will begin new student registration for the 2020-2021 school year for typically developing children who are residents of the Northmont City School District. Priority placements will be given to children who are four years old on or before August 1. If placements remain, three-year-old students will be accepted. All children must be toilet trained, have well-developed language skills, and acceptable social skills to enroll as a typical peer role model in the preschool for the 2020-2021 school year. Custodial parents/guardians may call 937-832-6728 on Monday, March 16 beginning at 8:00 a.m. to reserve your spot. NO early calls will be accepted. Please leave a detailed message with your name, your child's name and birthdate, your address, and a phone number where you can be reached. Letters will be mailed by March 23 to notify you of acceptance to the program or placement on the waiting list.

The Dayton and Montgomery County Public Health Department released information at the end of the calendar year sharing some interesting data about our community. The median home value in our region is \$137,608. The median household income is \$63,658 and family poverty is 6%. Twenty-nine percent of the adult population has attained a bachelor's degree or higher. Eighty-seven percent commute to work by driving alone, 7% carpool, and only 1% use public transportation. Only the Centerville/Washington Township region has a higher median income than our region. These figures show what I've always felt, that Northmont is a vibrant place to live, learn, and raise a family.
