## GREAT START 0-9 MONTHS

### Non-Separating

Bring your baby to play in our ECFE classroom! You will find age appropriate activities to enjoy with your baby, simple ways to encourage your baby's development at home, and meet other parents with whom you can share ideas, concerns, and successes. Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.

## BUSY BODIES 10-18 MONTHS

### Non-Separating

Rolling...Creeping...Crawling... Walking!

Explore, play and learn with your little one. Experience support, education & encouragement from other caregivers during a parent discussion session facilitated by a licensed parent educator. Topics range from child development to finding time for yourself. Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.

## BABY SIGN 3-18 MONTHS

### Non-Separating

As parents, we wonder what is going on inside their little heads as we wait in anticipation for their first words. By teaching your child gestures or signs as well as spoken words, they are more quickly able to understand and communicate with the world around them. Come and learn what sign language is all about. Parents and caregivers are invited to join us in one of our infant classes to gain support, learn, and grow along with other new parents. ## LITTLE WIGGLERS

### 13-24 MONTHS

#### Non-Separating

Your one year-old is busy, curious and ready to play! Together you and your child will play with a variety of toys, use art materials, learn songs and finger plays and enjoy lots of movement. A benefit of this class is that you and your child will remain in the same room together while parent discussion takes place. Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.

## MUSIC, MOVEMENT & BOOKS

### 13-28 MONTHS

#### Non-Separating

Come and enjoy music, movement and books with your toddler! This class provides a time for caregivers to participate in music, movement, and book activities with their child. During this class, we will use songs, books, and large motor skills to help foster literacy development, active learning, and physical health. Gym and outdoor experiences will be provided when possible.

## LITTLE EXPLORERS

### 18-28 MONTHS

#### Gradual Separating

Toddlers are constantly on the go exploring with energy and wonder. That is their job. Join us in activities that encourage language development, self-help skills, and a variety of sensory activities. Gradually, as the class allows, parents will move on to the parenting education room. As a parent, you will gain knowledge and support from a licensed parent educator and other parents during discussion time. Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.

## SHAKERS AND MOVERS

### 18-33 MONTHS

#### Separating

Toddlers are always on the move! Enjoy some one on one time with your child while they learn a variety of skills through play. Gym time will be available for some classes. As a caregiver, you will gain knowledge and support from a parent educator and other caregivers when we separate for discussion time.

# AGES 2 & 3/MULTI-AGE CLASSES

## 2-3 YEAR OLDS

### Separating

Being a two or three year old is a very unique time in your child's life. Language development is emerging, social skills are developing and physical and cognitive changes occur rapidly. The class will have parent/child interaction time followed by a parent only discussion time lead by a Parent Educator. Children remain in the classroom to experience learning activities, such as sensory exploration, dramatic play, large and small muscle experiences, in addition to storytelling, music and other literacy-rich activities under the guidance of an Early Childhood Teacher. Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.



## FAMILY NATURE MEET-UP CLASS BIRTH - 8 YEARS

### Non-Separating - 8 weeks

Nature will be our guide as we explore, learn, and grow outside together at local parks. The Nature Meet-up is for all families whether you are an avid explorer with your little ones or just want to try something new. We welcome backpack babies and children birth - 8yrs. You, the parents, or caregiver, will stay with your children during the nature meetup. You get to explore and play too. Please come dressed to be outside. We'll be playing and hiking in all types of weather. Rain boots and raincoats make exploring more fun on wet days. Fall and Spring sessions

## BOOKS AND BEYOND

### 2-5 YEARS

#### Non-Separating

Dive into the world of imagination with your child through books. In this non-separating class you and your child will experience art, math, science, music, and nutritional activities that will correspond with the books you'll be reading. Parenting tips will be shared. Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.

## MESSY ART 2-5 YEARS

#### Non-Separating

"Paint, chalk, flour, oatmeal, glue, glitter, hands and feet..." What do all these items have in common?

