## RE: PEBT

Summer 2022 P-EBT provides food benefits for students who were certified as eligible for free or reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) at any point during the 2021-2022 school year or are newly certified over the summer. There is no online application for P-EBT, but your child must be certified for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) to receive P-EBT. (See details below about NSLP eligibility.)

In order to be eligible for Summer 2022 P-EBT, students must have been enrolled in school in the last month of SY 2021-2022, and be:

- Eligible for free or reduced-price meals during SY 2021-2022 (July 1, 2021 June 30, 2022) OR
- Determined newly eligible for free or reduced-price meals between July 1, 2022 August 29, 2022 through a household application, direct certification, or categorical eligibility.
- Students with forms submitted to schools after Monday, August 29 are not eligible for summer 2022 P-EBT benefits.
- If you think your child should be eligible for P-EBT please contact the Child Nutrition Office to obtain a NSLP Meal application to see if you qualify.

The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
