The dress code for the Elementary grades has been expanded from the Secondary School's dress code due to the nature of the Elementary School student daily activities.

SPECIAL DRESS DAYS			
	Fridays are Spirit Days!! We want to celebrate school spirit. Students		
FRIDAYS	may wear MCA t-shirts, sweatshirts, or hoodies. If a student chooses not to participate, they may wear a collared shirt that would meet typical dress code standards.		
SPIRIT DAYS/ SPECIALIZED DRESS	Special dress days are announced by administration on special occasions. This is sometimes in conjunction with the spirit days put on by the Secondary STUCO. Possible examples: end of semester celebrations, holidays, sports playoffs or championships.		
FIELD TRIPS/ SERVICE TRIPS	Every student should own a green MCA logo'd polo shirt to wear on field trips. Clothing for trips outside of the school is chosen based on the activity.		
SELECT CHOIR	Select choir members wear a black polo shirt with a MCA logo and black pants for their performances.		
PERFORMANCES/ PROGRAMS/ BANQUETS/ SPECIAL EVENTS	Special occasion attire will be published before the event. Generally, the attire will, at a minimum, adhere to the descriptions listed within this document. In some cases, such as banquets and end of year awards programs, the dress will be more specific.		
SCHOOL EVENTS	For sporting events, family fun social events, and after school activities, students must dress in neat and modest attire.		
OUTERWEAR	Outerwear is not worn in the classroom unless given permission by the teacher. Students go outside in all weather types; we strongly encourage families to send appropriate outerwear with their students. Please label all outerwear with your child's name.		
SWIMWEAR	For events where water play or swimming is available, only one-piece looking swimsuits including tankinis will be acceptable for girls. Swimsuits may not have high cut legs or revealing necklines. Boys may not wear tight or high cut suits.