These are just a few tools we will use to "mess around" in our class. So, come prepared to explore, create, and have fun! Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.

## STEM CLASS 3-5 YEARS

#### Non-Separating

Help your child explore the world using their senses.

Join us as we explore, investigate, calculate, & experiment with hands-on math and science concepts. Learn with your child how fun, easy, and important it is to incorporate math and science into your everyday life. This is a non-separating class taught by an Early Childhood Teacher. Outdoor experiences will be provided weather permitting.

## PARENTING FOR EQUITY

### Virtual

There is no perfect way to talk with young children about race, racism, equity, anti-racism, and justice. Let's do this together! With the guidance of a licensed parent educator, parents will explore how racial identity develops, share how to use children's books to aid in conversations, and examine what role parent's play in raising race-conscious children. This class is offered online. There will be asynchronous and synchronous portions of this class. Directions on how to participate will be emailed to you one week before class begins.

## ONLINE PARENTING DISCUSSION GROUP

### Online

Come join us for a 10-week journey exploring what is vital to a strong foundation of parenting! Topics will focus on attachment, brain development, social emotional learning, and parenting philosophy and goals. This online discussion will be lead by a licensed parent educator by sharing videos, information, and posting discussion questions. Parents can participate and respond to the discussion questions throughout the week as it fits their schedules. A biweekly chat will also be held for those who are able to participate every other Wednesday evening, but not required. Participants will receive more details on how to participate a week before the session will begin.

## PAYMENT/SCHOLARSHIPS

Fees are payable by cash, check or credit card. Scholarships for parent/child classes in the form of a reduced fee or waived fee are available for families in need of financial assistance (ECFE Fee Scale). Registrant wishing to withdraw their registration must do so no later than one week prior to the course start date. No refunds will be given if withdraw is made less than one week prior.

## IMMUNIZATIONS

Please bring a copy of your child's immunization records to the first class. If your child has not been immunized, we will need you to submit a signed exempt form to the Early Learning office.

## SIBLING CARE

Sibling care is available for most parent/child classes. You will register and pay for sibling care at the same time you register for your parent/child class. We ask that you provide one healthy snack item per term. You are welcome to visit your child in sibling care at any time.

# READY! FOR KINDERGARTEN/ ABE

## READY! for Kindergarten

READY! For Kindergarten is a program of Mankato Area Public Schools' Early Childhood Family Education Department

### What is Ready! For Kindergarten?

Ready! For Kindergarten provides take home learning toys and materials to inspire and empower parents and caregivers to help babies and young children develop strong brain connections that determine how they will think, learn, and grow. Parents and caregivers are invited to attend a series of workshops each year, based on their child's age. They learn new skills and helpful tips to nurture development in ways that foster academic skills and personal behaviors to boost children's motivation, perseverance and engagement in learning. Ready! facilitates interactions and active learning by using movement, play, exploration, communication and all of the child's senses—seeing, hearing, smelling, touching, and tasting.

**How often do classes meet?** READY! for Kindergarten is a series of three parent classes per year (fall, winter and spring) for parents of children ages birth to five. Register for each age group separately.

**Who can attend?** Caregivers providers of children ages birth to five.

To be eligible for ABE services, an individual must be at least 17 years of age or older, not currently enrolled in secondary school, and functioning below the 12th grade level in any of the basic academic areas including reading, math or speaking English. Prior to enrollment in any ABE program, an assessment test is required to determine academic eligibility.

Early Childhood Screening is a comprehensive developmental screening for children 3-5 years old.

The purpose of Early Childhood Screening is to...

- \* Increase parent understanding of child's health, development and school readiness
- \* Identify conditions and risk factors that may affect a child's ability to learn and develop, make referrals for further assessment
- \* Link families to parenting resources and preventive health care

A Parent Should Schedule an Early Childhood Screening because....

