NORTHMONT SECURES LITERACY GRANT

The Northmont City School District was chosen by the Ohio Department of Education for the Striving Readers Comprehensive Literacy grant in the amount of \$951,616 to raise literacy achievement. The grant is awarded in three installments over a three-year period amounting to: Grades K-5 - \$797,122; Middle School - \$136,033; High School - \$18,461.

The Striving Readers Comprehensive Literacy grant focuses on serving the greatest numbers or percentages of students living in poverty, students with disabilities, English learners, and students identified as having a reading disability.

Northmont will use the grant to train literacy coaches who will train other teachers on literacy strategies. The coaches will model-teach students so the grant becomes sustainable.

Superintendent Tony Thomas acknowledged Curriculum Specialist Jessie Zink for her work securing the grant.

INKROTT AWARDED GRANTS FOR LEADERSHIP

High School Principal Dr. Jason Inkrott was recently awarded grants totalling close to \$10,000 to launch the Aileron Student Leadership Summit for high performing students entering Grade 12. This three-day conference was created to challenge students and present them with individualized instruction on improving college essay writing skills and providing critical skills that are necessary to become successful leaders. Grants from The Mathile Family Foundation, The Martha Holding Jennings Foundation, and the Northmont Education Foundation were all critical in bringing this vision to fruition.



FACILITIES UPDATE

Construction of the new Northmont High School, Kleptz Early Learning Center, and demolition of O.R. Edgington were the successful results of Phase I of the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) Master Facilities plan for our Northmont Community. Now we are looking towards the next steps (Phase II), with an eye on our Strategic Plan which states: "We will develop and implement a plan to build, renovate, expand, and/or eliminate facilities to support the mission and vision."

Engaging key stakeholders and gathering their input began in January, including:

- **Numerous in-depth interviews with various community leaders to identify the range of information and perceptions about our district and facilities, and community priorities relative to facility visioning and future planning.
- **Several listening sessions with parent and staff groups about their experiences and observations with our buildings and how they impact education.
- **A formal report of the findings was presented to the Strategic Planning Team on June 20.

Northmont is excited about expanding the 1:1 initiative with iPads during the 2018-2019 school year! In order for students in grades 6-12 to have iPads for the first day of school, there is an iPad Pick-Up event. This is an exciting event for the students, parents, and community!

WHO: Incoming Grade 6-12 students AND their parents/guardians

WHEN: August 6-9, 2018 (see schedule below)

WHERE: Northmont High School, Enter through DOOR 13 (near the parking lot behind the Middle School)

SCHEDULE- To help with the distribution process, please try your best to attend as scheduled below:

- Monday, August 6, 8:30am-3:30pm Students with last name that begins with A-D
- Tuesday, August 7, 12:30pm-7:30pm Students with last name that begins with E-K
- Wednesday, August 8, 8:30-3:30pm Students with last name that begins with L-R
- Thursday, August 9, 12:30pm-7:30pm Students with last name that begins with S-Z

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- There will be multiple "stations" that students/parents/guardians will have to go through before getting the student's iPad. Please plan on this taking up to an hour per family.
- There will be an insurance cost of \$30 that each student will pay before receiving his/her iPad. Payment can be made by check to Northmont City Schools, by cash, or by credit card. More information about what is covered and not covered will be available during the iPad pick-up.

STAFF RECOGNITION

First grade teacher **Kelly Sewell was inducted to the A-LIST, Autism-Low Incidence Support Team, in May. Mrs. Sewell was recognized for her "efforts and her excellent service to students." A-LIST is comprised of a regional network of select professionals who exhibit "best practices" in serving the needs of students who have autism or other complex, low incidence disabilities.

Englewood Elementary teacher **Jim O'Neil was awarded the AAA 2018 Safety Patrol Advisor of the Year. The mission of the AAA School Safety Patrol Program is "to provide a safer environment and leadership opportunities for millions of school children."

Northmoor teacher **Becky Underwood received the Charles M. Hayes Advancement Grant in the amount of \$500 from AAA's Foundation for Traffic Safety. The grant is to help improve Safety Patrol programs and will be used to support Northmont's annual Safety Patroller Training Academy and to purchase 10 new LED Stop Paddles.

Middle School teacher **Jayme Boston earned the 2018 Dayton Regional STEM Center's (DRSC) First Place STEM Leadership and Service Award. Jayme teaches Automation and Robotics to all 8th-grade students at NMS. As a result of this award, Jayme's program will receive \$1500 for use in her class.

STEM teacher **Jenn Stormer received the Excellence in Energy Efficiency Award for achievement in the e3/Be E3 Smart Program from the Ohio Energy Project. Stormer's students at Northwood Elementary were awarded special recognition for creating an energy efficiency program and her Northmoor students got 2nd place in the NEED Project's Youth Awards Program for Energy Achievement at the Elementary level.

BUILDING RECOGNITION

Englewood Elementary was recently awarded the Purple Star Award as a military-friendly school, showing a major commitment to students and families connected to our nation's military. Purple Star schools:
