 - Goal 1: Students showing proficiency in Science on the Fifth Grade Statewide Science Assessment will increase from 58% to 71%.
 - Goal 2: The federal percent of points index for students with disabilities will increase from 40% to 41% or higher.
 - Goal 3: Students showing proficiency in ELA on the Florida Standards Assessment will increase from 72% to 74%; Lowest Quartile students showing learning gains in ELA on the Florida Standards Assessment will increase from 55% to 57%.

SACS Meeting Minutes

May 3, 2021

Welcome by Erin Henderson at 4:00. Meeting started motion by Stacey Welch and second by Ms. Susan.

- Committee Chairs Update:
 - ELA – Staci Welch had no feedback to share at this time.
 - Math – Brandi Panzarino had no feedback to share at this time at this time.
 - Science – Kelly Tomberlin asked if there would be money for mandated science experiments available. Mrs. Crawford said that grade levels should talk to her when needed. She will put it on the list for discussion at DCT.
 - Technology – Heather Hatfield discussed that we have purchased earbuds for their students, but a concern is that they break easily. Could we investigate purchasing individual headphones for students? Mrs. Crawford said that we could investigate the possibility of buying something sturdier, but the cost might not be as effective as just replacing the earbuds since they are cheaper. Mrs. Henderson asked if it was possible to add them to the student suggested wish list item for next year. WiFi does not always work in the 700 hallway; is this because of the IP address conflicts or WiFi issues? Currently, 3-5 is still waiting to get individual devices. Positive feedback was given for the new student laptop stations in classrooms, and for distance learning students having individual computers helping with iReady. Mrs. Crawford explained about the merger of departments at the district level and technology being on hand.
 - Parent Involvement – Miranda Bowen shared that we are hopeful that we will be able to include more parents next year if protocols are updated. Mrs. Crawford shared that she will be getting more information about that soon. She asked parents if they felt having the parents felt that the conference nights were most important to them. It was asked if events are limited, what are the most important events. Some ideas suggested were open house, parent conferences, and BINGO for Books.

- Data Reflection:
 - Not a lot of information is available at this time, but Mrs. Mimms is collecting data that might help for next year. Science goal is about 71% proficient, spring reading was at 52%, which dropped from 58% previously.

- Students with disabilities data is not available currently.
 - ELA projected proficiency goal is 73%. STAR data for third grade is showing projected proficiency at 61%. In fourth grade the projected proficiency in ELA is 71%. Fifth grade is currently showing 52%.
 - Math projected proficiency goal is 72%. Third grade is at 58% proficient. Fourth grade is at 72% proficient. Fifth grade is at 67% proficient.
 - Mrs. Crawford discussed the requirements this year for promotion in third grade. Getting supports in place earlier was praised in helping raise student success.
- **Current Parent Involvement Plan and Revisions:**
 - If we hold a STEM night, sending home activities for students. Books could be bought and sent home for a Reading night with activities. Possible extending timeline for activities to include a weekend so that more parents have time to participate. A survey could be completed at the end and students can turn them in for a prize.
 - Surveys- Climate surveys are currently up and available through FOCUS for parents, staff, and students.
 - 3 top things to include next year are Open House, BINGO for Books, and Parent Conference Nights.
 - Mrs. Hatfield shared that a friend had held a Virtual Scavenger Hunt for her distance learning students and their families. She will try to get more information on this.
 - We are not making any official changes at this time- we will make formal changes once we know more about protocols for next year.
- **Review of Student/Parent/Teacher Compact:**
 - Mrs. Henderson gave time to review the current compact and asked for input for changes. Mrs. Welch asked if we should take out the volunteer under parents if they will not be allowed on campus. The importance of attendance was discussed. Ms. Susan motions to accept and Mrs. Durant seconds the motion. A vote was held, and all votes were in the affirmative.
