Campus Procedures for 2022-2023 School Year Morning Procedures

- Students arriving early to campus will report to the Cafeteria, Doors open at 7:15 AM
- When the first bell rings all students will report directly to their first period class.
- IF A STUDENT NEEDS BREAKFAST THEY MUST EAT IN THE CAFETERIA, NO FOOD OR DRINKS, BESIDES WATER IN CLASSROOMS!
- CLASSES WILL BEGIN AT THE TARDY BELL FOR FIRST PERIOD AT 8 AM.
- Bus students will be dropped off at the doors located at the north side of the Cafeteria.
- All students dropped off by parents will enter through the doors located next to the Fine Arts Center.
- STUDENT DRIVERS WILL ENTER THROUGH THE DOORS LOCATED ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE CAFETERIA.

Attendance

- On Campus, In Classes, On Time, Each Day!
- TRUANCY
 - Letters sent after 3, 6, & 9 Absences
 - After 5 absences, Lunch Clean-Up Assigned & Attendance Contract Signed
 - 0 10 or more **unexcused** absences in a 6 month period in the same school year
- 90% Rule
 - \circ To receive credit or a final grade in a class, a student must attend at least 90 percent of the days the class is offered.
 - ALL ABSENCES, WHETHER EXCUSED OR UNEXCUSED, MUST BE CONSIDERED IN DETERMINING WHETHER A
 STUDENT HAS ATTENDED THE REQUIRED PERCENTAGE OF DAYS
 - O STUDENT WILL MAKE UP HOURS AFTER THE 9TH ABSENCE
- Parent Portal/Student Skyward Access
- Exemptions from Exams

Semester Exam Test Exemptions Policy

IN ORDER TO BE EXEMPT FROM SEMESTER EXAMS YOU MUST MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- STUDENT MUST BE PASSING THE CLASS FOR THE SEMESTER
- STUDENT MUST HAVE NO MORE THAN THREE ABSENCES IN THE CLASS
- Student must not have been assigned PASS/OSS/DAEP during the semester

Semester Exam Test Exemptions Policy

*STUDENTS WILL NOT BE EXEMPT FROM FINALS IN ANY CLASS THAT THEY ARE ENROLLED IN THAT HAS AN EOC EXAM THAT IS REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION

*STUDENTS WHO ARE EXEMPT FOR AN EXAM FOR A CLASS DO NOT HAVE TO TAKE THE EXAM, BUT ATTENDANCE THE DAY OF THE SEMESTER EXAM IS STILL REQUIRED

KISD Dress Code starts on first day

Tops/Shirts

Allowed:

- Solid Polo, full button or crew neck t-shirt (short or long sleeve only) with no logos larger than 1 ½" x 1 ½"
- Shirts with stripes, plaid, and floral patterns that are not recognizable as pictures or objects
- All buttons must be buttoned except the top two buttons
- Shirts must be long enough to cover the stomach and back when arms are raised and stay tucked into the pants when seated
- Shirts must be appropriately sized in the shoulders, sleeves, and length
- Appropriate dress code shirts must be worn under sweatshirts and sweaters if they are removed
- Appropriate dress code shirts must be worn under any sheer or lace tops.



Tops/Shirts

Not Permitted:

- Graphics that are recognizable as pictures or objects
- Camouflage patterns (military, college, and spirit shirts included)
- Lettering/words

DRESS CODE - Not Allowed















Bottoms: Jeans, Slacks, Pants, Shorts

Allowed:

- Solid color pleated or flat style jeans, slacks, pants (any solid color)
- Solid color knee length walking shorts (any solid color)
- Pants/Shorts will be worn at the waistline at all times (no sagging)
- Pants/Shorts shall be worn at the proper length and hemmed at all times
- No "ragging," "holes" or "tears"

Not Permitted:

- Hip-hugger, form fitting/leggings without appropriate top or dress, low rise, sagging, baggy legged slacks/ jeans, bell-bottomed pants wider than shoes and/or oversized clothing are not allowed
- Wind shorts/pants, athletic shorts/pants are not allowed

Hair

- All students must keep their hair clean, well groomed, and worn in good taste
- Students may not have a hair color that is not a natural color
- Notches in eyebrows are prohibited
- No hairstyles that are deemed as disruptive (e.g., Spikes, Mohawks)
- Students must be in compliance with hair code policy to participate in extracurriculars, athletics, and all other school sponsored events.
- Mustaches are Allowed, No Beards or Goatees.
 - Masks cannot be used as coverage for facial hair or piercings!
- No Hats

Jewelry & Other Accessories:

- Excessive make-up and/or jewelry are prohibited
- All tattoos of an inappropriate nature as deemed by the principals must be covered and hidden from view
 - (Fake or Ink Drawn included)
- Jewelry which is used in conjunction with body piercing (e.g. nose rings, barbells, or tongue studs) are prohibited!
- Students may wear clear spacers for piercings that are not allowed through handbook policy.
 - KISD will not provide clear spacers!
- No heavy or spiked jewelry, belts, dog collars, heavy chains, spiked bracelets, or teeth grills
- Band-Aids worn over earrings are not acceptable
- Students are not to wear sunshades or sunglasses in school without a doctors note; approved by Nurse.
- No chains (log chains, dog chains, wallet chains, etc.), cords, ropes, or beads
- Ties may be worn with appropriate attire only
- Gauges are not acceptable!