- \*It identifies, at an early age, any hearing, vision, growth or development needs.
- \*It gives the parent valuable information about their child, information about school readiness and community resources.
- \*It is required by the state of Minnesota before entrance into public school kindergarten.

## **EARLIER IS BETTER!**

The screening changes with the age of your child, so there is no reason to wait.

## Help Me Grow

### WHAT IS HELP ME GROW?

- Help Me Grow provides resources for families to understand developmental milestones and learn if there are concerns. This helps families take the lead in seeking additional support, or referring their child for a comprehensive, confidential screening or evaluation at no cost.
- Help Me Grow is an inter-agency initiative of the State of Minnesota Department of Education, Department of Health and Department of Human Services. We partner with all local service agencies.

### WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW TO HELP A YOUNG CHILD DEVELOP, LEARN AND GROW?

- Developmental Milestones -Learn more about how a child develops from birth to five.
- Encouraging Healthy Development- Find ideas on how to support a child's development, healthy learning and growth.
- Get Help for a Child- Learn what to do if you have concerns about a child's development.
- Articles- Explore in-depth information on birth to five child development and growth and early intervention.

## HOME VISITING

Our Early Childhood Family Education Home Visit program is designed to provide individual support to expectant parents and parents of children ages 0–5. Home visits are conducted by a licensed parent educator to help support parents in their role as the first and most important teacher of their child. Parents will gain an understanding of child development and age appropriate behaviors, and receive support with other parenting joys and challenges. For questions and to schedule an appointment with a home visitor, call the Early Learning Department at (507) 625-4620.

### WHAT TO EXPECT FROM OUR HOME VISIT PROGRAM

- Make connections with other community resources
- Encouragement, support, and strategies to aid your parental development.
  - Discuss current parenting and family issues based on individual family needs
- Learn developmentally appropriate activities to support your child's development.
- A safe, confidential, environment to share and discuss personal issues related to parenting
- Gain support in the journey of becoming a child's first and most important teacher

## MAPS FACILITIES UPDATE

August 2022

Paul Peterson, Superintendent

Mankato Area Public Schools continues to plan for and address facility needs that have been identified and evolving over the last half decade. Our focus is “Something for Everyone” as we address learning and space needs for our youngest-age learners through K-12, and the adult life-long learners in our community.

This summer, we are completing the first phase of repurposing the former MRCL building into an Early Learning Center which will better meet the needs of our district families with preschool aged children.

Facility planning for our elementary students continues as we focus on areas that include safety & security; building capacity; special learning space; cafeteria & physical education needs; and other building and site elements to right-size our neighborhood schools and respond to needs expressed by our families in the Community Survey from last fall.

At the secondary level, we are planning for a Gymnasium/Pool addition at Dakota Meadows Middle School. This would bring us much needed physical education teaching space at the middle level, as well as replace the closed pool at West High School in order to better serve our West attendance area and community. Also at West High School, we are planning to address safety and security with a new accessible entrance from the parking lot.

Finally, our planning at the high school level is focusing on improved access to outdoor learning and physical education activity space that can have multiple uses and be accessed virtually year-round at both East and West. This includes artificial turf fields – something that would bring MAPS into better alignment with our Big 9 Conference schools.

Our planning efforts are now enhanced by the addition of architects from ISG and LSE, partnering with our team to bring creative and practical space planning and concepts to the process.

This fall, the MAPS School Board will begin answering several questions related to facility needs in the district, including the size, scope and timing of a future bond referendum. Asking residents, businesses and property owners to support public schools through a bond election is a serious decision, and the School Board is committed to making sure that any future plans are well communicated with the greater school community.

## **SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES HELPING STUDENTS BE SUCCESSFUL**

Mankato Area Public Schools serves students with disabilities from birth through age 21. Federal and state laws guide the school district in identifying, evaluating and serving students with disabilities. A team of special educators, general educators and families work together to develop an Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) for students who meet the criteria for services. The team considers the student's present level of performance, identifies educational needs and develops goals to meet those needs in the least restrictive setting.