Dress Code

Clothing, accessories, or styles that express vulgarity, promote drugs, alcohol or tobacco, promote violence, solicit racial discord (i.e. Confederate flags) or promote gang related activity are not permitted.

The campus principal makes the final determination on dress code.

PHONES ARE ALLOWED TO BE USED BEFORE SCHOOL, A



- Phones are not to be used:
 - N HALLWAYS
 - N CLASS
 - STUDENTS WILL BE ASKED TO PLACE THEIR CELL PHONE IN A PHONE CADDY IN EACH CLASSROOM TO AVOID CELL PHONE VIOLATIONS DURING CLASS. STUDENTS WHO CHOOSE NOT TO PLACE THEIR PHONE IN THE CADDY WILL RECEIVE AN OFFICE REFERRAL IF THEY HAVE THEIR CELL PHONE OUT FOR ANY REASON WITHOUT PERMISSION.
- Earbuds and headphones need to remain put away during the day. Failure to follow instructions will result in dress code violation.

Missing Assignments & Zeros

Students with 3 or more missing assignments or zeros in a class will receive an office referral for "Failure to Complete Assignments".

-If a student receives such a referral they will be subject to the following interventions:

- 1. Upon receiving the referral the student will be assigned CAT (Center for Academic Training) by their Assistant Principal until the missing assignments are completed.
- 2. If the student does not complete their assignments while in the CAT, after 2 days, they will receive a 2 days of In School Suspension.
- 3. If the work is still not completed, they will receive 1 day of Out of School Suspension.
- 4. Upon returning to school, the student will return to ISS until all assignments are completed. If the student still has not completed all assignments after 2 more days in ISS they will be considered for DAEP placement.

Students who have missing assignments due to absences will not receive a referral for Failure to Complete Assignments until after they have been given the appropriate time to make up their assignments based on the number of days they were absent and district policy.*

Accelerated Instruction Classes - Extra Support

Junior High students who did not pass an 8th Grade STAAR test (Reading, Math, SS, or Sci) MUST receive "Accelerated Instruction" during the following school year. This must be at least 30 minutes a week per subject, and reach 30 hours of remediation per subject. Students who did not pass all four subjects, will receive specific instruction in each area.

22-23: Students who did not pass STAAR will be required to take an Accelerated Instruction class.

• This will be delineated on their schedules, and they will lose the opportunity to take one elective; however it will not affect their ability to graduate since we are on an 8-period day.

Athletic Programs & Performing Arts activities will NOT be removed from their schedules.

House Bill 4545 - Accelerated Instruction

High School students must take the "Big Five" in order to graduate:

"Big 5" End-of-Course Exams:

- English 1
- English 2
- Biology
- Algebra 1
- U.S. History

High School students who did not pass these exams will also be provided an "Accelerated Instruction" course to support their mastery learning. (This is not new!)

SAFETY & SECURITY

• SAFETY DRILLS THAT WILL OCCUR DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR

LOCKDOWN-LOCKDOWN IS CALLED WHEN THERE IS A THREAT OR HAZARD INSIDE THE SCHOOL BUILDING. FROM PARENTAL CUSTODY DISPUTES TO INTRUDERS TO AN ACTIVE SHOOTER, LOCKDOWN USES CLASSROOM AND SCHOOL SECURITY ACTIONS TO PROTECT STUDENTS AND STAFF FROM THREAT.

SECURE-SECURE IS CALLED WHEN THERE IS A THREAT OR HAZARD OUTSIDE OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING. WHETHER IT'S DUE TO VIOLENCE OR CRIMINAL ACTIVITY IN THE IMMEDIATE NEIGHBORHOOD, OR A DANGEROUS ANIMAL IN THE PLAYGROUND, SECURE USES THE SECURITY OF THE PHYSICAL FACILITY TO ACT AS PROTECTION.

EVACUATE(FIRE DRILLS)-EVACUATE IS CALLED WHEN THERE IS A NEED TO MOVE STUDENTS FROM ONE LOCATION TO ANOTHER.

SHELTER- SHELTER IS CALLED WHEN SPECIFIC PROTECTIVE ACTIONS ARE NEEDED BASED ON A THREAT OR HAZARD.

SAFETY & SECURITY

• SECURING EXTERIOR DOORS - EXTERIOR DOORS SHOULD NEVER BE PROPPED OPEN AT ANY TIME DURING THE DAY. STUDENTS WILL HAVE TO BE BUZZED IN FOR REENTRY INTO THE BUILDING.

STUDENTS SHOULD NEVER OPEN EXTERIOR DOORS TO LET SOMEONE IN.

We are a closed campus and students should never leave campus without permission and without signing out with the front office.

REPORT ANY STRANGE ACTIVITY TO AN ADMINISTRATION, TEACHER, CAMPUS POLICE, OR STAFF MEMBER.

Consequences

Consequences for Security Breaches will be serious. PASS will be assigned for the following items-

- Opening a door for someone trying to gain access to KHS (This includes Students)
- Propping a door open
- \bullet Anything else that may reasonably create a safety issue for KHS