Mankato Area Public Schools provides a continuum of services for students with disabilities. Special instruction and services are provided in: autism spectrum disorders, blind-visually impaired, deaf-blind, deaf and hard of hearing, developmental cognitive disabilities, developmental delay, emotional or behavioral disorders, other health disabilities, physically impaired, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairments and traumatic brain injury.

Prior to age six, a child who needs special instruction and services because of a substantial delay or identifiable physical or mental condition that hinders normal development is considered a child with a disability. Most students receive special education in their

neighborhood school. The district also has specialized programs for students who need more support.

For more information on identifying, evaluating and providing service to students with disabilities, contact your child's school principal or student support services at 507-387-1818.

### **RIGHT TO KNOW**

Parent(s)/guardian(s) of a student who attends Mankato Area Public Schools have a right to know about the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct their child(ren). The Every Student Succeeds Act provides the right to ask for the following information about each child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the State of Minnesota has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status by which state licensing criteria have been waived.
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- Whether any instructional aide or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

**Private vs. Public information—important to know**  
**Information...what is private?**  
**What is public?**

The following information is provided to raise awareness about data privacy practices regarding student information.

### **PRIVACY RIGHTS**

Education records are classified as private data on individuals by state law and are accessible only to the student's parent/guardian or a student who is at least 18 years old. The school district may not disclose private records or their contents except as summary data without the prior written consent of the parent/guardian or the eligible student. In some cases, private records may not be accessible to parents/guardians. State law provides that certain information in a student's education records be accessible only to that students and to the parent/guardian under special circumstances, if at all.

### **DIRECTORY INFORMATION**

What is directory information? Directory information includes the student's name, address, telephone number, email address, photograph, date and place of birth, major field of study, attendance dates, grade level, enrollment status, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of athletic team members, degrees, honors and awards received, the most recent educational agency or institution attended by the student, photographs of students taking part in officially recognized activities, sports and academic or nonacademic classes or programs and other similar information.

Note: Directory information does not include information about a student's religion, race, color, disability, social position or nationality.

### **Is directory information public?**

Is directory information public? Yes. A school district may disclose this information from a student's education records. However, if a parent/guardian or student chooses, the information will not be released without prior written consent except to school officials as a provided under federal law.

### **Disclosure of data to military recruitment officers**

Disclosure of data to military recruitment officers The school district will release names, addresses and home telephone numbers of secondary students to military recruiting officers within 60 days after the request date unless a parent/guardian or eligible student has refused in writing the release of this data to military recruiters. Data released under this provision may be used only to provide student information about military service, state and federal veterans' education benefits and other career and educational opportunities the military provides.

### **Do I have to release data to military recruitment officers?**

A parent/guardian or eligible student has the right to refuse the release of directory information to military recruiting officers and must notify the Mankato Area Public Schools' director of human resources in writing by September 15 of each year. The written notification must include the names of the student and parent/guardian, home address, grade level, school, parent's legal relationship to student and the

information that should not be released to military recruiters without prior consent. Keep in mind that refusal to release the information does not affect the school district's release of directory information to the rest of the public, including military recruiting officers. To make any directory information about a student private, follow the procedures under "How do I make directory information private?"

### **How do I make directory information private?**

A parent/guardian or eligible student must submit a written request that includes the student's name, home address, school, parent's legal relationship and specific category or categories of directory information that should remain private to the building principal within 30 days after the date of the last publication notice. If parents/guardians do not want their child's or eligible student's directory information released to military recruiting officers, the school district must be notified that the directory information should not be released to any member of the public, including military recruiting officers.

### **How do I obtain nondisclosures of directory information?**

A written notice from the parent/guardian or eligible student should be sent to the district's director of human resources and must include the student's name, home address, school presently attended by student, parent's legal relationship to student

(if applicable), specific categories of directory information not to be made public without prior written consent, which shall be applicable for that school year.
